MINUTES OF MEETING OF APRIL 4, 1977

The Chairman called the meeting to order. The roll was called and a quorum was present.

The Chairman laid out H. B. 377 and briefly explained the bill. Dr. Don Satror, representing medical students studying abroad testified in behalf of the bill. Gene Voss, representing himself as a foreign trained medical student, also spoke for the bill. Senator Harris moved the bill be reported favorably and his motion carried by a vote of eight ayes and no nays. The bill was also approved for uncontested calendar recommendation without objection.

The Chairman next laid out H. C. R. 1 and recognized Senator Jones. After briefly explaining the measure, Senator Jones moved it be reported favorably, and the motion carried by a vote of eight ayes and no nays. Uncontested calendar recommendation was also given without objection.

The Chairman next laid out S. B. 230 and recognized Senator Grant Jones, who explained the bill. Senator Andujar moved the bill be reported favorably, and the motion carried by a vote of eight ayes and no nays. Recommendation for uncontested calendar was given without objection.

The Chairman next laid out S. B. 851 and recognized Senator Gene Jones. Senator Jones offered a substitute, which was adopted without objection. Senator Braecklein moved the committee substitute be reported favorably. The vote was six ayes and no nays. There was no objection to recommendation for uncontested calendar.

The bill was reported by the following:
The Chairman next laid out S. B. 906 and recognized the sponsor, Senator Jones of Harris. The following person appeared as a resource witness:

The following person appeared against the bill:

Sid Rich, Texas Nursing Home Association

Upon conclusion of testimony and questions Senator Jones moved the bill be reported favorably. The vote was six ayes and three nays.

The Chairman next laid out S. B. 927 and recognized Senator Mauzy. After questions by Senator Andujar concerning the cost of the bill the measure was reported favorably by a vote of nine ayes and no nays.

The Chairman next laid out S. B. 843 and recognized the sponsor, Senator Parker. Senator Braecklein moved the bill be reported favorably. The vote was seven ayes and no nays. The bill was recommended for local calendar without objection.

The Chairman next laid out S. B. 696 and recognized the sponsor, Senator Schwartz, who explained the bill. Larry Niemann, with the Texas Apartment Association, appeared in opposition to the bill. After some discussion with Senator Schwartz the Chair postponed additional action on the bill for one week.

Senator Gene Jones, acting as Temporary Chairman, laid out S. B. 1122 and recognized the sponsor, Senator Brooks, who briefly explained the bill. The following person appeared as a resource witness:

Final action on the bill was postponed to a later date.

Business for the day having been concluded, the Committee was recessed subject to the call of the Chairman.
