The Senate Intergovernmental Relations Committee convened at 3:00 P. M. on August 8, 1981 in the Lieutenant Governor's Committee Room for its first meeting of the Special Session.

Chairman John A. Traeger called the meeting to order and called for Roll Call #1, which resulted as follows:

Present - Leedom, Snelson, Traeger, Uribe, Williams
Absent - Kothmann, Mengden, Ogg, Parker.


There being a quorum present, Chairman Traeger asked that Senator Snelson take the chair. Senator Snelson then laid out S. B. 2 and recognized Senator Traeger, sponsor, who explained that the bill creates a County Court at Law of Atascosa County. Following his explanation of an amendment, Senator Traeger sent up Committee Amendment No. 1 and moved its adoption. There was no objection to the motion. There being no other person desiring to testify either in behalf of or in opposition to the bill, Senator Traeger moved to report S. B. 2 back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass as amended and be printed. The motion prevailed on a Roll Call #2 vote of 5 yeas - 0 nays.

Chairman Traeger next laid out S. B. 22 and recognized its sponsor, Senator Richards, who explained that the bill allows an exchange of land to take place between the Texas Board of Corrections and Don Hull. Material pertaining to the exchange of land was then distributed to members of the Committee. Witness #1, Don Hull of Hull Airport, Fort Bend County, Texas was recognized by the Chairman for testimony in support of the bill. Mr. Hull answered questions from Senator Traeger, Leedom and Williams. Senator Williams complimented the Hull Airport and told the committee that there was a definite need for more airports such as the Hull Airport. Witness #2, Mr. Herb Appel of Missouri City, representing Richmond-Rosenberg Chamber of Commerce, signed a witness card in behalf of the bill, but did not testify. There being no opposition to the bill, Senator Leedom moved to report S. B. 22 back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass and be printed. The motion prevailed on a Roll Call #3 vote of 5 yeas - 0 nays.

The Chairman then told the committee that Senator Parker had requested that his S. B. 23 (on today's calendar) be laid on the table subject to call.

On a motion by Senator Snelson, the Committee stood recessed subject to call of the Chair.
