Pursuant to a public notice posted on April 24, 1985, at 1:30 p.m., the Committee convened in a public hearing and was called to order by the Chair.

The roll was answered as follows:

Present: Gibson, Hammond, Haley, Wallace, and Wright (5).

Absent: Finnell, Bush, McKenna and Schlueter (4).

A quorum was present.

Chairman laid out H.B. 1746 and recognized Representative Dudley Harrison to explain the bill.

Chair recognized Rayford Price, Austin, Texas, representing himself, who testified as a resource witness.

Chair left H.B. 1746 pending before the Committee.

Chair laid out Subcommittee Report on C.S.H.B. 2078 and explained the Report.

Chair left C.S.H.B. 2078 pending before the Committee.

Chair laid out H.B. 2273 and recognized Representative Steve Wolens to explain the bill.

Chair recognized Carol Barger, Consumers Union, Austin, Texas, who testified in favor of the bill.

Chair recognized Larry Temple, Texas Mortgage Bankers Association, Austin, Texas, who testified against the bill.

Mr. Finnell now present.

Chair referred H.B. 2273 to subcommittee to be named by the Chair.

Chair laid out Subcommittee Report on C.S.H.B. 2078 and recognized Mr. Wright for a motion.

Mr. Wright moved that C.S.H.B. 2078 be reported favorably, referred to the Committee on Calendars, with the recommendation that it be printed and do pass.

Mr. Hammond moved that the Report be adopted and that C.S.H.B. 2131 be reported favorably, referred to the Committee on Calendars, with the recommendation that it be printed and do pass.

Mr. Haley moved that H.B. 1747, as amended, be reported favorably, referred to the Consent Calendars Committee, with the recommendation that it be printed and do pass.

Chair laid out H.B. 2342 and recognized Representative Clint Hackney to explain the bill.

Chair recognized John C. Dawson, Jr., representing Texas Association of Bank Holding Companies, who testified in favor of the bill.

Chair left H.B. 2342 pending before the Committee.

Chair laid out C.S.H.B. 1822 for Committee consideration.

Mr. Hammond moved that C.S.H.B. 1822 be reported favorably, referred to the Committee on Calendars, with the recommendation that it be printed and do pass.

The motion was adopted by the following vote:
