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	HB 1618 also would give communities a local option to introduce a stable source of funding for libraries. Currently, libraries must ask for local appropriations each year. If a community creates a library district, then a library could depend on a stable source of revenue to plan for and serve the community more effectively. HB 1618 would empower local communities to make local decisions about their taxes and community services.
OPPONENTS SAY:	Expanding the local option to create library districts would allow creation of new local taxing districts. However worthy the cause, it could add one more possible tax to the load already being borne by overburdened taxpayers in a wider range of jurisdictions.
NOTES:	The original version of the bill would have lowered the county population limit from more than 100,000 to more than 50,000 for creation of library districts within a county.
