

JOHNSON COUNTY JUVENILE BOARD—COMPENSATION

CHAPTER 176

H. B. No. 908

An Act relating to the compensation of members of the Johnson County Juvenile Board.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. Section 2, Chapter 116, Acts of the 62nd Legislature, Regular Session, 1971 (Article 5139CCC, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended²⁵ to read as follows:

Sec. 2. As compensation for the additional duties imposed upon them, the county and district judges who are members of the board shall each be allowed additional compensation payable in 12 equal monthly installments out of the general fund or any other available fund of Johnson County. The compensation shall be set by the Commissioners Court of Johnson County.

Sec. 2. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each house be suspended, and this rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted.

Passed by the House on March 29, 1979: Yeas 130, Nays 0, 2 present, not voting; passed by the Senate on May 3, 1979: Yeas 31, Nays 0. Approved May 15, 1979. Effective May 15, 1979.

ARMADILLO OR SKUNK—SALE—CRIMES AND OFFENSES

CHAPTER 177

H. B. No. 952

An Act relating to the sale of certain wild animals; providing a penalty.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 63, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended by adding²⁶ Section 63.103 to read as follows:

Sec. 63.103. Sale of Certain Live Animals

(a) No person may sell or possess for the purpose of sale in this state a living armadillo or skunk.

(b) This section does not apply to:

(1) the sale of an animal by or to a zoo;
