The meeting was called to order and the clerk called the roll.  
A quorum was present.

The Chairman laid out S.B. 696 and recognized Senator Schwartz,  
who explained the changes made in the bill. Senator Brooks offered  
a substitute, which was adopted without objection. Senator Truan  
moved the bill be reported favorably. The vote was seven ayes,  
and no nays. Uncontested calendar recommendation was made.

The Chair laid out H.B. 769. Senator Doggett moved the bill be  
reported favorably. The vote was eight ayes and no nays. Un-  
contested calendar recommendation was made.

The Chair laid out H.B. 817. After brief discussion the bill was  
reported favorably by a vote of eight ayes and no nays. Uncontested  
calendar recommendation was made.

The Chair laid out S.B. 1121. Senator Doggett moved the bill be  
reported favorably. The vote was seven ayes and no nays. Un-  
contested calendar recommendation was made.

The Chair laid out S.B. 776 and Senator Brooks explained the bill.  
Kenneth D. Gaver, M.D., with the Department of MHMR spoke for  
the bill. The bill was reported favorably by a vote of eight ayes  
and no nays. Uncontested calendar recommendation was made.

The Chair laid out H.B. 497 and Senator Brooks explained the bill.  
Senator Lombardino moved the bill be reported favorably. The  
vote was eight ayes and no nays. Uncontested calendar recommend-  
ation was made.

The Chair laid out S.B. 1122 and Senator Brooks explained the bill.  
Senator Lombardino moved the bill be reported favorably. The  
vote was six ayes and two nays.

The Chair next laid out S.B. 1189 and recognized Senator Mengden  
to explain the bill. Harold Tate, representing Texas AFL-CIO,  
appeared against the bill. Senator Harris moved that the bill,  
amended at the last meeting, be reported favorably. The vote  
was six ayes and one present but not voting (Truan).

The Chair laid out S.B. 350. Dr. Gaver of Texas MHMR appeared to  
speak for the bill. Senator Truan moved the bill be reported  
favorably. The vote was six ayes and no nays. Uncontested cal-  
endar recommendation was made.

The Chair laid out S.B. 168 and recognized Senator Clower. The  
following persons testified for the bill:

Senator Clower moved the bill be reported favorably. The vote was  
eight ayes and no nays. Uncontested calendar recommendation was made.

The Chair laid out S.B. 931 and recognized Senator Clower to explain  
the bill. Senator Clower offered a substitute which was adopted  
without objection. The bill was then reported favorably by a vote  
of eight ayes and no nays.

At this point Senator Harris moved that S.B. 860 be re-referred from Special Subcommittee to the Subcommittee on Public Health and Welfare. After some discussion the motion carried by a vote of seven ayes and two nays.

The Chair next laid out S.B. 1031 and recognized Senator Clower. Senator Andujar moved the bill be reported favorably. The vote was six ayes and no nays. Uncontested calendar recommendation was made.
