

SENATE STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING

MAY 25, 1977

The Senate State Affairs Committee met for regular business at 3:30 p.m. in the Senate Chamber. The following Senators were present as reflected by the roll call: Moore, Kothmann, Aikin, Andujar, Brooks, Clower, Doggett, Hance, Longoria, Ogg, and Traeger.

The Chair (Moore) laid out H.B. 1129 and recognized Senator Hance to explain the bill. Senator Aikin moved that H.B. 1129 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 2257 and recognized Senator Hance to explain the bill. Senator Hance sent up the Committee Substitute for H.B. 2257 and moved its adoption. The motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Aikin next moved that C.S.H.B. 2257 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 620 and recognized Senator Aikin to explain the bill. Senator Aikin moved that H.B. 620 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Aikin next moved that H.B. 620 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 2243 and explained the bill. Senator Clower moved that H.B. 2243 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Clower next moved that H.B. 2243 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1931 and recognized Senator Adams to explain the bill. Senator Kothmann moved that H.B. 1931 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Kothmann next moved that H.B. 1931 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1264 and explained the bill. The following witnesses testified in favor of H.B. 1264:

Senator Moore moved that H.B. 1264 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by the record vote of 9 ayes, 0 nays. Those Senators voting in favor of H.B. 1264 were Kothmann, Andujar, Brooks, Clower, Doggett, Hance, Longoria, Ogg, and Traeger.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out S.B. 1090 and recognized Senator Ogg to explain his bill. Senator Clower sent up a Committee Substitute for S.B. 1090 and moved its adoption. The motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Clower next moved that S.B. 1090 do not pass but that C.S.S.B. 1090 do pass and be printed and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1125 and recognized Senator Ogg to explain the bill. Senator Traeger moved that H.B. 1125 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by the record vote of 9 ayes, 0 nays. Those Senators voting in favor of H.B. 1125 were Kothmann, Andujar, Brooks, Clower, Doggett, Hance, Longoria, Ogg, and Traeger.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 2067 and explained the bill. The following witness testified in favor of H.B. 2067:

Senator Moore moved that H.B. 2067 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by a record vote of 8 ayes, 2 nays. Those Senators voting in favor of H.B. 2067 were Moore, Kothmann, Aikin, Andujar, Brooks, Doggett, Hance, and Traeger. Those Senators opposed to H.B. 2067 were Clower and Longoria.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 837 and explained the bill. Senator Moore moved that H.B. 837 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Moore next moved that H.B. 837 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1536 and recognized Senator Andujar to explain the bill. Senator Andujar moved that H.B. 1536 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Andujar next moved that H.B. 1536 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1537 and recognized Senator Andujar to explain the bill. Senator Andujar moved that H.B. 1537 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Andujar next moved that H.B. 1537 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out S.B. 1331 and recognized Senator Andujar to explain the bill. Senator Kothmann moved that S.B. 1331

do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1232 and recognized Senator Farabee to explain the bill. Senator Brooks moved that HB 1232 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Brooks next moved that H.B. 1232 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 88 and recognized Senator Clower to explain the bill. Senator Traeger made a substitute motion that H.B. 88 be sent to subcommittee and the failed by the record vote of 2 ayes, 8 nays. Those Senators favoring sending H.B. 88 to Subcommittee were Moore and Traeger. Those Senators opposed to sending H.B. 88 to subcommittee Kothmann, Aikin, Andujar, Brooks, Clower Doggett, Hance, and Longoria. Senator Clower moved that H.B. 88 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by the record vote of 8 ayes, 2 nays. Those Senators voting in favor H.B. 88 were Kothmann, Aikin, Andujar, Brooks, Clower, Doggett, Hance, and Longoria. Those Senators opposed to H.B. 88 were Moore and Traeger.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 537 and recognized Senator Jones of Harris to explain the bill. Senator Clower sent up the Committee Substitute for H.B. 537 and moved its adoption. The motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Clower next moved that H.B. 537 do not pass, but that C.S.H.B. 537 do pass and be printed and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1416 and recognized Senator Lombardino to explain the bill. Senator Aikin moved that H.B. 1416 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Aikin next moved that H.B. 1416 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1845 and recognized Senator Longoria to explain the bill. Senator Longoria moved that H.B. 1845 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Longoria next moved that H.B. 1845 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 1367 and explained the bill. Senator Moore moved that H.B. 1367 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Moore next moved that H.B. 1367 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) next laid out H.B. 368 and recognized Senator Jones of Harris to explain the bill. Senator Brooks moved that H.B. 368 do pass and be printed, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection. Senator Brooks next moved that H.B. 368 be placed on the Local and Uncontested Calendar, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.

The Chair (Moore) moved that Senate State Affairs Committee adjourn subject to the call of the Chair, and the motion passed by voice vote without objection.
