H.B. No. 923

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the issuance of 36th Infantry Division specialty license plates and souvenir license plates.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 504.009, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

(a-1) On request, the Texas Military Department, as defined by Section 437.001, Government Code, shall issue a souvenir version of the specialty license plate described by Section 504.320.

SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 504, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 504.320 to read as follows:

Sec. 504.320. 36TH INFANTRY DIVISION. The department shall issue specialty license plates for persons who have served in the 36th Infantry Division of the Texas Army National Guard. The license plates must include the 36th Infantry Division emblem and must include the words "36th Infantry Division" at the bottom of each plate.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect January 1, 2016.

HOUSE VERSION

SECTION 1. Section 504.009, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
(a-1) On request, the department shall issue a souvenir version of the specialty license plate described by Section 504.320.

SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 504, Transportation Code, is amended.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect *September 1, 2015*.

SENATE VERSION (CS)

No equivalent provision.

SECTION 1. Same as House version.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect *January 1, 2016*.

CONFERENCE

SECTION 1. Section 504.009, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
(a-1) On request, *the Texas Military Department, as defined by Section 437.001, Government Code*, shall issue a souvenir version of the specialty license plate described by Section 504.320.

SECTION 2. Same as House version.

SECTION 3. Same as Senate version.

IN RE: HB923 by Flynn (Relating to the issuance of 36th Infantry Division specialty license plates and souvenir license plates.), **Conference Committee Report**

<p>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</p>

The bill would amend the Transportation Code to require the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to issue specialty license plates for persons who have served in the 36th Infantry Division of the Texas Army National Guard. The bill would require the Texas Military Department to issue a souvenir version of the plate upon request.

There would be no fee for a regular set of the new specialty plates. Under current law, the fee for issuance of a single souvenir plate would be \$20. Based on the analysis of DMV, it is assumed the bill would not result in a significant impact to the state's cash flows and any costs or duties associated with implementing the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.

**Certification of Compliance with
