Relating to the boundaries of the Real-Edwards Conservation and Reclamation District.

BACKGROUND

Currently, Real and Edwards Counties have a Water Conservation and Reclamation District which is comprised of Real County and parts of Edwards County. Many feel that all of Edwards County should be included in the district.

PURPOSE

As proposed, S.B. 1690 amends existing law to expand the boundaries of the Real-Edwards Conservation and Reclamation District to include all of Edwards County.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

It is the committee's opinion that this bill does not grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Section 1, Chapter 341, Acts of the 56th Legislature, Regular Session, 1959, to delete language describing the boundaries of the Real-Edwards Conservation and Reclamation District (district), and adding Subsections (b) and (c), as follows:

(b) Provides that the boundaries of the district are coterminous with the boundaries of the counties of Edwards and Real.

(c) Provides that the legislature finds that the territory and taxable property within the district boundaries provided by Subsection (b) of this section will be benefited by the works and improvements of the district.

SECTION 2. Effective date: September 1, 1989.

SECTION 3. Emergency clause.
