<u>Sec. 74.155. NATIONAL CENTER FOR WARRIOR RESILIENCY.</u> (a) In this section:

- (1) "Board" means the board of regents of The University of Texas System.
- (2) "Center" means the National Center for Warrior Resiliency.
- (b) The board shall establish the National Center for Warrior Resiliency at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio for purposes of:
- (1) researching issues relating to the detection, prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of combat-related post-traumatic stress disorder and comorbid conditions; and
- (2) providing clinical care to enhance the psychological resiliency of military personnel and veterans.
- (c) The organization, control, and management of the center are vested in the board.
- (d) The board shall:
- (1) provide for the employment of staff and an operating budget for the center; and
- (2) select a site for the center at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio.
- (e) The board may solicit, accept, and administer gifts and grants from any public or private source for the use and benefit of the center.
- (f) The center may enter into agreements or otherwise collaborate with public or private entities, including other public institutions of higher education, private or independent institutions of higher education, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, the United States Department of Defense, the National Institutes of Health, and the Texas Veterans

IN RE: SB578 by Lucio (Relating to the creation by the Health and Human Services Commission of a veteran suicide prevention action plan.), Conference Committee Report

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Government Code relating to the creation by the Health and Human Commission of a veteran suicide prevention action plan. Based on information provided by the commission, this analysis assumes that any costs associated with implementing the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

The bill would take effect immediately upon receiving a two-thirds majority vote in each house. Otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2017.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
