

MINUTES:
COMMITTEE ON
INTERGOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS
April 26, 1977

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Pursuant to a notice posted in compliance with Rule V, Sec. 14, the Committee on Intergovernmental Affairs met in the Member's Lounge on Tuesday, April 26, 1977, at 7:05 p.m. and was called to order by Chairman Lewis.

The roll was answered as follows:

Present: Edwards, Gilley, Hall, Lauhoff, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada, Untermeyer, Whitmire & Lewis.

Absent: Ribak

A quorum was present

Chair recognized Rep. Schlueter to present H.B. 1027 by Smothers that was postponed from 4/19/77. Rep. Tejada moved to table 1027 and hear S.B. 237 the companion. There were no objections. Rep. Olson moved the bill be sent to the House Floor and placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 8/1: AYE: Edwards, Olson, Orr, Stubbeman, Schlueter, Tejada, Untermeyer & Lewis; NO: Hall.

Chair recognized Rep. Looney to present H.B. 1794. Mr. R. Kern, Attorney for City of McAllen testified in favor of the bill. Rep. Olson moved to send the bill back to the Floor and be placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 11/0: AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Hall, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada, Untermeyer, Whitmire & Lewis.

Chair recognized Rep. Garcia to present H.B. 1549. Messers. Jan Klinck, representing the McAllen Chamber of Commerce and Downtown Merchants Assoc.; Larry Fallek, representing the Merchants Assoc.; Michael Moore, representing the Texas Retail Federation; and R. Kern, City Attorney for McAllen, testified in favor of the bill. Rep. Olson moved the bill be sent back to the House Floor and be placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 8/0/1. AYE: Edwards, Hall, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada and Lewis. PNV: Untermeyer.

Chair recognized Rep. Wyatt to present H.B. 2069 and companion S.B. 793. H.B. 2069 being tabled, Rep. Schlueter moved the S.B. 793 be sent to the House Floor and placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 8/0. AYE: Edwards, Hall, Olson, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada, Untermeyer and Lewis.

Chair recognized Rep. Wyatt to present H.B. 2070/ S.B. 792. Rep. Tejada moved to table H.B. 2070 and hear S.B. 792; there being no objections, it was so ordered. Rep. Olson offered committee amendment #1 for adoption; there being no objections, it was so ordered. Rep. Schlueter offered committee amendment #2 for adoption; there being no objections, it was so ordered. Rep. Schlueter moved that S.B. 792 be sent to the House Floor as amended and be placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 11/0. AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Lauhoff, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada, Untermeyer, Whitmire and Lewis.

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Chair recognized Rep. Evans to present H.B. 1806. Rep. Edwards offered Committee Substitute for adoption. The motion carried by a vote of 11/1. AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Orr, Stubbeman, Tejada, Untermeyer, Whitmire, Schlueter, Lauhoff, Hall and Lewis. NO: Olson. Rep. Edwards moved that C.S.H.B. 1806 be sent back to the House Floor as substituted and be placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 10/1. AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Lauhoff, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada, Untermeyer, Whitmire & Lewis. NO: Olson

Rep. Gilley made a motion to bring H.B. 1499 back to the full committee for consideration. Rep. Olson moved to table this motion. After parliamentary inquiries from Reps. Edwards, Hall and Untermeyer, the vote was taken on the Olson motion to table. AYE: Edwards, Hall, Lauhoff, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada, Untermeyer, Whitmire and Lewis. NO: Gilley. The motion to table prevailed 11/1.

Chair recognized Rep. Rudd to present H.B. 830. Rep. Olson offered committee amendment #1 for adoption; there being no objections, it was so ordered. Rep. Schlueter offered committee amendment #2 for adoption; there being no objections, it was so ordered. Rep. Olson moved to send the bill back to the House Floor as amended and placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 8/0. AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Hall, Lauhoff, Olson, Orr, Stubbeman & Lewis.

Chair recognized Rep. Rudd to present H.B. 1741. Rep. Edwards offered a committee substitute for adoption. County Judge Glenn Thompson of Cochran County testified in favor of the legislation. The motion for adoption of C.S.H.B. 1741 carried 5/3. AYE: Edwards, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman & Lewis; PNV: Hall, Olson & Tejada. Rep. Olson moved to send the C.S.H.B. 1741 back to the House Floor as substituted and placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 7/1. AYE: Edwards, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada and Lewis. PNV: Hall.

Chair recognized Rep. Finnell to present H.B.1270/S.B. 553. Rep. Stubbeman moved to table the House Bill and offered committee amendment #1 to S.B. 553. There being no objections, it was so ordered. Rep. Stubbeman then moved to send the Senate Bill back to the House Floor as amended and placed on the Local Calendar. The motion carried 7/0. AYE: Edwards, Hall, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman and Lewis.

Chair recognized Rep. Hollowell to present H.B. 506. There being no witnesses, Rep. Hall moved the bill be sent back to the House Floor and placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 7/0. AYE; Edwards, Hall, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, & Lewis.

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Chair recognized Rep. Henderson to present H.B. 1452. Mr. Roland Ruble, V.P. of the Greenwood Forest Civic Assn. testifying in favor of the bill. Mr. Fred Williams, Asst. to Mayor Hoffienz in Houston testified against the bill. Rep. Hall moved to send the bill to the subcommittee on Urban Affairs; there being no objections, it was so ordered.

Chair laid out H.B. 1937 by Massey and moved to send it to the subcommittee on Urban Affairs; there being no objections, it was so ordered.

Chair laid out S.B. 552 and Rep. Hall offered committee amendment #1 for adoption. There being no objections, it was so ordered. Rep. Edwards moved S.B. 552 as amended be sent back to the House Floor and placed on the Local Calendar. The motion carried 11/0. AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Hall, Lauhoff, Olson, Orr, Schlueter, Tejada, Untermeyer, Whitmire & Lewis.

Chair recognized Rep. Caraway to present H.B. 1278. Testifying in favor of the bill were: Mr. William Schweinle, an Attorney representing the Clear Lake City Civic League; Mr. Tom Leonard, an Attorney representing the Clear Lake City Civic League; Mr. William Farries, an Engineer representing the Clear Lake City Incorporation Committee; Mr. David Riley, representing the Clear Lake City Water Authority; Mr. Robert Savely, an Aerospace Manager, representing the Clear Lake City Civic League; and Mr. Charles Whynot, representing the Clear Lake City Chamber of Commerce. Testifying against the bill was Mr. Fred Williams, Assistant to Mayor Hoffienz of Houston. Rep. Stubbeman offered a committee substitute for adoption. The motion carried 8/0/4. AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Lauhoff, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada, & Lewis; PNV: Hall, Olson, Untermeyer and Whitmire. Rep. Lauhoff moved the bill be sent back to the House Floor as substituted and placed on the Consent Calendar. Rep. Hall made a substitute motion to send the C.S.H.B. 1278 to the subcommittee on Urban Affairs. Rep. Gilley moved to table the Hall motion. The vote was taken on the motion to table. AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Lauhoff, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada; NO: Hall, Olson, Untermeyer, Whitmire and Lewis. The motion carried 7/5. The vote was then taken on the Lauhoff motion to send the bill back to the Floor as substituted and placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 7/5. AYE: Edwards, Gilley, Lauhoff, Orr, Schlueter, Stubbeman, Tejada; NO: Hall, Untermeyer, Whitmire, Olson & Lewis.

Chair recognized Rep. Orr to present H.B. 1973. Testifying in favor of the bill was Reverend William Oliver of Beaumont and Mr. J. Ernest Stroud, former Mayor of Amarillo. Testifying against the bill were: Judge Wilbur Dunk of Texas Assn. Regional Councils; Mr. J.H. Brigance, County Commissioner of Brazoria Co.; Mr. Glenn Thompson, County Judge of Cochran County; Mr. B. Wranitzky, County Commissioner of Hays County; Mrs. Margie Abbott of Central Texas Council of Governments; Mr. Hugh Stempel, Mayor of Coleman; Mr. Al Notzon, Alamo Area Council of Governments; Mr. Dick Stanford


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of West Lake Hills City Council; Mr. Clyde McAnelly, Mayor of Lometa; Scott Bailey, County Judge of Eastland; and Mr. Jeff Harkinson, Director of Regional Services NCTCOG Executive Board. Rep. Hall moved to send the bill to the subcommittee on Local Government; there being no objections, it was so ordered.

Chair then recognized Rep. Lauhoff to submit his subcommittee's reports. Chair laid out H.B. 1463 and Rep. Lauhoff recommended the bill be sent back to the House Floor. The motion carried 8/1. AYE: Hall, Lauhoff, Olson, Schlueter, Tejada, Untermeyer, Whitmire & Lewis. NO: Stubbeman.

Chair laid out H.B. 490 and Rep. Hall moved the bill be sent back to the House Floor and placed on the Consent Calendar. The motion carried 9/0. AYE: Whitmire, Untermeyer, Tejada, Stubbeman, Schlueter, Lauhoff, Hall, Olson, & Lewis.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 12:01a.m. subject to call of the Chair.
