

"Sec. 1A. The Comptroller of Public Accounts is hereby authorized to make payroll deductions from the salary warrants of participating employees when authorized in writing by the respective employees to do so and shall apply the deducted portion of the employees' compensation to the purchase of annuity contracts, the exclusive control of which will vest in the individual employee."

"Sec. 2. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both Houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the Constitutional Rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each House be suspended, and the Rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted."

**Committee Amendment No. 2**

Amend HB 652 by striking all above the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

A bill to be entitled An Act amending Chapter 22, Acts 57th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 1962, as amended (Article 6228a-5, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes); authorizing the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation and the state schools, state hospitals, and other facilities and institutions under its jurisdiction, the Texas State Department of Health and facilities and institutions under its jurisdiction, the Texas Youth Council and facilities and institutions under its jurisdiction, and other state and political subdivisions, centers, and hospitals to purchase annuities for their employees; adding a new section to be designated as Section 1A authorizing the Comptroller of Public Accounts to make payroll deductions from salary warrants of participating employees for the purchase of annuities; and declaring an emergency.

The committee amendments were severally adopted without objection.

HB 652, as amended, was passed to engrossment.

#### HSR 374—REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

(Creating an interim committee to be known as House Privilege Committee)

Mr. Sherman offered the following resolution:

HSR 374

Whereas, The privilege of access to the Floor of the House is an honor not to be bestowed lightly; and

Whereas, The crowded conditions in the Hall of the House demand that the privilege of access to the Floor of the House not be granted lightly; and

Whereas, There is disagreement as to the extent to which the privilege of access to the Floor of the House should be granted; and

Whereas, It is advisable that the House take all necessary actions to ensure adequate decorum on the Floor of the House; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That there is hereby created an interim committee to be named "House Privilege Committee" to consist of five Members to be appointed by the Speaker; and, be it further

Resolved, That said committee shall investigate the question of privilege of access to the Floor of the House; and, be it further

Resolved, That said committee shall determine what rules the legislative bodies of other states may provide on the subject and visits to such other legislative bodies are hereby authorized if deemed necessary by said committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That said committee shall report its findings, including recommendations for changes in the Rules of the House, to the 63rd Legislature.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on Resolutions and Interim Activities.

#### HSR 375—REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

(Expressing the feeling of the Legislature that no tax-supported agency shall compete with private business)

Mr. John Allen offered the following resolution:

#### HSR 375

Whereas, The very nature of a democratic government is to serve the people and to supply the needs which cannot be supplied by the public itself or by private enterprise; the government should never allow itself to engage in economic competition with the private sector of the economy; and

Whereas, Competition between governmental agencies and private business is mutually harmful in that it leads to disrespect and contempt for governmental operations and results in the establishment of an artificial economy which is controlled from within by the government; and

Whereas, When economic competition from governmental agencies results in the loss of business to private enterprise, the injured businessmen are deprived of their lawful rights and property without due process of law; and

Whereas, The Texas House of Representatives wishes to declare affirmatively its opposition to any type of unfair competition between public supported agencies and the private sector of our economy; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the House of Representatives of the 62nd Legislature hereby express its conviction that no tax-supported agency should compete with private business through the public commercial sale of products manufactured by the tax-supported agency.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on State Affairs.

#### HSR 376—REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

(Urging the State Board of Insurance not to grant further increases in automobile insurance rates)

Mr. John Allen offered the following resolution:

HSR 376

Whereas, The increasing cost of automobile insurance is a subject of great concern and vital interest to the citizens of Texas; and

Whereas, After approving an average increase of 9.9 percent in automobile insurance rates in October 1969, the State Board of Insurance gave its final approval to an additional 14 percent average rate increase in December 1970; thus, in only two years, the State Board of Insurance has approved the imposition upon Texas consumers of an average automobile insurance rate increase of almost 24 percent; and

Whereas, The Texas public is justifiably outraged at this rapid increase in automobile insurance rates and is relying upon the elected members of the Texas Legislature, who are responsive to the public demands, to protect the public from further large and unreasonable rate increases by the exercise of legislative supervision over the State Board of Insurance; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That by this resolution the House of Representatives of the 62nd Legislature urge the State Board of Insurance not to grant further increases in automobile insurance rates until it has been directed to do so by a vote of the Legislature in Regular Session; and, be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be prepared for the State Board of Insurance as an expression of the wishes of the Texas House of Representatives.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on State Affairs.
