HSR 403

Whereas, Along with other facets of environmental control, the difficult problem of how to dispose of solid waste is a vital issue affecting the citizens, businesses, and government of Texas; and

Whereas, Each measure enacted by past legislatures relating to solid waste disposal has helped to impede the growth of the solid waste problem, but no final solution has yet been found to completely solve or eliminate this problem for future generations; and

Whereas, Recent research and developments in the technology of solid waste disposal, including the widespread success and general popularity of recycling programs, present possible new means of solving the long-range problem of solid waste disposal in Texas; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the House of Representatives of the 62nd Legislature hereby create a special interim committee on solid waste disposal; the committee shall study all aspects of municipal and industrial solid waste disposal in Texas, with particular attention to the feasibility and desirability of employing recycling programs; and, be it further

Resolved, That the Speaker of the House shall appoint three Members of the House of Representatives, including one designated as chairman, and two lay members to serve on the interim study committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That the operating expenses of the committee shall be paid from the Expense Fund of the House of Representatives, and that committee members shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this resolution; the committee shall prepare a budget for its operating expenses, which shall be submitted to the House Administration Committee, and no expenditures shall be made until the budget has been approved. Prior approval of nonbudgeted expenditures must also be obtained from the House Administration Committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That the committee shall make its complete report, including findings and recommendations and drafts of any legislation deemed neces-

sary to the 63rd Legislature when it convenes in January 1973. Five copies of the completed report shall be filed in the Legislative Reference Library and five copies shall be filed in the office of the Texas Legislative Council; following official distribution of the committee report, all remaining copies shall be deposited with the Legislative Reference Librarian.

HSR 404—REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

(Creating a study committee on the food processing industry)

Mr. Atwood offered the following resolution:

HSR 404

Whereas, Texas is a national leader in agricultural production, producing over \$3 billion worth annually; and

Whereas, A large amount of Texas agricultural products are shipped as raw materials to other states for processing; and

Whereas, Many acres of Texas agricultural products are plowed under due to the lack of a market while goods from other states are being sold across the counter to the Texas consumer; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Texas House of Representatives create a study committee on the food processing industry in the state to determine the needs and priorities for additional programs and projects for state government to encourage the establishment of new food processing plants and expansion of existing facilities; and, be it further

Resolved, That the committee be composed of six Members of the Texas House of Representatives and three citizen members representing the growing, processing and marketing fields, all to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; and, be it further

Resolved, That the committee be requested to consult frequently with the Chairman of the Senate Agriculture Committee in order to maintain liaison between the two legislative bodies on this important project; and, be it further

Resolved, That the executive director of the Texas Industrial Commission be requested to serve as secretary to the committee, and that consultants to the committee also be named by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, including the director of the Texas Department of Agriculture's marketing program and representatives with particular professional ability in the field from Texas A&M University, Texas Tech University, and Texas A&I College; and, be it further

Resolved, That at the request of the committee chairman, the staff of the Texas Legislative Council shall provide assistance to the committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That the operating expenses of the committee shall be paid

from the Expense Fund of the House of Representatives, and that committee members shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this resolution; the committee shall prepare a budget for its operating expenses, which shall be submitted to the House Administration Committee, and no expenditures shall be made until the budget has been approved. Prior approval of nonbudgeted expenditures must also be obtained from the House Administration Committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That the committee shall make its complete report, including findings and recommendations and drafts of any legislation deemed necessary, to the 63rd Legislature when it convenes in January 1973. Five copies of the completed report shall be filed in the Legislative Reference Library and five copies shall be filed in the office of the Texas Legislative Council; following official distribution of the committee report, all remaining copies shall be deposited with the Legislative Reference Librarian.

HCR 125—REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

(Creating a special committee to make a study of severed mineral estates in Texas)

Mr. Short offered the following resolution:

HCR 125

Whereas, A recurring problem in Texas is the severed mineral estate whose owners have abandoned it or can no longer be located, and neither the owner of the surface estate nor the State of Texas has legal recourse in reclaiming the severed minerals; and

Whereas, Land should be free of dormant mineral interests which hinder its development, and a policy favoring discovery and utilization of mineral resources in the face of growing population and shrinking resources is essential to the public welfare; and

Whereas, The development of petroleum resources and other minerals on many thousands of acres is involved, and it is important to the State of Texas and those participating in the development of the state's mineral resources that legal procedures be inaugurated under which title can be determined and reassigned on long-severed mineral estates for which owner or heirs cannot be found to assure that exploration and development of mineral reserves and natural resources will not be prevented by the existence of outstanding mineral estates; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Texas, the Senate concurring, That a special interim committee be created to make a thorough study of severed mineral estates in Texas, the owners of which have been absent for a long period of time and are not known to exist or to have any heirs or devisees; and, be it further

Resolved, That the membership of the committee shall consist of three Members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker

of the House, three Members of the Senate to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, and three members of the public to be appointed by the Governor; and, be it further

Resolved, That expenses necessary for the operation of the committee shall be paid from the Expense Fund of the House and the Contingent Expense Fund of the Senate, equally. Members of the committee shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in carrying out the purposes of this Resolution; and, be it further

Resolved, That the committee shall prepare a budget for its operating expenses and shall submit the budget to the Committee on Administration of the Senate and to the House Administration Committee, and before any payment may be made, the budget must be approved by the appropriate committee; before any nonbudgeted expense may be paid, prior approval must be obtained from both the Committee on Administration of the Senate and the House Administration Committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That hearings of the committee may be held at such times and in such places as the committee chairman deems necessary; at the hearings the committee shall attempt to get the viewpoint of owners of both surface estate and severed mineral estate; royalty companies and other developers of mineral resources, bankers, and the general public concerning ways and means of settling ownership and handling income from severed mineral estates, when the owner has been absent for a long period of time and is not known to exist or to have any heirs or devisees; and, be it further

Resolved, That the Commissioner of the General Land Office, the Attorney General, the Texas Railroad Commission, the Texas Legislative Council, and other officials and agencies concerned be requested to cooperate with the committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That this committee shall make its complete report, including findings and recommendations for a policy which is equitable to all concerned and drafts of any proposed legislation to the 63rd Legislature at its regular session in January 1973, and that five copies of the completed study shall be filed in the Legislative Reference Library and five copies filed in the office of the Texas Legislative Council. Following official distribution of the committee report, all remaining copies shall be deposited with the Legislative Reference Librarian.

tors' own motion; providing for no hearing on plan of taxation and adopting ad valorem plan of taxation; providing for addition of land to district and the assumption of bonded indebtedness by the added land, and related matters; providing for governing body of district; providing for qualifications and bonds of directors; naming first board of directors; providing for the filling of vacancies; providing for terms and election of directors and notice of directors elections; and related matters; providing for the letting of construction contracts and the drawing of warrants; providing for execution of contracts by the president; providing duties of vice-president; providing for compliance with Article 7880-139, V.T.C.S.; providing for bonds and refunding bonds of the district, and related matters; providing for approval of bonds by the Attorney General of Texas and registration by the Comptroller of Public Accounts; providing for the incontestability of bonds; providing the power of eminent domain shall be limited to the county or counties within which district is situated and to situations where necessary to carry out the purposes for which district was created; providing district shall bear expenses of relocating, raising, or rerouting any highway, railroad or utility lines or pipe lines made necessary by its exercise of the power of eminent domain; defining "sole expense"; providing for depositories; providing for an audit, and related matters; providing for the establishment of district offices, and related matters; providing for the sale of bonds and the price of such bonds; providing that Article 7880-77b, V.T.C.S., shall not be applicable to this district; providing that notice of all elections shall be under the hand of the president or secretary; providing for the canvassing of election returns; providing that bonds and refunding bonds of this district shall be eligible investments; providing that the Municipal Annexation Act shall have no application to this district; providing that district is subject to provisions of Article 1182c-1, V.T.C.S.; determining and finding that the requirements of Article 16, Section 59(d), Constitution of Texas, as to notice of intention to introduce this Act have been fulfilled and accomplished; providing the district shall not be required to pay any tax or assessment on its properties or any purchase; enacting other provisions relating to the aforementioned subjects; providing a severability clause; and declaring an emergency.
