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CHAPTER 6.

DEPARTMENTAL APPROPRIATION BILL.

S. B. No. 427.]

An Act making appropriations for the support and maintenance of the executive and administrative departments and agencies of the State Government for the two-year period beginning September 1, 1939, and ending August 31, 1941, and for other purposes; and declaring it unlawful for persons employed in the several departments to engage in political campaigns relating to election or reelection of any candidate or candidates for the head of such department and any public office and prescribing procedure for removal of such employees; and making it unlawful to use any State-owned automobile in connection with any campaign relating to any measures in which the particular department by which the employee is directly interested and/or in behalf of the election or reelection of any person as the head of such department; and prescribing procedure and penalties for violation of this Act; and prescribing certain other regulations and restrictions in respect to the appropriations made herein, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas:*

SECTION 1. That the several sums of money herein specified or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated or out of special funds as may be shown, for the support and maintenance of the several departments and agencies of the State Government for the two-year period beginning September 1, 1939, and ending August 31, 1941.

Subject to the limitations set forth in the provisions appearing at the end of this Act, there is hereby appropriated to the State Board of Control for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1940 and August 31, 1941 all fees and receipts collected by said Board in connection with inviting bids and furnishing proposals on contracts and purchases to be awarded by the Board of Control, together with any balances on hand at the end of any fiscal year from such receipts, to be deposited in the State Treasury and used or paid out as other State funds to defray all necessary salaries, postage, maintenance and contingent expenses in connection with making and furnishing said proposals and services, provided, however, that no salaries or other expenses can be paid out of this fund except those which are itemized and designated to be paid out of this fund.

It is further provided that one-half of the appropriation items for full-time watchmen, yardmen, and porters, and all items for full-time elevator operators in the State Board of Control appropriations may each be converted into part-time positions.

## SPECIAL LAWS.

All fees received under the provisions of Article 4742 shall be deposited in the State Treasury and properly disposed as provided by law. All or so much thereof as may be necessary are hereby appropriated for salaries, maintenance, travel and contingent expenses necessary for administering the provisions of Articles 4740, 4741, and 4742 of the Revised Civil Statutes, and by amendments thereto, during each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1940 and August 31, 1941.

There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$15,000.00 for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1940 and August 31, 1941, for the use and benefit of the Board of Insurance Commissioners in the enforcement of House Bill 249, Acts, 46th Legislature, Regular Session, known as the Conservator Act. This appropriation is to be regarded as a revolving Fund and, in order to reimburse the General Revenue Fund because of any withdrawals therefrom on account of said appropriation, it shall be the duty of the Board of Insurance Commissioners to deposit in the State Treasury, out of assets recovered under the terms of House Bill 249, Acts, 46th Legislature, Regular Session, if and when recovered, such sums of money as are sufficient to reimburse the General Revenue Fund because of such withdrawals.

(1) The appropriations herein provided for salaries and maintenance of the Workmen's Compensation Department of the Casualty Insurance Division shall be paid out of the revenues obtained from the three-fifths of one per cent tax collected on gross premiums on Workmen's Compensation Insurance as provided for in House Bill 471, enacted by the Regular Session of the 45th Legislature.

(2) The appropriations herein provided for salaries and maintenance of the Motor Vehicle Insurance Department of the Casualty Insurance Division shall be paid out of the revenue obtained from the one-fifth of one per cent tax on gross premiums on Motor Vehicle Insurance as provided for in Senate Bill 77, enacted by the Regular Session of the 45th Legislature.

(3) Provided that the foregoing appropriations for the Life Division (except the appropriations for the Examining Division and the Licensing Division which have hereinabove been provided for) shall be paid out of the General Revenue Fund.

(4) Provided that the foregoing appropriations for the Fire Division shall be paid out of revenues obtained from tax on gross premiums of insurance companies in accordance with existing laws, except the foregoing appropriations for Fire Escape Inspectors and their expenses, which shall be paid out of the General Revenue Fund.

For the purpose of reprinting the Texas General Basis Schedules of fire and windstorm insurance rates as provided in Article 4882 of the Revised Civil Statutes, and other matters incident thereto, there is hereby appropriated for the fiscal years ending August 31, 1940 and August 31, 1941, so much of the assessments collected under Article 4902, and any balances remaining in the Fire Insurance Division Fund at the end of any fiscal year, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for carrying out the laws of this State with regard to these schedules.

Available School Fund Aid and Textbook Administration.

For the purposes provided by law, there are appropriated for biennium ending August 31, 1941, to the State Board of Education all income to, and any balance in, the Available School Fund and the State Textbook Fund, except as otherwise appropriated by this Legislature, to be expended and distributed in accordance with the laws of this State; provided that textbooks may be purchased only from funds arising from the State ad valorem school tax.

It is hereby provided that any amount expended for Textbook Administration, including new textbooks, rebinding, and any other expenses connected therewith, shall be paid out of the State Textbook Fund.

It is further provided that the amounts to be expended for new textbooks and rebinding books shall be as fixed by the State Board of Education; provided however, that no employees, in addition to those listed and itemized above, shall be employed.

All employees in the Textbook Division of the Education Department shall be appointed or removed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction subject to the approval of the State Board of Education.

There is hereby appropriated out of the State Highway Fund a sufficient amount for the purpose of reimbursing the State Prison Board for the cost of manufacturing automobile license plates, as provided by House Bill 459, Chapter 178, General Laws of the Regular Session of the 43rd Legislature. It is expressly provided that the State Prison Board shall prepare a statement of complete costs which shall be audited by the State Auditor before a price for the license plates is fixed by the Board of Control and that the audited statement provided for herein shall serve as the basis for the price charged the State Highway Department.

There is hereby appropriated out of the State Highway Fund for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1940 and August 31, 1941, the sums of \$50,000.00 which amount shall be transferred from the State Highway Fund to the General Fund of the State of Texas, in order that the State Highway Fund will bear its just part of the expense incurred by other State Departments in serving the Highway Department, and also to cover the cost of furnishing heat, water and power to the State Highway Department. The State Comptroller and the State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to transfer the amounts herein appropriated from the State Highway Fund to the General Revenue Fund either annually or semi-annually at any time during each of the said fiscal years.

Provided, that the above and foregoing amounts appropriated herein for the State Highway Department and for services rendered by other Agencies of the State Government to the Highway Department, shall be paid out of the State Highway Fund upon warrants issued by the State Comptroller, as provided by Chapter 1, Title 116, Revised Civil Statutes, 1925, and amendments thereto; provided further that all funds or balances of funds on hand September 1, 1939, and all funds coming into the

State Highway Fund, and derived from registration fees or from other sources, after deducting the total of the specific appropriations herein made, are hereby appropriated to the State Highway Department for the establishment of a system of State Highways and the construction and maintenance thereof, as contemplated and set forth in said Chapter 1, Title 116, and Chapter 186, General Laws of the Regular Session of the 39th Legislature, and amendments thereto.

The State Highway Commission is hereby expressly authorized to purchase, through the Board of Control, any additional equipment, and motor vehicles necessary in the opinion of the State Highway Department, provided, however, that no moneys herein appropriated shall be spent for the purchase of a passenger car in excess of \$750.00, including the trade-in value of a used car, and this limited price shall cover a car equipped with bumpers and extra rim or wheel, but not an extra casing or tube.

Provided that no State Highway Funds shall be used or expended in the payment of full or partial salaries, or to participate in the supplementing of any salaries for any kind of work done for, by or under the supervision or direction of the State Highway Department, other than those amounts specifically provided in the above appropriations, where the total to be paid such additional respective employees from Federal, State, County, or other Funds, exceeds the respective amount below listed, to-wit: file clerks, and typists at not exceeding \$1,200.00 each per year; bookkeepers at not exceeding \$2,100.00 each per year; registration, warrant, voucher, comptometer or tabulating clerks, stenographers \$1,350.00 each per year; those performing secretarial duties at not exceeding \$1,500.00 each per year; resident engineers and district engineers at an average salary of not to exceed \$3,672.00 each per year, none to exceed \$4,896.00 per year; assistant district engineers, at not exceeding \$3,600.00 per year; any other additional positions not herein listed in the above itemized appropriations at not exceeding the amounts specifically appropriated therein for such similar positions.

Provided, further, that the authorization that permits State Departments to excuse one-half of their employees at noon on Saturday is modified for the State Highway Department to provide that said Department may set its closing time on Saturday and permit all employees to leave, provided the number of hours' work during the week shall be the same as provided in the General Appropriation Bill. This provision being granted inasmuch as the Highway Department cannot function efficiently with only half of the employees present.

Provided that all printing and stationery shall be purchased through the Board of Control and shall be confined to such articles and qualities as selected and contracted for by the Board of Control.

The Highway Department of the State of Texas is specifically

authorized to supervise beautification of the State Highways in the State of Texas and provide necessary assistance therefor.

It is expressly provided herein that the State Highway Department is authorized to furnish to the Adjutant General's Department trucks for transporting men and material for the purpose of erecting air markers along State Highways.

The State Highway Department is expressly authorized to grant to day laborers twelve (12) days vacation with full pay to such laborers who have worked for said State Highway Department for over twelve (12) months.

The Highway Commission is hereby vested with the authority to conduct and/or supervise the registration of motor vehicles in counties wherein the Commission has reason to believe and for cause shown that the laws regulating the registration of such motor vehicles is being violated.

There is hereby further appropriated under and by virtue of the Act of the Forty-fifth Legislature, Regular Session, creating a system of Compensation Insurance for employees of the State Highway Department, sufficient highway funds to carry out the terms and provisions of said Act, and the State Highway Department is hereby expressly authorized to employ a sufficient number of employees necessary to carry out the terms and provisions of said Act, but in no event shall salaries paid be in excess of the amount paid for the same or similar positions in any department of the State Government.

For the purpose of printing forms, cost of plates, postage and other necessary expenses in carrying out the provisions of House Bill 794, Regular Session, 46th Legislature, there is hereby appropriated to, the Highway Department out of the General Revenue Fund, the sum of \$250.00 each year of the biennium ending August 31, 1941. Any unexpended balance at the end of any fiscal year shall revert to the General Revenue Fund.

Provided that all moneys paid into the State Treasury by the State Library from refunds for lost or badly damaged books, and all moneys for pre-payment for postage, drayage, or transportation are hereby appropriated for the State Library for books, postage, express, and freight for the State Library.

Subject to the limitations set forth in the provision appearing at the end of this Act, all appropriations herein made for the Texas Liquor Control Board shall be paid out of proceeds derived from the sale of alcoholic beverage stamps before such proceeds are allocated to respective funds required by law, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefrom for each of the fiscal years ending August 31, 1940, and August 31, 1941.

It is further provided that receipts from the sale of confiscated beverages and equipment as provided in the Texas Liquor Control Act shall be available for defraying expenses as stipulated in said Act, and the same are hereby appropriated for said purposes.

Provided that no other provisions of this Act shall prevent payment by the State of Texas of salaries and expenses incurred by representatives of the Texas Liquor Control Board in attendance on Federal Grand Jury proceedings and who may be called as witnesses in the trial of cases in Federal Courts involving offenses complained of against Federal Liquor Regulatory Laws or Federal Liquor Revenue Laws; it further being provided that any fees collected by such representatives from the Federal Gov-

ernment shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the Traveling Expense Fund included herein.

All income to the Texas Old Age Assistance Fund, as transferred to the State Department of Public Welfare Fund by Senate Bill 36, Acts, 46th Legislature, Regular Session, together with any balances on hand at the end of a prior fiscal year, is hereby appropriated for each of fiscal years ending August 31, 1940 and August 31, 1941 to the State Department of Public Welfare for Old Age Assistance and for salaries, equipment, supplies, travel, maintenance, and contingent expenses necessary in the extension of said Old Age Assistance and in administering all the duties required of said Department by the Old Age Assistance Laws, and for payment of interest-bearing warrants or State Treasury Certificates exchanged therefor, together with

interest thereon, outstanding on August 31, 1939 that were issued against the Texas Old Age Assistance Fund under the provisions of House Bill 37, Acts of the 44th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, and under the provisions of House Bill 179, Acts of the 46th Legislature, Regular Session, in accordance with schedule of payments as authorized and directed in House Bill 179 and House Bill 1046, Acts, Regular Session, 46th Legislature, and in accordance with appropriations made for payment of such warrants or certificates in House Bill 179 and House Bill 1046, Acts, Regular Session, 46th Legislature; provided, that for the administration of the Old Age Assistance Laws the administrative expenses out of State funds for the biennium shall never exceed five per cent of the total amount expended for assistance out of all funds, State and Federal. Provided, further, that in addition to this appropriation out of State funds for administrative expenses for the biennium, the Department is authorized to accept from the Federal Social Security Board any funds that may be allocated by said Board to the Department for administrative expenses, and said Department can use such Federal funds allocated for administrative expenses in addition to funds appropriated for those purposes out of State funds. Provided, further, that aid and assistance shall be granted and extended in the manner provided by law. In the event the above total itemized appropriations out of State funds for administration are less than five per cent of the total expenditures for assistance out of all funds, State and Federal, and a necessity therefor exists, the Department is authorized to hire additional employees; provided, in all events the total expenditures out of State funds for administration shall not exceed five per cent of the total expenditures for assistance out of all funds, State and Federal, and that no additional employees used shall be paid larger salaries than are above fixed for employees rendering similar services; provided, that this appropriation out of the Old Age Assistance Fund, as transferred to the State Department of Public Welfare Fund by S. B. 36, Acts, 46th Legislature, Regular Session, shall be in effect during the biennium ending August 31, 1941. Provided, that in the event for any reason Federal participation in payment of grants of Old Age Assistance and administrative expenses therefor is withdrawn at any time or has been withdrawn at the time this appropriation Act takes effect, the State Department of Public Welfare out of any monies in the Old Age Assistance Fund, as transferred to the State Department of Public Welfare Fund by S. B. 36, Acts, 46th Legislature, Regular Session, can expend for administrative expenses monies up to and not to exceed ten per cent of all funds expended, both State and Federal, for aid and assistance for the biennium ending August 31, 1941, and in such instance all provisions in this Act limiting such expenditures for administrative expenses to five per cent of monies expended for aid and assistance are superseded by this provision, and to effect this provision any and all limitations that might have heretofore been placed on such expenditures

Subject to the limitations set forth in the provisions appearing at the end of this Act, all fees collected by virtue of Chapter 466, Acts of the Second Called Session of the 44th Legislature, or any amendments thereto, and deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the Operator's and Chauffeur's License Fund, are hereby appropriated to the Driver's License Division for the purpose of paying the itemized appropriations listed there-

under for each of the years ending August 31, 1940 and August 31, 1941; provided, however, that all moneys remaining in said fund at the end of the fiscal year ending August 31, 1941 shall revert to the General Fund and shall, subject to the limitations set forth in the provisions appearing at the end of this Act, be applied toward the payment of salaries and other expenses of the Department of Public Safety; provided, however, that all payments to Tax Collectors of the several counties, in accordance with the provisions of Senate Bill 15, Chapter 46, page 1785, General Laws, Second Called Session of the 44th Legislature, as amended by House Bill 16, Regular Session of the 45th Legislature, particular reference being made to Section 7 of said bill, shall be made out of said fund before any excess reverts to said General Fund.

For the purpose of paying all necessary expenses in connection with the administration of House Bill 407, the Certificate of Title Act, as passed by the Regular Session, 46th Legislature, including the payment of all clerical help and all additional employees necessary; the cost of printing, producing and distributing all required forms; postage, Cashiers' Checks, express and all other necessary equipment, there is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$75,000.00 or as much thereof as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending August 31, 1940; and for the purpose of paying the expenses as hereinabove set out in the administration of the provisions of House Bill 407 as passed by the Regular Session of the 46th Legislature, there is hereby appropriated a sum not in excess of the total amount of fees collected under the provisions of the Act during the fiscal year ending August 31, 1940, for the fiscal year ending August 31, 1941, provided, however, that such sum shall in no event exceed the amount of \$65,000.00; provided, however, that no salaries are to be paid out of the sums hereby appropriated in excess of any salaries paid by the State of Texas for like or similar services as set forth in this bill.

SEC. 2. Annual Reports. (a) A report shall be made annually by each of said departments or agencies and filed before November the first after the close of the fiscal year, with the Comptroller, and a copy thereof filed with the State Board of Control, giving an itemized statement of all moneys paid out and showing what particular appropriation or funds said moneys were taken from; including an itemized statement of all purchases or contracts which have been made and remain unpaid at the close of the fiscal year, together with a statement showing the full amount of money taken in from all sources during the year. Said reports shall show what disposition was made of such fund or funds, and if any surplus remains on hand at the end of any fiscal year, it shall be stated in said report. Said report also

shall list the amount expended from regular appropriations or any other fund, for traveling expenses, including the hire of automobiles privately owned, together with the rate of payment for the use of such privately owned automobiles; the amounts expended for the purchase of automobiles and all expenses for gasoline, oil, repairs, parts, and supplies for all automobiles owned by such departments or agencies; and the total amount expended by such department or agency for all traveling expenses.

(b) The head of each department shall keep a record of the absences of the various employees, the reason therefor, whether from sickness, vacation, or on leave of absence, and incorporate this information in the department's annual report.

Printing and Stationery. (a) All printing and stationery shall be purchased through the Board of Control and shall be confined to such articles and qualities as selected and contracted for by the Board, except certain printing provided by law to be done by several State agencies. No part of the herein appropriated amounts shall be used for the purchase of embossed or engraved printing and stationery except for the Governor's office.

(b) Any contingent funds herein appropriated, and any funds appropriated for printing, may be used under the direction of any Department for which any such appropriation is made for the publication and distribution of any notices, pamphlet, booklets, rules, regulations, and other matters of public interest; provided that a charge may be made and collected for such publications and notices which will reasonably reimburse such funds for such actual expense.

Postage Stamps. None of the money appropriated herein for postage stamps shall be spent except on vouchers made payable to a United States Post Office and the warrant or check shall be endorsed by the Postmaster from whom the purchase is made.

State Owned Photostat Machines. These machines and photostat supplies shall not be used for private purposes. Official instruments and documents shall not be photostated except upon signed orders from the heads of departments, or an employee designated in writing by the heads of departments, and such designations filed with the Board of Control. The Board of Control shall furnish requisition forms containing such provisions as the Board deems necessary to protect the public interests, to be prepared and used by the several departments in ordering photostatic copies made. Operators of such machines shall make no copies except upon presentation of signed requisitions, and said requisitions shall be filed and an annual report made to the Board of Control showing the number of copies made for each State Department, including the Department having supervision of the machine. In the event no existing law fixes the price at which copies for private use shall be sold by a department, it is hereby provided that such department shall collect for any copies sold at the same rate charged by the Secretary of State. The departments having such machines will also do work for such

other State Departments as shall be designated by the Board of Control.

**Rental on Machines and Equipment.** None of the moneys herein appropriated shall be used for the rental of office machines or any equipment of any kind without first having presented a requisition for the rental thereof to the Board of Control and secured said Board's written approval thereof, and the State Comptroller or any local disbursing officer shall not issue warrants or checks in payment of said rental without said Board's written approval. No agency of the government or any State employee shall permit any seller who has bid on new machines or new equipment of any kind to deliver any used or rented equipment in fulfillment of such order, even though said equipment has been used by the agency so desiring to purchase.

**Office Hours of State Departments.** Excepting herefrom Sundays and State legal holidays, office hours of State Departments shall be from 8 o'clock A. M. to 5 o'clock P. M., with one hour off at noon; provided however that all departments shall be allowed to close at 4 o'clock P. M. on Saturdays; and provided further that the head of any department shall be authorized to excuse a part of the employees of such department at noon on Saturdays, and that such Saturday afternoons shall not be construed to be a part of the twelve days' vacation provided for below.

**Vacation Allowance.** Department employees shall, without deduction in salary, receive not exceeding twelve days' vacation, exclusive of Sundays and legal holidays, on which State offices are closed, for each State fiscal year, such vacation period to be mutually agreed upon by the head of each department with his employees, provided, that employees belonging to the Texas National Guard may have their vacation at the time of the meeting of the annual encampment. Provided, that no employee for whom a salary is hereby appropriated, shall receive compensation while on vacation unless he or she has been an employee of the department for not less than six calendar months preceding the vacation period.

**Porters.** It is specifically provided that all appropriations for porters as provided in this Act are made with the distinct understanding that it is the will of the Legislature that the said porters are to be under the direct supervision of the State Board of Control, irrespective of the fact that the items covering appropriations for the several porters in this Act may be carried as items under the appropriations of the various departments. It is the further will and intention of the Legislature that the several items for janitorial supplies, irrespective of name, shall be judiciously used under the direct supervision of the Board of Control to the end that all State property covered in this Act shall be adequately and properly preserved and cared for, and that all fire hazards shall be reduced and kept to the lowest possible minimum at all times. To that end the State Board of Control is hereby specifically and directly authorized and directed to notify in writing the heads of the respective departments of

any dereliction of duty, either of omission or commission, on the part of any porter as provided in this Act, and said departmental heads shall have said porter comply with the orders concerning the improvement of sanitary conditions and the removal of fire hazards; and if said porter fails or refuses to act in compliance with the orders of the Board of Control concerning said matters within three days after notification, the State Board of Control is hereby authorized and directed to file a written notice with the State Comptroller that said porter has failed or refused to comply with the orders of the Board of Control, and the State Comptroller thereupon shall not issue a warrant for the salary of said porter for any services rendered after the date of presentation of the Board of Control's notice to the State Comptroller. The heads of said departments shall immediately select another person of their own choice to fill the position of the porter thus removed from the payroll, and if the other or any successive porter shall fail to comply with the orders of the Board of Control, the State Comptroller shall also refuse to pay him further compensation in like manner.

No porter dropped from the departmental payrolls as provided herein shall be eligible to be reemployed in a similar capacity for any State department or State Court for a period of at least six months.

**United States Funds and Aid.** The proper officer or officers of any State Departments, bureaus, or divisions of State agencies are hereby authorized to make application for and accept any gifts, grants, or allotments of funds from the United States Government to be used on State cooperative and other Federal projects and programs in Texas, including construction of public buildings, repairs, and improvements. Any of such Federal Funds as may be deposited in the State Treasury are hereby appropriated to the specific purpose authorized by the Federal Government.

**Political Aid and Legislative Influence Prohibited.** (a) No department included in this Act shall use any of the means or funds appropriated to such department, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of telephoning, telegraphing, or sending out literature, propaganda letters, or bulletins, or any other matter, printed or written, that will influence, or tend to influence, in any manner the election of any candidate for office or the passage or defeat of any law or appropriation affecting any department included in this bill; and provided further, that no stenographer or other employee whose salary is paid from State funds may be used or employed in any manner in the preparation or mailing out, or in any manner handling such literature, propaganda letters or bulletins, or any other matter, printed or written, that will influence or tend to influence, in any way the election of any candidate for office or the passage or defeat of any law or appropriation affecting any department included in this Act, and no such work shall be done or performed in any of the offices or rooms of the Capitol or any other State building.

(b) It is hereby declared unlawful for any person employed in any capacity in any of the departments for which an appropriation is made under the terms of this Act to engage in or take part in any political campaign in relation to matters directly affecting the particular department in which the particular employee is employed, and/or concerning the election or reelection of any candidate for the head of the particular department by which such employee is employed; by "engaging in a political campaign" or "taking part in a political campaign" is meant and shall include distributing circulars, hand bills, posting pictures, handing out cards, making speeches, thereby soliciting or opposing the election of any candidate for office as the head of such department whereby the offending employee is employed.

Any such employee engaging in such inhibited and unlawful conduct, shall be subject to removal from his position and restrained from reemployment in such department for a period of one year by a judgment in the District Court of the county wherein such unlawful activity occurred. Any ten (10) or more qualified voters, residents of such county, shall have the authority to institute a suit in a District Court of such county, praying for the removal of such employee from such department, citing such employee and the head of the department, and upon final hearing the allegations of the petition being sustained, the judgment shall be to discharge the employee and restraining the head of the department from reemploying such employee for a period of one year from the date of the judgment.

It is hereby further declared unlawful for any person authorized to use a State-owned automobile in connection with any business of the State, to use such automobile in connection with any campaign in which such department is directly interested, or in behalf of the campaign for reelection of the head of any department, and/or in any other manner, time or place than when such automobile is being used in the interest of and for the purpose of carrying out departmental State business. Any person violating this Section shall upon final conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than \$50.00, nor more than \$200.00. In the event such use of such automobile is being made with the knowledge of the head of any department, having charge of such automobile, then such department head shall also be liable to punishment in a fine of not more than \$200.00. Any court of competent jurisdiction in the county where this law is violated shall have jurisdiction to try such cause.

It is hereby made the duty of every department head to furnish every employee of his department with a copy of the law set out in the preceding three paragraphs, and to take the receipt of such employee therefor. The receipts shall at all times be kept accessible for public inspection and failure of any department head to comply with this mandate shall constitute malfeasance in office, and upon judgment so adjudicating such department head shall be removed from office.

Traveling Expenses. (a) Except as to field travel expense of

the Highway Department, it is provided that no expenditure shall be made for traveling expenses by any department of this State in excess of the amount of money itemized herein for said purpose. This provision shall be applicable whether the item for traveling expenses is to be paid out of the appropriation from the general fund, from fees, receipts or special funds collected by virtue of certain laws of this State, or from other funds (exclusive of Federal funds) available for use by a department.

No traveling expenses shall be claimed, allowed, or paid unless incurred while traveling on official business of the State. Any State official or employee entitled to traveling expenses out of State appropriations herein made, who is legally or officially required to be present at the trial of any State case, shall not claim traveling expenses from the State and also from the Court wherein said case is pending. If by oversight, duplicate claims are filed for said traveling expenses and collected, then said officers or employees shall reimburse and refund to the State Treasurer an amount equal to the respective amount collected under such witness fee and mileage claim.

(b) The State Comptroller shall not pay, and no State officer or employee of any of the departments or other agencies of the Government shall include in his traveling expense account any amounts for meals and/or lodging incurred within the city or town where such officer or such employee is stationed. Such employees as are stationed away from their main office or headquarters, who are not allowed traveling expenses where so stationed, shall be allowed such expenses when called to their main office.

Where an employee uses his private car while traveling on State business, and another employee travels with him on the same or other State business, only the owner of the car shall be entitled to reimbursement for traveling expenses. This shall not preclude both employees from receiving reimbursement for board and lodging.

(c) No traveling expenses shall be incurred by any employee of any of the departments, or other agencies of the Government, outside of the boundaries of the State of Texas, except for State business directly concerning his own department or agency and no such expenses shall be paid from State appropriations or out of any local or auxiliary funds by the State Comptroller to an employee of any agency of the Government, until and unless a written statement, signed by the Attorney General, advising that the purpose of the proposed trip, in his opinion, is for said State business purposes; which written opinion shall have been filed in advance with the State Comptroller, and signed duplicate thereof filed with the disbursing officer of such respective agency of the Government. This provision shall not apply to trips to Washington, D. C. made by the Attorney General's Department, whose business before the United States Supreme Court and certain Federal Commissions is mandatory, nor to the Adjutant General when appearing in Washington, D. C., before the War Depart-

ment, nor to members or employees of the Railroad Commission attending hearings, conferences, or oral arguments held in other States or Washington, D. C., and involving rates and/or transportation matters.

Unless otherwise specifically provided by the statutes, it is provided that any officer or employee who travels on official State business and who uses his own car while so doing shall be reimbursed for the use of said car on the basis of the total mileage traveled during any calendar month at the following rate: Five (5¢) Cents a mile for the first thousand miles traveled, Four (4¢) Cents a mile for the second thousand miles traveled, and Three (3¢) Cents a mile for the third thousand miles traveled and Two (2¢) Cents a mile for each mile traveled in excess of three thousand miles. Before the Comptroller shall issue any warrant for reimbursement, the said officer or employee shall file an affidavit with the Comptroller showing the point of origin and the point of destination of his trip and the mileage actually traveled. If the Comptroller is of the opinion that said officer or employee did not take the shortest practical route to the point of destination and return, the Comptroller shall have the authority and it shall be his duty to compute the mileage of the shortest practical route between the point of origin and destination and return, and he shall issue his warrant in reimbursement therefor on the basis at the above rate.

No moneys herein appropriated shall ever be spent to pay the traveling expenses of any State employee to any type of convention within the State or without the State.

(d) It is the intention of the Legislature hereby not to require advance permission of legally authorized out-of-State trips of peace officers in the extradition and return of fugitives from justice and escaped prisoners except as is already provided by law.

(e) All employees traveling at the expense of the State are hereby limited to the amount of \$4.00 per day expenses for meals and lodging; it being specifically provided that the employee shall obtain receipts for all amounts expended for all items costing in excess of 50c each, and shall file said receipts with their expense accounts, which expense accounts must be duly itemized and sworn to; and the State Comptroller is hereby expressly prohibited from paying any expense accounts which are not itemized and sworn to and accompanied by receipts as herein provided. It shall be the duty of the Board of Control of this State to furnish to all employees of the State covered in this bill necessary forms for the printing of such receipts.

(f) The following rules shall be observed by all State employees in rendering their expense accounts before any expense account shall be paid from appropriations herein made for "traveling expenses":

(1) There must be a concise statement of the duties performed, and the points from which the employee travels from

the designated post of duty and all other towns visited and the object of such visit and of the specific expenses incurred.

(2) The name of hotel, restaurant, boarding or rooming house at which meals and lodging are procured shall be given in every case where a receipt is required under this Act.

(3) The name of the transportation agency used and the cost of the ticket purchased, together with a signed receipt for the same.

(4) Fees, as tips to waiters on dining cars, or at hotels or restaurants, shall not be paid out of State funds.

(5) Except as otherwise authorized by statute, no State employee shall receive or use any passes or other franking privileges from any transportation agency, and any employee so offending shall be immediately discharged. The fact that any transportation agency knowingly extends passes or other franking privileges to any State employee shall constitute sufficient grounds upon which the right of said transportation agency to do business in this State can be forfeited, and the Attorney General is hereby directed to institute proper proceedings to cancel said right of any transportation agency so offending.

(g) It is expressly provided that the provisions of this Act, with reference to traveling expenses, shall not apply to the Governor and Lieutenant-Governor of this State.

(h) None of the moneys appropriated herein shall be spent for the washing and/or polishing of the same automobile more than one time per calendar month.

(i) No moneys herein appropriated shall be spent for the purchase of a passenger car in excess of \$750.00, including the trade-in value of a used car, and this limited price shall cover a car equipped with bumpers and extra rim or wheel but not an extra casing and tube.

(j) Except as otherwise specifically exempted, the provisions of this Act shall also apply to department heads and members of commissions.

Salary and other Provisions. (a) All annual salaries shall be paid in twelve (12) equal monthly installments, unless otherwise provided herein.

(b) The appropriations herein provided are to be construed as the maximum sums to be appropriated to and for the several purposes named herein, and the amounts are intended to cover and shall cover the entire cost of the respective items and the same shall not be supplemented from any other source; and, except as otherwise provided, no other expenditures shall be made, nor shall any other obligations be incurred by any department of this State, provided however that nothing herein shall prevent any department head from paying less than the maximum amount set forth herein for any salaried positions.

Salary Payments. No salary for which an appropriation is made herein shall be paid to any person unless such person actually discharges assigned duties. Every month the head of each

department shall attach to the payroll for his department an affidavit, under oath, stating that the persons listed in said payroll actually performed the duties for which they were being paid. The Comptroller shall not issue warrants for the payment of salaries listed on said payroll unless this affidavit is filed with him. Each department head shall number consecutively the salaried positions in his department for which an appropriation is made herein (either out of the general revenue fund, fees, receipts, special funds or out of other funds available for use by said department) and opposite the number of the position, he shall set out the title of the position and the name of the person employed to fill the same. This statement shall be filed with the Comptroller, who shall, when issuing his warrant to any employee in payment of salary due said employee, number the warrant with the same number that is assigned to the position filled by said employee. Every department head shall notify the Comptroller in writing of any changes in personnel in his department. This provision shall not apply to seasonal help, and shall not prevent persons drawing their salary warrants during authorized vacation periods.

**Additional Employees' Compensation.** When any additional employees, other than those for which specific salary appropriations have herein been made, are employed and are to be paid out of contingent appropriations, such employees shall not be paid a larger amount than that provided in the regular appropriated salaries for similar positions in such department or agency, and in the event there are no similar positions within such department, then such additional employee shall not be paid a larger amount than that provided for similar positions in other departments or agencies. In the event laborers, skilled laborers, and mechanics cannot be obtained at the above mentioned salary scale, then the head of such department may pay for temporary employment only not exceeding the prevailing wage scale paid in the locality where the temporary service is to be rendered.

**Limitation of Payments.** Except as otherwise provided, whenever, by virtue of the provisions of this Act, items are to be paid out of fees, receipts, special funds or out of other funds available for use by a department, it is the intention of the Legislature to limit expenditures out of said fees, receipts, special funds or other available funds to the purposes and in the amounts itemized herein, and it is so provided. If, however, the amount of the fees, receipts, special or other available funds herein referred to are more than sufficient to pay the items herein designated to be paid therefrom, the department to which the said fees, receipts, special funds or other available funds are appropriated may, if necessary to adequately perform the functions of said department, use any portion of said surplus fees, receipts, special funds or other available funds; provided, however, that before doing so the head of such department shall, under oath, make application, jointly, to the Governor, the Attorney General

and the State Treasurer setting forth in detail the necessity for using such surplus fee, receipts, special funds or other available funds, and itemizing the purposes for which the same are to be used. Unless the application is approved by at least two of the three persons aforementioned, the surplus fees, receipts, special funds or other available funds shall not be expended. Any item set out in the application can be deleted by decision of a majority of the three persons aforementioned. All applications which are approved or denied must be signed by those voting to approve or deny same. Said applications, after approval or rejection, shall be filed with and retained by the State Auditor for a period of six months after the expiration of the biennium ending August 31, 1941, and shall remain open to public inspection during said period. All surplus fees, receipts, special funds, or other available funds on hand at the end of each year of the biennium shall revert to the general revenue fund of this State unless otherwise prohibited by law, or unless otherwise provided herein. No salary paid additional employees shall exceed the amount herein appropriated for similar positions. All disbursements shall be made on warrants issued by the Comptroller on the State Treasury.

**Audits.** None of the appropriations herein made shall be used for the purpose of employing any firm, corporation or person excepting persons regularly and continuously employed by the State Departments, to audit the expenditures or records of any department, board, bureau, or institution; provided, however, that if, in the judgment of the officer, officers or departments charged by law with disbursing the appropriations herein made, an audit is necessary, an application for such audit shall be made to the State Auditor requesting that such audit be made; and in the event the State Auditor shall not, in his judgment, have available sufficient funds to make the necessary audit, then the officer, officers or departments having charge of disbursing said appropriations are authorized to direct the Comptroller to transfer in lump sum and add to the appropriation for the State Auditor's office herein made the amount which in the judgment of said officer is necessary for the purpose of making said audit, and said audits shall be made from the amounts so transferred before the close of the fiscal year during which the transfer was made, and if the audit is not made during this designated period, then the money so transferred, shall revert to the department or agency from which transferred.

**Employment of Aliens Limited.** No money shall be paid out of any appropriation made herein for personal services for a longer period than ninety (90) days to any person who is not a citizen of the United States unless the person has begun naturalization proceedings.

**Prison Employees.** All guards and other prison employees shall have free medical attention and hospitalization from the prison physician and prison hospital when such employees have

been injured while in the performance of their prison system duties, as provided by House Bill 19 of the First Called Session of the 41st Legislature.

It is provided that any nurse employed by the State Health Department not receiving \$125.00 per month under this Act may have her salary supplemented from Federal funds in the sum of \$12.50 per month upon approval of the proper Federal authority.

Preparation of the Budget. In preparing the budget for the next biennium the Board of Control is directed to itemize the appropriation of each department of this State by setting out therein the position of every employee, or requested employee (except seasonal help) of said department. The Board is directed to designate, with reference to each position, whether the same is to be paid out of appropriation from the general revenue fund, from fees and/or receipts collected by virtue of the laws of this State, or from other available funds. In the event the salary of a position is to be paid jointly out of an appropriation from the general revenue fund, out of fees, receipts, special funds, or out of other available funds, the Board of Control shall indicate the portion paid or to be paid from each. No salary items shall include an appropriation for more than one employee. The Board shall follow the same procedure in itemizing other expenditures to be made by the departments of this State.

Employment of Husband and Wife Restricted. None of the foregoing appropriations for salaries shall be paid or warrants issued therefor by the State Comptroller to any employee until the employee shall have filed with the head of the department in which he or she is employed an affidavit showing his or her marital status, and if married, whether or not the spouse of such employee is also employed in one of the Departments of this State and the name of the Department where such spouse is employed, together with the name of such spouse; the head of such department, in addition to the statutory affidavit now required to be attached to all payrolls, shall also set forth in the payroll affidavit that all of his employees have made the required affidavit and also set forth the facts of any said relationship employment as disclosed by said employees' affidavits, together with the name of the department where such spouse is employed, and if such relationship employment does not exist then said affidavit shall so state, and the head of the department and the State Comptroller shall not approve for payment or issue warrants or checks for salaries to either the husband and wife where both said husband and wife are employed in the Departments of this State subject, however, to the following provisions. Affidavits of present employees shall be made and filed with the heads of departments of the State within ten days before the first day of each fiscal year, and persons thereafter employed shall file such affidavits before they begin work; all of said affidavits shall be preserved by the heads of departments for which appropriations are made for at least two years after their dates, which affidavits shall be open to public inspection;

said employees' affidavits shall be conclusive evidence of the right of the head of the department to approve the payroll, and the payroll affidavit of the head of the department shall be conclusive evidence to the State Comptroller of his right to issue the warrants. In the event the Comptroller shall hold up issuance or delivery of any warrant by reason of these provisions he shall notify the head of the Department affected of his action and such warrants shall not be issued or delivered until the provisions have been complied with to the satisfaction of the State Comptroller; and in the event the head or heads of said departments, so employing said husband and wife, or said husband and wife themselves, cannot agree on which affected employee is to be retained in the State's employ, then the State Comptroller shall issue and deliver the warrant to the affected employee who has been continuously employed in the State's service for the longer period of time, and refuse to issue and deliver the warrant to the other affected employee who has been continuously employed in the State's service for a shorter period of time than the other affected relative. The provisions herein shall apply to department heads and members of Commissions but not to the manager and matron of the Goree State Farm. The word "department" as used herein shall mean those departments named in this Act and the Soil Conservation Board and shall not apply to other agencies of this State and the employees employed thereby.

It is further provided that the foregoing provisions restricting employment of both husband and wife shall not apply to any persons who were employed and receiving compensation from the State at any time during the month of January, 1939.

It is further provided that, during any three month period, no department can expend more than one-fourth of the appropriations made herein for: (a) traveling expenses, (b) contingent expenses, (c) telephone and telegraph, (d) postage, provided that any unexpended balances from preceding quarters may be expended during subsequent quarters.

**Transfers from Special Funds:** In order that the cost of legal work and law enforcement may be equitably distributed and charged against the various administrative enforcement funds, the State Comptroller of Public Accounts and the State Treasurer shall, as soon as possible after August 31, 1940 and August 31, 1941, respectively, transfer to the General Revenue Fund of this State from the following special funds and allocated collections thereto a sufficient amount of money to pay the entire cost of legal work, and law enforcement, including salaries, rendered by the Attorney General's Department for the respective State agencies involved. The Attorney General shall, on or before August 31, 1940, and on or before August 31, 1941, submit to the State Comptroller and the State Treasurer an itemized statement under oath, setting forth the cost of legal work and law enforcement, including salaries, rendered by his Department to the agency affected. In making the allocations aforementioned the State Comptroller and the State Treasurer shall deduct

from the following funds the amounts charged against the same as certified by the Attorney General: Oil and Gas Enforcement Fund, State Highway Fund, Gas Utilities Fund, Motor Fuel Tax Enforcement Fund, Old Age Administration Fund, Securities Act Fund, Cigarette Tax Enforcement Fund, Motor Transportation Receipts, Enforcement Funds collected by Banking Commissioners, State Board of Barber Examiners, State Board of Hairdressers and Cosmetologists Fund, Enforcement Fees collected by Board of Insurance Commissioners, Enforcement Funds collected by Commissioner of Agriculture, Enforcement Funds collected by Bureau of Labor Statistics, Operators' and Chauffeurs' License Fund, proceeds derived from the sale of alcoholic beverage stamps before allocation, Special Game Fund, and other such Special Funds for which services are rendered by this Department.

The transfer of portions of special funds and allocations thereto to the General Revenue Fund, as authorized above, shall be in addition to the amounts transferred, and to be transferred, as provided in other sections of this Act, from such special funds and the allocated collections thereto for the purpose of paying the cost of governmental services rendered by State Departments, supported from the General Revenue Fund, to the department to which said special funds are appropriated.

It is specifically provided that with the exception of the Telegraph and Telephone Companies, the members of the press, those engaged in copying public records while so engaged, persons now operating the concession in the Land Office Building and the Walton Building, the American Legion, Daughters of the Republic, Daughters of the Confederacy and the U. S. Geological Survey, only duly constituted public authorities, departments, and agencies shall occupy space in the public buildings owned by the State. The Board of Control is hereby charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the provisions of this Section.

No department or bureau included in this Act shall use any of the funds appropriated to such department or bureau, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of telephoning, telegraphing or distributing either by hand or through the mails, any literature, propaganda, letters, or bulletins, or any other matter printed or written, or to make any radio speech or speeches, whether transcribed or not, or any other speech or speeches under any circumstances which has the effect of publicizing or directing attention to or tending to publicize or direct attention to any individual, official or employee of such department or bureau, or of any other department or bureau. It is further provided that no department or bureau shall maintain any publicity department or have in its employ or under its direction any employee or other person who has the title or who performs the duties or functions of a public relations agent, publicity agent or press agent. It is provided, however, that none of these restrictions shall apply in the event it becomes necessary, in the opinion of the head of the department or bureau, as a proper

function of the department or bureau, or in the interest of the general public, for such department or bureau, through any of its authorized agents, to issue any statements or impart any information by the usual methods, and in so doing, said statements shall be issued or information imparted in the name of such department or bureau and shall be issued under or have attached thereto the name of the official or agent authorized to issue the same, but shall not otherwise include the name of any individual, official or employee of such department or bureau or of any other department or bureau.

It is further provided that no funds appropriated under this Act shall be used for the payment of salaries to any employee or employees who use alcoholic beverages to excess while on active duty.

SEC. 3. It is further provided that in the event the Statutes of the State of Texas provide that any amounts, fees or funds herein appropriated to be paid out of local or special fees or funds, that the same be so paid out of said local or special fees and funds instead of being paid out of the General Revenue Fund.

SEC. 4. If any section, subsection, or provision of this Act is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such holdings shall not affect the constitutionality or validity of any other provision or part of this Act.

SEC. 5. The fact that this is one of the general appropriation bills, to provide for the support, maintenance, and operation of important departments and agencies of the State, and the crowded condition of the calendars of the two Houses of the Legislature, creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity calling for the suspension of the Constitutional Rule requiring bills to be read on three several days and for the taking effect of the Act immediately upon its passage and said Rule is hereby suspended and this bill shall take effect immediately upon its passage, and it is so enacted.
