

PROCLAMATION


The Governor of Texas.

Whereas, Senate Bill No. 238, being an act making appropriations for registered and estimated deficiencies for the State Government from March 1st, 1893 to February 28th, 1895, and for previous years, was not received in the Executive Office until 11.05 a.m. on the 30th day of April, 1895, too late for the objections thereto to be considered and returned to the Legislature, which adjourned at noon on that day,


Now, therefore, I. C. A. Culberson, Governor of the State of Texas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of this State, hereby approve said bill, with the exception of the following items which are objected to and disapproved:

1. The item of \$600.00, an alleged balance due Austin Water Light and Power Company. Upon careful inquiry this item is believed to be an unjust charge against the State.
2. The two items of \$25.00 each to M. S. Skinner & Co. and J. B. Winkler for time their place of business was closed by injunction by the State. It is a dangerous precedent for the State to pay unliquidated damages. If the principle should obtain generally the payment of damages by the State for wrongful imprisonment would easily follow.
