H. B. No. 167.]                      CHAPTER 166.

An Act making appropriations for the support and maintenance of the executive and administrative departments and agencies of the State Government for the two-year period beginning September 1, 1933, and ending August 31, 1935, and for other purposes; and prescribing certain regulations and restrictions in respect thereto, and appropriating Twelve Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$1260.00), for the support and maintenance of the Texas Racing Commission, created by this Act empowered to authorize, permit and license the racing of horses and in connection therewith, the use by a licensee of the certificate system, which system is declared not to be either betting or pool selling within the meaning of Articles 645, 647 and 648, of the Penal Code of the State of Texas, Title 2, Chapter VI, of the 1925 Revision, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:*

SECTION 1. That the several sums of money herein specified, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, or out of special funds as may be shown, for the support and maintenance of the several departments and agencies of the State Government for the two-year period beginning September 1, 1933, and ending August 31, 1935.

Subsection 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Twelve Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$1260.00) to pay the operating expense for the period ending December 31, 1933, of the Texas Racing Commission, hereby created, and vested with all powers required to carry out fully the purposes of this Act.

The appropriations in the said General Appropriation Bill

for the State Department of Agriculture in the sum of Two Hundred Twenty-three Thousand Two Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$223,280.00), shall not be drawn on unless and/or until appropriation made in this amendment for the use and benefit of said Department of Agriculture shall be insufficient or unavailable for the payment of such sum so appropriated, the intent being that the specific appropriations provided for in this Act resulting from the operations of the Racing Commission shall constitute the primary source of funds for the payment of the said appropriations made for the State Department of Agriculture except such fees or special funds as may otherwise be provided for.

It is hereby expressly declared that the appropriations of any and every character as provided in this General Appropriation Bill for the maintenance of the Department of Agriculture shall be drawn against General Revenue in whole or in part if, and when funds accruing from the operations of the Racing Commission, and which have been deposited in the Treasury from such source, are insufficient, inadequate or unavailable to meet the current and necessary expenses of said Department as may be provided for by the Appropriation Bill.

The Texas Racing Commission, for which the foregoing appropriation of Twelve Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$1260.00) is made, shall consist of three (3) members, one (1) of whom shall be the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas; one (1) shall be the Tax Commissioner of the State of Texas; the third, who shall be the Chairman of the Commission, shall be appointed by the Governor of the State, with the advice and consent of the Senate, and shall have been a citizen of Texas and a bona fide owner and breeder of thoroughbred livestock in Texas for a period of at least two (2) years at the time of his appointment. Two (2) Commissioners shall constitute a quorum, with power to act.

The Commission shall establish an office at such place in Texas as it may determine. It shall select a Secretary, and as many as two (2) Clerks, if necessary, who shall serve at the will of the Commission. The Secretary and the said Clerk shall receive such salary as is allowed by the Commission, provided, however, the Secretary's salary shall not exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) per month, and the Clerks' not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month each. The Commission shall have power to pay all reasonable and necessary expenses incident to the conducting of its business.

The Chairman shall be eligible for reappointment.

Members of the Commission shall be entitled to receive their actual expenses when on the business of the Commission, and the Chairman shall, in addition, receive compensation at the rate of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per day while actually engaged in the business of the Commission, such compensation, in the aggregate, not to exceed Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) in any one (1) twelve (12) month period.

A Chairman shall be appointed within not exceeding thirty (30) days from the passage of this Act, whose term of office shall be the same as the term of office of the Commissioner of Agriculture, and, thereafter, the Chairman shall be so appointed as that his term of office will conform to the term of office of the Commissioner of Agriculture. In event of a vacancy in the Chairmanship, arising from any cause, the Governor shall, by appointment, fill such vacancy.

The Racing Commission shall have the power, and it shall be its duty, to prescribe and enforce rules, regulations and conditions under which all horse races held under this Act shall be conducted in the State of Texas. It shall likewise prescribe and enforce rules governing the conduct of all persons who engage in the racing of horses, to the end that such races shall be fairly conducted and so as to insure integrity in the conduct of such races. The Commission shall have power to exclude from participation in such races any person or persons who omit, fail or refuse to comply with the reasonable rules promulgated by said Commission and to prescribe, as a penalty for such omission, failure or refusal, the denial of the right of such persons to so participate in such races.

The Commission shall have the power and authority to permit and to authorize the racing of horses under what is here designated the "certificate system." Under this system the Commission shall permit, authorize and issue a license on the compliance by an applicant for a license with the requirements of this Act to conduct races and use in connection therewith the said certificate system, which system shall expressly authorize and make lawful the right of a licensee to collect and receive contributions of money from any person or persons present at such race toward the entry of any horse in such race selected by such person or persons to run first in such race, and the person or persons so contributing such money shall acquire an interest in the total money so contributed on all horses in the race as first winners in proportion to the amount of money contributed by such person or persons.

Such licensee shall receive the said contributions of money and issue to the contributors thereof certificates on which shall be shown the number of the race, the amount contributed and the number or name of the horse selected by such person as such first winner.

As each race is run the licensee shall be authorized to deduct from the total sum contributed on all horses as first winners ten per cent (10%) of the amount thus contributed, and the balance remaining on hand after deducting such ten per cent (10%) shall be paid out to the holders of certificates on the winning horse equally in proportion as the amount contributed by such person bears to the total amount contributed toward the entry of all the horses in said race to run first.

Subsection 2. The licensee, in like way, may receive such contributions on horses selected to run second, third, or both,

the method and procedure, and the right of the licensee, to be as specified in the next preceding section hereof.

The said certificate system as herein authorized shall not be construed to be either pool selling or betting within the meaning of Articles 645, 647 and 648, of the Penal Code of the State of Texas, Title 2, Chapter VI, according to the 1925 Revision.

Subsection 3. The use of such system shall not be permitted at any other place than within the enclosure stated in the license, nor shall the said certificate system be permitted to be used on any races except horse races.

No such certificate shall be purchased by or sold to a minor.

Races authorized under this Act may be held only between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and 7:00 P. M. of the racing days fixed by the Commission.

No license shall be issued to any one applicant for the holding of more than two (2) meetings in any calendar year, nor on more than one (1) race course, nor for more than sixty-one (61) racing days in the aggregate in any twelve (12) months period.

No person shall receive a license except upon satisfactory showing made to the Commission that such person has adequate facilities for the conducting of such races, and is of good standing; and such person so applying shall give bond payable to the Racing Commission, with good security, in such amount as the Commission shall determine, not, however, to exceed the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), to be approved by the Commission, conditioned, in effect, that such applicant will conduct such races and the operation of such certificate system as contemplated by this law in accordance with this Act, and shall account to and pay over to the State Treasurer of the State of Texas the amounts required by this Act to be so paid.

Subsection 4. The Racing Commission may designate a representative, whose compensation shall not exceed Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per day, and reasonable expenses when on the business of the Commission, to attend any horse race meeting licensed under this Act, whose duty it shall be to supervise the conducting of such races and to see to it that the rules of the Commission are faithfully enforced. He shall have full and free access to the place or enclosure where the certificate system is conducted or supervised; and, for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not the licensee is retaining only the commission provided for in this Act, he shall have access to the books, records and papers pertaining to the operation and the results of the said certificate system at such rates. A licensee shall keep true and correct records, which shall show all financial operations of said certificate system at such races.

Subsection 5. Any person or persons, association or corporation desiring to conduct racing of horses in Texas and to use in connection therewith the said certificate system, as in

this Act authorized, shall make application in writing to the Racing Commission for a license so to do. The application shall be considered and acted upon by the Commission not less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the commencement of such races so sought to be held. The application shall state the days on which such racing is desired to be conducted; it shall describe the place and race track or course at which the races are to be conducted; it shall be in such form and supply such facts as the Commission shall by general rule prescribe, and such application shall be verified. If the applicant is eligible to receive a license under the provisions of this law, it shall be the duty of the Racing Commission to fix the racing days that shall be allotted to such applicant, and the Commission shall issue a license for the holding of the meeting or meetings so sought to be held. The license issued shall describe the place and track or race course at which the licensee is authorized to hold such meeting or meetings, and the authority conferred in any one (1) license shall be limited to the calendar year in which it is issued. The license issued shall expressly provide that the licensee shall remit to the Treasurer of the State of Texas, at the end of each race meeting, eight per cent (8%) of the total of all moneys retained as commission or compensation by the licensee, as authorized by this Act. This fund, when received by the Treasurer, shall be held by him as a "Special Racing Fund."

Except as to the foregoing Twelve Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$1260.00), by Section 1 hereof appropriated to the Racing Commission, the expenses incurred and authorized by virtue of this feature of this Act shall be payable out of the "Special Racing Fund," but not otherwise, and so paid upon accounts approved by the Racing Commission and warrants drawn by the Comptroller on the State Treasurer.

The Treasurer of the State of Texas, in December of each year, shall make a complete statement of the amount he has received within the calendar year under the provisions of this Act. After there shall have been charged against this fund the theretofore paid out operating expenses of the Racing Commission, as herein authorized, and the amount which the Racing Commission shall estimate as being required to be paid out in that year, and, in addition thereto, such amount as the said Racing Commission shall estimate as the expenses for the operating of the Commission for the next succeeding calendar year, the amount then remaining in this fund shall be, and it is hereby appropriated and shall be disbursed thus:

An amount equal to twenty-five per cent (25%) of the total amount which the Treasurer shall receive and place in the said "Special Racing Fund" is hereby appropriated as a fund out of which the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas is authorized and empowered to purchase, transport and deliver for distribution well-bred and approved stallions and jacks throughout the State of Texas, and, in connection there-

with, defray the actual reasonable expenses incident to the purchase, transportation and maintenance of such animals, in order thereby to promote the breeding of better livestock in the State of Texas. After the said operating expenses of the Commission shall have been defrayed, and after the said amount equal to twenty-five per cent (25%) of said fund shall have been deducted from the said "Special Racing Fund," the balance remaining in said fund, so far as it may be required, shall be used for the payment of the appropriations by the Legislature for the support and maintenance of the State Department of Agriculture as said appropriations for that Department shall be fixed and allowed by the Legislature of the State of Texas from time to time. It is further provided that any excess left in the "Special Racing Fund" shall be by the State Treasurer divided into as many equal parts as there are counties in the State of Texas, and he shall thereupon immediately remit one of such equal parts to the County Treasurer of each county in the State of Texas, who shall pay the same into such lawful fund or funds of said county as shall be determined by the Commissioners Court of said County.

Subsection 6. The payments herein required to be made by the licensee to the Treasurer of the State of Texas shall be in lieu of all other or further excise or occupation taxes to the State of Texas or any county, city, town, or other political subdivision thereof.

Subsection 7. The titles of such animals so purchased shall be in the State of Texas.

For the service of such animals so distributed, the Commissioner of Agriculture is authorized to make a charge of not exceeding Five Dollars (\$5.00) for colts foaled. The amounts so collected by the Commissioner of Agriculture shall be used by him to defray the expense incident to the maintenance of such animals.

The Commissioner of Agriculture shall adopt and carry out reasonable rules and regulations with respect to the distribution, care, use and maintenance of such animals. All expenditures thus authorized shall be paid upon accounts approved by the Commissioner of Agriculture, and warrants drawn by the Comptroller on the State Treasurer.

In allotting or distributing said stallions and jacks, the Commissioner of Agriculture shall request and give consideration to the recommendations of the Commissioners Court and of the members of the Legislature of the particular counties seeking the distribution of such animals.

The Commissioner of Agriculture annually, not later than November 1st, shall make and file with the Governor a report in writing which shall set forth the amounts of the funds disbursed in detail, the way in which disbursement was made and the amount collected by him as service charges on such animals.

Subsection 8. Any person or persons, corporation or association who shall operate the said certificate system on the

racing of horses, except when licensed under the provisions of this Act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), for each day of such unauthorized use.

Subsection 9. In event any licensee shall intentionally violate any provision of this Act or any rule promulgated by the Racing Commission, the Commission shall have the power, on reasonable notice to the licensee, and after giving such licensee an opportunity to be heard, to cancel such license. In event of such cancellation, the licensee shall not be eligible to receive another license within a period of twelve months from the date of such cancellation.

In event any such licensee shall be dissatisfied with the decision of the Commission, he shall have the right to have said decision of the Commission reviewed by the District Court of the County where such licensee was authorized to conduct such racing under the same procedure as is now applicable to a review by the District Court of an order of the Railroad Commission of Texas.

Subsection 10. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to apply to the racing of horses when the operation of the certificate system of racing is not used in connection with such racing.

#### SPECIAL FUNDS OF DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Provided that all fees and/or unexpended balances which have been received and which may be received by virtue of Articles 58, 66, 88 and 117, of the Revised Civil Statutes, 1925, and any amendments thereto, and also by virtue of Chapter 88, Acts of the First Called Session of the Fortieth Legislature, Chapter 93, Acts of the First Called Session of the Forty-first Legislature, Chapter 304, Acts of the Regular Session of the Forty-first Legislature as amended by House Bill 375, Regular Session of the Forty-second Legislature, Chapter 288, Acts of the Regular Session of the Forty-first Legislature as amended by House Bill 500, Regular Session of the Forty-second Legislature, and Chapter 176, Regular Session of the Forty-second Legislature, and any amendments to any of said Acts, together with any other fees collected by the Department of Agriculture under the laws of this State, are hereby appropriated, after they shall have been deposited in the State Treasury, to the Department of Agriculture to be used by said Department for the enforcement of the above mentioned Acts and for the operation and maintenance of said activities, and said funds shall not be used to pay any salaries for amounts more than the limitations placed on the salaries of persons performing the functions of said respective activities as hereinbefore specified. The State Comptroller and State Treasurer shall designate in their records such special deposits for funds in order that the expenditures provided by said Acts may be paid

from these special funds, provided that no part of the funds herein appropriated, whether special funds, local funds, general revenue funds or other funds, and regardless of whatever purpose the funds are appropriated for, shall be used directly or indirectly to pay traveling or other expenses for any officer or employee of the Department of Agriculture when traveling outside the State of Texas.

There is hereby appropriated out of the State Highway Fund, to be immediately available, the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be paid on accounts approved by the Attorney General, for expenses incurred by him in defending the numerous suits authorized by this Legislature to be filed against the State of Texas and/or State Highway Department for damages; and in representing the State Highway Department in condemnation proceedings for rights-of-way and other purposes and in all other suits where it is his constitutional or statutory duty to do so. All outgoing mail of the agencies of the government hereinafter mentioned shall be transferred to the Central Mailing Room and mailed under the supervision and direction of the State Board of Control through the Central Mailing Bureau, for which bureau appropriations are herein provided. Inter-departmental mail shall not be mailed through the United States Post Office but shall be delivered under the direction of the Central Mailing Bureau and under the rules adopted by the Board of Control. All warrants for stamps, stamped envelopes, post cards and other mailing supplies to be purchased from the United States Post Offices for all State Departments, Commissions, Boards and other Agencies of the Government, located in the State Capitol Building, State Office Building, State Highway Building and the Walton (Court House) Building in the city of Austin, when issued, shall be payable to a United States Post Office and shall be delivered by the State Comptroller to the superintendent of said Mailing Bureau to be used by said Superintendent for the reimbursement of any postage purchase revolving fund, which may be set up or for purchase by said Bureau of such stamps and other postal supplies, and each of said agencies shall be properly credited by the Bureau with said

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stamps and supplies to which it is entitled out of its respective payments. Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), is hereby appropriated as a revolving fund for the purchase of such postage, available and operative throughout the biennium ending August 31, 1935. Said stamps and supplies shall be used by said Central Mailing Bureau under the direction of the Board of Control in mailing the official letters and other articles and parcels of each said agencies under such rules and regulations as shall be prescribed by the Board of Control. In order that the Board of Control may efficiently handle the mailing of all official letters, packages and other mailable articles and keep a complete record of all outgoing official mail the appropriations and funds authorized to be expended by said agencies for stamps and other postal supplies are hereby conditioned on the above provisions and on the rules prescribed by the Board of Control. Warrants issued for the purchase of postage shall be immediately honored and paid by the States Treasurer. The Board of Control may allow any of said agencies a supply of adhesive stamps not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00) at any one time, replenishable as expended for official business. The Board of Control is authorized to expend amounts from any mailing bureau appropriations to pay insurance premiums on surety bonds of any mailing bureau employees.

It is provided that three-fourths ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) of the total amount of the appropriations each year for the Natural Gas and Cigarette Tax Enforcement Division of the State Comptroller's Department shall be paid from the State Available School Fund and the remaining one-fourth ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) from the General Revenue Fund; and the State Treasurer and State Comptroller are hereby authorized and directed to transfer the said three-fourths ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) of the appropriated amounts from the State Available School Fund to the General Revenue Fund, either annually or semi-annually during each fiscal year, or such transfer may be made before the receipts are deposited in the Available School Fund.

Provided that no commission or compensation shall be paid or allowed to any officer, tax collector or employee, on money collected by the supervisors provided for herein or through their efforts or instrumentality.

For the purpose of having the State Highway Gasoline Tax Fund bear its part of the just charges and expenses of other agencies of the Government which furnish traveling expenses, supplies, and perform certain duties and valuable functions

connected with the collection and other administration of State Highway gasoline tax matters, there is also hereby appropriated out of the State Highway Gasoline Tax Fund, for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1935, the sum of \$2800.00 to cover certain salaries, parts of salaries, and certain supplies, which are already listed and itemized in the appropriations for the Comptroller's Department and the State Treasurer's Department. The above specific appropriations are to be paid out of the Fish and Oyster Fund and all moneys in the State Treasury on September 1, 1933, credited to such fund, together with the current revenue to be derived and placed to the credit of this fund, during the next ensuing two years ending August 31, 1935, is hereby appropriated for the purposes now provided for by law. It shall be used for the enforcement of the fish and oyster laws of this State; for the dissemination of useful information pertaining to the economic value of fish, oyster and other marine life; for the making of scientific investigations and surveys of the sea-food fishes and marine life; for the better protection and conservation of sea-food fishes, oysters and other marine life; for the purchase, repair and operation of boats and dredges; for the employment of boat and dredge mates; for the provisions for boats and dredges; and for all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the fish and oyster laws provided for by law. Provided, however, that no salary paid to additional employees shall exceed the amounts herein appropriated for similar positions. All disbursements shall be made on warrants drawn by the Comptroller on State Treasury.

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Provided that captains and mates shall not be paid any additional sums as wardens and shall not receive any additional compensation for executing other duties.

Provided the Game Commission may direct the Comptroller to permit withdrawals of petty cash expense funds of not exceeding at any one time the respective sums of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each small and for each large coastal boat, respectively, to be used for the cash purchase of perishable supplies and also to be used under rules promulgated by the Board of Control for small purchases of emergently needed supplies, materials and equipment. Provided that no game and fish warden shall receive more than Ninety Dollars (\$90.00) per month and expenses. Provided that no superintendent or assistant superintendent of fish hatcheries shall be paid in excess of the amount appropriated out of the Sand, Shell and Gravel Fund. All disbursements shall be made on warrants drawn by the Comptroller on State Treasury.

Provided, that all revenues including fines, fees, and penalties collected by the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission or by its authority, from any source whatsoever, together with any and all unexpended balances in the hands of the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission on August 31, 1933, shall be paid into the State Treasury, accompanied by a statement showing from what and for what purposes said revenues, fines, penalties and other moneys were collected, which said funds shall be placed to the credit of the several funds to which same shall be credited, and all of said moneys are hereby appropriated to and for the use of the Game, Fish and Oyster Commission, as provided herein above and for the purposes enumerated above and for carrying out the several provisions of the law which the said Game, Fish and Oyster Commission is authorized to administer and enforce. There is hereby appropriated out of the State Highway Fund for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1935, the sum of Fifty Thousand One Hundred Seventy-six Dollars (\$50,176.00) to cover certain salaries, parts of salaries, traveling expenses and other items which are listed and itemized in the appropriations for the Attorney General's Department, the State Board of Control, the State Comptroller and State Auditor, and the State Treasurer, and which amount herein appropriated also covers the cost of furnishing heat, water, and power included in the maintenance and miscellaneous appropriations division of the State Board of Control, the purpose of this appropriation being to have the State Highway Fund bear its just part of the expense incurred by other State departments in serving the Highway Department. The State Comptroller and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to

transfer the amounts herein appropriated from the State Highway Fund to the General Revenue Fund, either annually or semi-annually at any time during each of said fiscal years. For the purpose of enabling the State Highway Commission to investigate the facts necessary for the Attorney General to know in defending litigation arising out of suits authorized to be instituted against the State and/or the State Highway Commission by the Forty-third Legislature and to enable the State Highway Commission to employ competent investigators and clerical assistance and to defray expenses in connection with such investigations, there is hereby appropriated the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for the use and benefit of the State Highway Department in connection with such investigations and the employment of clerical assistance and defraying expenses; provided, however, that no investigator shall receive more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per month for services rendered and all clerical assistance shall be paid the same as is allowed for similar services of other employees of the State Highway Department; provided further, that the investigators and other employees shall be required to render such assistance as may be directed by the Attorney General in the investigation of any suits filed against the State of Texas and the State Highway Commission as authorized by the Forty-third Legislature, and the Attorney General shall be entitled to their services as and when needed by him for such purposes.

Provided, that the above and foregoing amounts appropriated herein for the State Highway Department, and for services rendered by other agencies of the State Government to the Highway Department, shall be paid out of the State Highway Fund upon warrants issued by the State Comptroller, as provided by Chapter 1, Title 116, Revised Civil Statutes, 1925, and amendments thereto; provided, further, that all funds or balances of funds on hand September 1, 1933, and all funds coming into the State Highway Fund, and derived from registration fees or from other sources, after deducting the total of the specific appropriations herein made, are hereby appropriated to the State Highway Department for the establishment of a system of State Highways and the construction and maintenance thereof, as contemplated and set forth in said Chapter 1, Title 116, and Chapter 186, General Laws of the Regular Session of the Thirty-ninth Legislature, and amendments thereto.

Provided that no State Highway Funds shall be used or expended in the payment of full or partial salaries, or to participate in the supplementing of any salaries for any kind of work done for, by or under the supervision or direction of the State Highway Department, other than those amounts specifically provided in the above itemized appropriations, where the total to be paid such additional respective employee from Federal, State, County, or other funds, exceeds the respective amount below listed, to-wit: File clerks at not exceeding Nine Hundred

Dollars (\$900.00) each per year; Bookkeepers at not exceeding Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500.00) each per year; Registration, warrant, voucher, comptometer or tabulating clerks, typists, stenographers or those performing secretarial duties, at not exceeding Thirteen Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1320.00) each per year; resident engineers and division engineers at an average salary of not to exceed Thirty-one Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$3180.00) each per year, none to exceed Forty Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$4050.00) per year; assistant division engineers, at not exceeding Twenty-six Hundred Forty Dollars (\$2640.00) per year; any other additional positions not herein specifically listed, having like duties to similar positions listed in the above itemized appropriations, at not exceeding the amounts specifically appropriated therein for such similar positions.

Provided, further, that the authorization that permits State Departments to excuse one-half of their employees at noon on Saturday is modified for the State Highway Department to provide that said Department may set its closing time on Saturday and permit all employees to leave, provided the number of hours' work during the week shall be the same as provided in the General Appropriation Bill. This provision being granted inasmuch as the Highway Department cannot function efficiently with only half of the employees present.

Provided that all printing and stationery shall be purchased through the Board of Control and shall be confined to such articles and qualities as selected and contracted for by the Board of Control.

It is provided that the total amount of all the appropriations listed above in the Cigarette Tax Division for the administration of the cigarette tax Act shall be paid from the State Available School Fund; and the State Treasurer and State Comptroller are hereby authorized and directed to transfer the total of such appropriations from the State Available School Fund to the General Revenue Fund of the State, either annually or semiannually during each fiscal year, or such transfer may be made before the receipts are deposited in the Available School Fund. It is further provided that none of the above appropriations for the State Treasurer shall be used for branch or field offices located outside of the Capitol Building.

Said refunds shall be made to purchasers and to lessees of public domain, mineral lands, public school, university and asylum lands and to purchasers of timber, or their vendees or assigns on account of payments by them into the State Treasury or to the Attorney General in any of the following instances:

a. Through error made in good faith, to be supported by the official signature of the Land Commissioner, or of the Attorney General, to whom such payment is made.

b. Where the payment is made in accordance with law, but title cannot issue or possession cannot pass, because of conflict

in boundaries, erroneous sales, erroneous lease or other cause.

c. In case of sale of leased lands.

d. Where lease money has been paid on previous forfeited sales, the same having been reinstated and all interest paid.

e. Where erroneous timber sales have been made.

f. Where overpayments have been made in final payments to the State Treasurer.

g. Where a reduction has been made in acreage of timber sold or leased.

h. In case of sale of timber which has been previously cut and appropriated, without such fact having been reported to the General Land office prior to such sale; and to pay over to the newly organized counties where school lands set apart to such county are under lease at the time of organization of such county, previously paid but unearned portions of lease money on such lands; all refunds and payments herein provided for to be paid out of the respective funds to which said payments have been made or may be accredited, and all claims for refund or payment, except those embraced in subdivision (a) hereof, to be certified by the certificate of the Commissioner of General Land Office and also the proper amounts, and all such claims to be verified by the affidavit of the claimant and approved by the Attorney General as to the correctness of the claim to whom due, provided, that the money so paid by any purchasers or lessees in case of sale of land by the purchaser, or assignment of the lease by the lessee after payment of such money, so that such refund shall be paid to the person upon whom the loss falls in case of failure of title, or right of possession.

#### BOARD OF COUNTY AND DISTRICT ROAD INDEBTEDNESS

The County and Road District Highway Fund, as provided for in Chapter 13, General Laws of the Third Called Session of the Forty-second Legislature, is hereby appropriated for the two-year period ending August 31, 1935, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of said Chapter, and any amendments thereto, which relate to the assumption by the State of certain outstanding road bonds; and pursuant to paragraph (k) of Section 7 of said Chapter, there is hereby appropriated Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1934, and August 31, 1935, respectively, for the purpose of paying salaries and all other necessary expenses of the State Board of County and District Road Indebtedness; provided salaries paid shall not exceed the following amounts per month: Chief accountant, Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00); auditors, Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00); bookkeepers and/or bond clerks, One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00); clerks and/or stenographers, One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$110.00); two bond clerks to be paid out of this appropriation, shall be assigned to assist the State Treasurer in

the performance of his duties in connection with the administration of the law relating to payment of said road bonds. Any balances remaining in said fund at the end of any fiscal year, together with the annual receipts of said fund, are hereby appropriated for the payment of the amounts specified in the foregoing paragraph and also for the payment and/or partial payment of the interest and the principal indebtedness, legally eligible, of said Road Bonded Indebtedness, in accordance with and as authorized by law to be paid out of said fund. The Clerk of the Supreme Court is hereby authorized to pay himself, his four (4) assistants and the two (2) law clerks to the Judges of the Supreme Court, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) each per annum, payable monthly out of the fees of his office. This amount is to be in addition to what has heretofore been appropriated as their salaries.

#### GENERAL PROVISIONS

All annual salaries shall be paid in twelve (12) equal monthly installments unless otherwise provided herein. Provided that any State employees receiving traveling expenses out of any appropriations made herein for traveling expenses, who shall file and collect witness fee and mileage claims in connection with their appearance as witnesses in any of the courts in this State, shall reimburse and refund to the General Revenue Fund of this State for such expenditures so made from these appropriations to the extent or total of the respective amounts collected under such witness fee and mileage claims.

The appropriations herein provided are to be construed as the maximum sums to be appropriated to and for the several purposes named herein, and no expenditures shall be made, nor shall any obligations be incurred, which, added to the actual expenditures, will exceed the amounts herein appropriated for any of the purposes named. Provided that the appropriations made herein for departmental maintenance and miscellaneous items for the Departments of the State Government may be used as a contingent fund for departmental maintenance and miscellaneous items, except, however, that this provision shall not apply to any item where its expenditure is specially governed by the Statutes, and that no salaries or wages shall be paid out of any amounts transferred from other items to a contingent expense item.

The amounts appropriated in this Act are intended to cover and shall cover the entire cost of the respective items, the same shall not be supplemented from any other source whatever, and no portion of the money appropriated for any particular item shall be used or expended for any other item than that for which such appropriation is made; and no salary for which an appropriation is made herein shall be paid to any person unless such person actually discharges the duties of the position for which such appropriation is made; and no portion of

the appropriation for one position shall be paid to any person holding any position other than that for which such appropriations are made.

The amounts appropriated herein for the itemized and designated official positions shall be the total amounts to be received by said officer or employee and it is expressly prohibited that any salary shall be supplemented from any local fund or funds or from any transfer of other funds, it being intended that the amount so appropriated herein shall be the maximum amount to be received by said employee. Any employee who knowingly receives a greater amount of compensation than appropriated herein shall be immediately discharged; the head of any Department or any official of the State of Texas who knowingly authorizes any compensation in excess of the amounts allowed herein shall also be discharged from his position.

Provided, that the head of each Department shall keep a record of the absences of the various employees, the reasons therefor, whether from sickness, vacation or on leave of absence and that the record of such absences be incorporated in the report made annually by the head of said Department.

Provided, further, that it shall be the duty of the head of any Department to transfer an employee of his office to any desk or place within his Department when necessary to perform the duties of the Department and for proper dispatch of business.

Provided, however, that the head of any Department of State Government, or any Board or Commission of State Government may use part time employees to fill any position provided for in this Act at a salary not to exceed more than one-half the amount appropriated for such position for half-time work.

Department employees herein provided for shall, without deduction in salary, be entitled to receive not exceeding twelve (12) days vacation, exclusive of Sundays and legal holidays, on which State offices are closed, for each State fiscal year, such vacation period to be mutually agreed upon by the head of each Department with his employees; provided that employees belonging to the Texas National Guard may have their vacation at the time of the meeting of the annual encampment.

Provided, further, that no employees for whom a salary is herein appropriated, shall receive compensation while on vacation unless he or she has been an employee of the particular Department of which request is made for not less than six (6) calendar months.

Provided, that all Departments shall be allowed to close at 4:00 o'clock P. M. on Saturdays; and provided further that the head of any Department shall be authorized to excuse a part of the employees of such Department at noon on Saturdays, and that such Saturday afternoons shall not be construed to be a part of the twelve (12) days vacation provided for above.

The State Comptroller shall not pay, and no State officer or employee of any of the Department or other agencies of the

Government shall include in his traveling expense account, any amounts for meals and/or lodging incurred within the city or town where officer or such employee is stationed. Such employees as are stationed away from their main office or headquarters who are not allowed traveling expenses where so stationed, shall be allowed such expenses when called to their main office.

No traveling expenses shall be incurred by any State official or employee of any of the Departments, or other agencies of the Government, outside of the boundaries of the State of Texas, and no such expenses shall be paid from State appropriations or out of any local or auxiliary funds by the State Comptroller and/or other disbursing officer or employee of any agency of the Government, until and unless a written statement signed by the State Comptroller and the State Board of Control authorizing in advance said trips to be made shall first have been filed with the State Comptroller and a signed duplicate thereof filed with the disbursing officer of such respective agency of the Government. This provision shall not apply to trips to Washington, D. C., made by the Attorney General's Department, whose business before the United States Supreme Court and certain Federal Commissions is mandatory, nor to members or employees of the Railroad Commission attending hearings, conferences, or oral arguments held in other States or Washington, D. C., and involving rates and/or transportation matters.

It is the intention of the Legislature hereby not to require advance permission of legally authorized out-of-the-State trips of peace officers in the extradition and return of fugitives from justice and escaped prisoners except as is already provided by law.

All employees covered under this bill who are traveling at the expense of the State are hereby limited to the following amounts for meals and lodging; for meals not exceeding One Dollar and Sixty Cents (\$1.60) per day, for lodging not exceeding Two Dollars (\$2.00) per night, it being specially provided that the employee shall obtain receipts for all amounts expended and shall file said receipts with their expense accounts, which expense accounts must be duly itemized and sworn to; and the State Comptroller is hereby expressly prohibited from paying any expense accounts which are not itemized and sworn to and accompanied by receipts as herein provided. It shall be the duty of the Board of Control of this State to furnish to all employees of the State covered in this bill necessary receipt forms, provided the provision of this Act shall not apply to members of Boards and Commissions who do not receive an annual or monthly salary, nor to the Executive Board or the heads of State Departments.

The State Board of Control is hereby authorized and directed to purchase Railroad Scrip Books for the use of the various Departments covered herein to be used by them in the purchase

of railroad transportation and to charge the amount of such scrip books to the appropriations made for such Departments. The head of each of the Departments covered herein shall immediately confer with and report to the State Board of Control the members of their respective Departments who are using as much as Seventy-two Dollars (\$72.00), or more per year for railroad transportation.

The following rules shall be observed by all State officers and employees in rendering their expense accounts before any expense account shall be paid from appropriations herein made for "Traveling expenses."

1. There must be a concise statement of the duties performed and the points from which the employee travels, the hour of arrival and departure from the designated post of duty and all other towns visited and the object of such visit and of the specific expenses incurred.

2. The name of hotel, restaurant, boarding or rooming house at which meals and lodging are procured shall be given in every case.

3. Fees, as tips to waiters on dining cars, or at hotels or restaurants shall not be approved.

It is expressly provided that the provisions of this Act with reference to traveling expenses shall not apply to the Governor and Lieutenant Governor of this State.

Provided that a report shall be made annually by each of said Departments or agencies and filed before November the first after the close of the fiscal year, with the Comptroller, and a copy thereof filed with the State Board of Control, giving an itemized statement of all moneys paid out and showing what particular appropriation or fund said money was taken from; including an itemized statement of all purchases or contracts which have been made and remain unpaid at the close of the fiscal year, together with a statement showing the full amount of money taken in from all sources during the year. Said report shall show what disposition was made of such fund or funds, and if any surplus remains on hand at the end of any fiscal year it shall be stated in said report. Said report also shall list the amount expended from regular appropriations or any other funds, for traveling expenses by each employee or any other person connected with such Department or traveling under its direction, including the hire of automobiles privately owned by such employees, together with the rate of payment for the use of such privately owned automobile; the amounts expended for the purchase of automobiles, and all expenses for gasoline, oil, repairs, parts and supplies for all automobiles owned by such Departments or agencies; and the total amount expended by such Department or agency for all traveling expenses. Provided, further, that such reports shall be filed quarterly if the Board of Control hereafter determines that necessity exists for more frequent filing of such reports.

Provided, that no Department included in this Act shall use

any of the means or funds appropriated to such Department, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of sending out literature, propaganda, letters or bulletins, or any other matter, printed or written or that will influence, or tend to influence in any way the election of any candidate for office or the passage or repeal of any law or appropriation affecting any Department included in this bill; and provided, further, that no stenographer or clerk whose salary is paid from public funds or who is employed in any way in any Department included in this Act, shall in any way, be used or employed in preparation of or mailing out of, or in any way handling such literature, propaganda, letters or bulletins, or any other matter, printed or written that will influence, or tend to influence, in any way the election of any candidate for office or the passage or repeal of any law or appropriation affecting any Department included in this Act, and no such work shall be done or performed in any of the offices or rooms of the Capitol or other State buildings, nor shall any long distance telephone calls or telegrams be paid out of this fund.

Provided that none of the moneys appropriated herein for traveling expenses, automobile hire, and/or automobile repairs, shall be spent for the washing and/or polishing of automobiles.

Provided, that of the money appropriated herein for stamps none shall be spent except on vouchers made payable to a United States Post Office and shall be endorsed by such Postmaster.

All printing and stationery shall be purchased through the Board of Control and shall be confined to such articles and qualities as selected and contracted for by the Board, except certain printing provided by law to be done by several of the State agencies. No part of the herein appropriated amounts shall be used for the purchase of embossed or engraved printing and stationery except for the Governor's office.

Provided, further, that none of the foregoing appropriations for salaries shall be paid or warrants therefor issued by the State Comptroller to any employee until the employee shall have filed with the head and/or disbursing officer of such respective Department or agency an affidavit showing his or her marital status, and if married, whether or not the spouse and/or any single children under twenty-one (21) years of age of such employee are also employed by the State Government, and the name of the institution, school, Department, Appellate Court, or other State agency where such spouse or child is employed, together with the name of such spouse or child; the head or disbursing officer of such Department or agency, in addition to the statutory affidavit now required to be attached to all pay rolls, shall also set forth in the pay roll affidavit that all of his employees have made the required affidavit and also set forth the facts of any of said relationship employment as disclosed by said employees' affidavits, together with the name of the institution, school, Department, Appellate Court,

or other State agency where such spouse or child is employed, and if such relationship employment does not exist, then said affidavit shall so state; and the head and/or disbursing officer of the Department or agency and the State Comptroller shall not approve for payment or issue warrants or checks for salaries to or for more than one of any of the above mentioned members of the same family which may now or hereafter be employed by any eleemosynary institution, department, school, appellate court, or other agency of the State Government. Affidavits of present employees shall be made by them and filed with the heads of Departments within ten days before the first day of each fiscal year, and persons thereafter employed shall file such affidavits before they begin work; all of said affidavits shall be preserved by the heads of Departments or agencies for which appropriations are herein made for proper inspection for at least two years after their dates; said employees' affidavits shall be conclusive evidence of the departmental head's right to approve the pay rolls, and the pay roll affidavit of the head of the Department or disbursing officer shall be conclusive evidence to the State Comptroller of his right to issue the warrants. None of these provisions shall apply to employees whose above mentioned relatives may be on the State pay roll as district judges, district attorneys, highway maintenance laborers, employees on any State contracts where bids were received, and vocational or other teachers in the public free schools. In the event the Comptroller shall hold up issuance or delivery of any warrant by reason of these provisions he shall notify the agency or agencies affected of his action and such warrants shall not be issued or delivered until the provisions have been complied with to the satisfaction of the State Comptroller; and in the event the head or heads of said Departments or agencies so employing said relatives, or said relatives themselves, cannot agree on which affected employee is to be retained on the State's pay roll then the State Comptroller shall issue and deliver the warrant to the affected employee who has been longer continuously employed in the State's service and refuse to issue and deliver the warrant to the other affected employee who has been continuously employed in the State's service for a shorter period of time than the other affected relative.

Providing that all porters for use in the Capitol Building and in the State Departments located within the City of Austin shall be under the direct supervision of the State Board of Control and the said Board of Control shall be charged with the duty of supervising the cleaning and maintenance of the Capitol Building and such other State Departments located within the City of Austin.

No money herein appropriated shall be spent for the purchase of a passenger car in excess of Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) including the trade-in value of a used motor car.

It is further provided that any contingent funds herein

appropriated, and any funds appropriated for printing may be used under the direction of any Department for which any such appropriation is made for the publication and distribution of any notices, pamphlets, booklets, rules, regulations and other matters of public interest; provided that a charge may be made and collected for such publications and notices, as will reasonably reimburse such fund for all actual expense in connection therewith.

It is hereby provided that none of the moneys herein appropriated shall be paid to any person who is not a citizen of the United States.

SEC. 1-a. If any section, subsection or provision of this Act is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such holding shall not affect the constitutionality or validity of any other provision or part of this Act.

SEC. 2. The fact that the above and foregoing is one of the regular appropriation bills for the support and maintenance of the State government for the two-year period beginning September 1, 1933, and ending August 31, 1935, and in the interest of good public policy should be passed as speedily as possible, creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the Constitutional Rule requiring bills to be read on three several days be suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted.
