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MINUTES

The Economic Development Committee reconvened at 9:15 a.m, Wednesday, May 1, 1985, in the Lt. Governor's Committee Room.

Senator Leedom assumed the Chair and laid out S.B. 794, calling on Senator Brown, the sponsor, to explain the bill. Senator Leedom sent up a committee substitute for the bill and moved its adoption. The substitute was adopted without objection.

The following witness testified in favor of C.S.S.B. 794:

With Senator Harris in the Chair, Senator Leedom moved that S.B. 794 do not pass, but that C.S.S.B. 794 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass and be printed. The

motion carried with a record vote of seven ayes and no nays, with four absent.

The Chair next laid out S.B. 749, and called on Senator Parmer, the sponsor, to explain the bill. There were no witnesses registered in favor of or in opposition to S.B. 749.

The following persons registered as resource witnesses on the bill, but did not testify:

Senator Parmer moved that S.B. 749 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass and be printed. The motion carried with a record vote of six ayes and no nays, with five absent. Senator Parmer then moved that S.B. 749 be certified for the Local and Uncontested Calendar. There being no objection, the bill was so certified.

The Chair then laid out S.B. 1152, and called on the sponsor, Senator Traeger, for an explanation of the bill. Senator Traeger sent up a committee substitute for S.B. 1152 and moved its adoption. The substitute was adopted without objection.

The following witness testified in favor of S.B. 1152:

Jim Reynolds, 408 W. 14th Street, Austin, representing the Texas Savings and Loan League.

There were no witnesses registered in opposition to S.B. 1152.

The following person registered as a resource witness on S.B. 1152, but did not testify:

Senator Traeger moved that S.B. 1152 do not pass, but that C.S.S.B. 1152 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass and be printed. The motion carried with a record vote of seven ayes and no nays, with four absent. Senator Traeger then moved that C.S.S.B. 1152 be certified for the Local and Uncon-

tested Calendar. There was no objection and the bill was so certified.

The Chair next laid out S.B. 1150 and called on the sponsor, Senator Montford, for an explanation of the bill. Senator Montford sent up a committee substitute for S.B. 1150 and moved its adoption. The substitute was adopted without objection.

The following witness testified in favor of C.S.S.B. 1150:



There were no witnesses registered in opposition to C.S.S.B. 1150.

Senator Montford moved that S.B. 1150 do not pass, but that C.S.S.B. 1150 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass and be printed. The motion carried with a record vote of eight ayes and no nays, with three absent.

The Chair then called on Senator Henderson to present S.B. 816 for the sponsor, Senator Glasgow. Senator Henderson moved that S.B. 816 be laid on the table subject to call. The motion carried without objection. Senator Henderson then sent up a committee substitute for H.B. 1957, the house companion bill to S.B. 816, and moved its adoption. The substitute was adopted without objection. Senator Henderson then moved that H.B. 1957 do not pass, but that C.S.H.B. 1957 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass and be printed. The motion carried with a record vote of six ayes and no nays, with five absent.

Senator Traeger moved that the Economic Development Committee stand in recess, subject to call of the Chair. There was no objection, and the Committee recessed at 10:20 a.m.

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MINUTES

The Economic Development Committee reconvened at 2:10 p.m., Wednesday, May 1, 1985, in the Senate Reception Room.

Senator Harris sent up the subcommittee report on S.B. 916, and moved its adoption. The subcommittee report was adopted without objection. Senator Harris then moved that S.B. 916 do not pass, but that C.S.S.B. 916 be reported back to the Senate with the recommendation that it do pass and be printed. The motion carried with a record vote of six ayes and two nays, with three absent. Senator Leedom, after the record vote, moved that the bill be left as pending business for one week. There was objection, and the motion failed.

Senator Glasgow asked to be shown as voting "aye" on S.B. 1388, which was reported from committee on Tuesday, April 30, 1985. The "aye" vote would not change the outcome of the reporting, and there was no objection to the motion. Senator Glasgow then moved that S.B. 1388 be certified for the Local and Uncontested Calendar. There was no objection, and the bill was so certified.

Senator Leedom moved that the Economic Development Committee stand adjourned until Monday, May 6, 1985. There was no objection, and the Committee adjourned at 2:35 p.m.
