(To study the feasibility and advisability of locating nuclear power plants in the State of Texas)

Mr. McAlister offered the following resolution:

HCR 136

Whereas, Conventional fuel and hydroelectric power are fast becoming inadequate sources of electricity for the people and industries of Texas; and

Whereas, The harnessing of nuclear energy on a large scale, if feasible, would provide an invaluable supplement to or replacement for conventional sources of electric power; and

Whereas, The attendant dangers of nuclear power plants, including radiation and thermal pollution, must be carefully considered before the advisability of locating such plants in Texas can be determined; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives of the 62nd Legislature of the State of Texas, the Senate concurring, That the Texas Legislature hereby create a special interim committee composed of five Members of the House of Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House, and five Members of the Senate, to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, to study the feasibility and advisability of locating nuclear power plants in the State of Texas; and, be it further

Resolved, That the committee may call upon any state agency or department as may be necessary for assistance and advice in carrying out the work of the committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That the staff of the Texas Legislative Council be and it is hereby requested to assist the committee in its study; and, be it further

Resolved, That the actual expenses of the House committee members shall be paid from the Expense Fund of the House of Representatives and

that the actual expenses of the Senate committee members shall be paid from the Contingent Expense Fund of the Senate. Other necessary expenses of the committee shall be paid from the Expense Fund of the House of Representatives and the Contingent Expense Fund of the Senate on an equal basis. The committee shall prepare a budget for its operating expenses which shall be submitted to the House Administration Committee and the Administration Committee of the Senate, and no expenditures shall be made until the budget has been approved. Prior approval of nonbudgeted expenditures shall be obtained from the House Administration Committee and the Administration Committee of the Senate; and, be it further

Resolved, That the interim study committee shall make its complete report, including findings and recommendations, together with drafts of any proposed legislation, to the 63rd Legislature at its regular session in January 1973, and that five copies of the report shall be filed in the Legislative Reference Library, and five copies filed in the office of the Texas Legislative Council. Following official distribution of the committee report, all remaining copies shall be deposited with the Legislative Reference Librarian.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on Resolutions and Interim Activities.

HSR 442—REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

(Creating a committee to study automatic data processing in state government)

Mr. Carl Parker offered the following resolution:

HSR 442

Whereas, The State of Texas now operates and maintains electronic data processing equipment and many state agencies now own or rent large installations of automatic data processing equipment; and

Whereas, There are many applications of data processing that could be added to existing electronic data processing equipment in state government to effect efficiency and economy; and

Whereas, The Members of the Legislature need to know whether all of this equipment is being utilized to the extent that the taxpayers of Texas are realizing the most economical use of their funds; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That a study committee composed of three Members of the House of Representatives be appointed by the Speaker of the House to study the proper utilization and extended applications of automatic data processing in state government; and, be it further

Resolved, That members of the committee shall receive no pay for their services on the committee, but shall be reimbursed from the Contingent Fund of the House of Representatives for necessary expenses actually incurred in the discharge of duties and that the Legislative Budget

Board and the state auditor and any other state agencies shall furnish necessary staff as may be requested; and, be it further

Resolved, That the committee shall examine the current usage of all electronic data processing equipment and explore possible new applications of such equipment. The committee shall seek the advice of state agencies as well as private industry and may examine the experience and practices of state governments in other states, private industry, and the federal government, and report its findings and recommendations to the 63rd Legislature.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on Resolutions and Interim Activities.

HSR 436—REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

(Creating an interim committee to study the use of plastic pipe)

Mr. Nelms offered the following resolution:

HSR 436

Whereas, The state government and the Legislature are charged with the grave responsibility of insuring the health and safety of all citizens within the state; and

Whereas, New technological developments are sometimes utilized by commercial enterprises to reduce costs before the new products have been thoroughly tested or proved to be of sound design and quality; and

Whereas, Plastic pipe is being increasingly substituted for metal or ceramic pipe in pipeline systems, electrical wiring projects, and other commercial uses; while the use of plastic pipe may reduce the costs of the project for the contractor and ultimately for the consumer or taxpayer, recent accidents and near-accidents involving the use of plastic pipe suggest that this reduced cost may be offset by an increased safety hazard; and

Whereas, Plastic pipe is being utilized in major pipeline projects in several densely populated regions of Texas, and the possibility of a substantial safety hazard has become a matter of great public concern for all citizens of our state; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the House of Representatives of the 62nd Legislature hereby create a special interim Committee on Plastic Pipe. The committee shall study the use of plastic pipe for various commercial and private purposes in Texas, the relative safety of plastic pipe as compared with other types of pipe, the desirability of regulating the use or sale of plastic pipe, and any other related matter which the committee deems significant in making a comprehensive report upon the problems mentioned in this Resolution; and, be it further

Resolved, That the Speaker of the House shall appoint five Members of the House of Representatives, including one designated as chairman, to serve on the interim study committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That the operating expenses of the committee shall be paid from the Expense Fund of the House of Representatives, and that committee members shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this Resolution; the committee shall prepare a budget for its operating expenses, which shall be submitted to the House Administration Committee, and no expenditures shall be made until the budget has been approved. Prior approval of nonbudgeted expenditures must also be obtained from the House Administration Committee; and, be it further

Resolved, That the committee shall make its complete report, including findings and recommendations and drafts of any legislation deemed necessary, to the 63rd Legislature when it convenes in January 1973. Five copies of the completed report shall be filed in the Legislative Reference Library and five copies shall be filed in the office of the Texas Legislative Council; following official distribution of the committee report, all remaining copies shall be deposited with the Legislative Reference Librarian.
