AMENDMENT NO. 2 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE BRYANT: Members, this amendment would cure a problem that had been addressed in the senate, but is not currently addressed in this substitute. It includes in the increases in retirement payments those teachers who retired in 2021. Now, remember, that's two years ago and that retirement took place in the midst of a pandemic and extensive inflation. It costs \$177 million to do it, but it's the right thing to do. Let me remind you that when a teacher retires under our system, which is unique in the United States—except for Louisiana, nobody's paycheck ever again increases unless its legislature acts. Excuse me, nobody's retirement check ever again increases unless its legislature, in session, decides to give them the gift of an increase. These 2021 retirees deserve to be a part of this. I urge you to vote for the amendment.

REPRESENTATIVE BONNEN: Respectfully, I just want to speak to a couple things. One, as I just laid out, the whole strategy here is actually to provide for increases on a go-forward basis every single year. So historically, that has not been the case, but should we adopt the legislation in front of you today and the accompanying constitutional amendment, that is not accurate what you just heard. There will always be an annual increase. The second thing is, the reason that we have the tiered structure that we have is that we're trying to help those retirees who are in the most dire straits. If you retired 20 or more years ago, the annuity that you're living off of is woefully low. And the more recent your retirement, the better your salary, the better your annuity was. That is the reason it is structured the way that it is. So respectfully, I oppose this amendment.

BRYANT: Members, this is a simple philosophical matter. If you think we should be giving cost-of-living adjustments to our retirees, then we should give them to all of the retirees. And the people that retired in 2021 deserve to be part of this increase. They retired at a very difficult time and they retired at a time of rampant inflation. Let's include them. They'll get their increase just like the other people if we act. They will not get it if we don't. I urge you to vote for the amendment.

AMENDMENT NO. 3 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE BRYANT: We have a \$33 billion surplus and a projected \$21 billion in the rainy day fund. We have plenty of money to do the right thing. Let me repeat a very important principle that is often overlooked, our teachers who retire do not receive any increase in their retirement check for the rest of their lives unless this legislature meets and acts and gives them a gift of an increase.

What I am proposing here is very simple. Let's do the right thing, let's recognize the need. Let's recognize the fact that we, and Louisiana, are the only states in the nation who have a teacher retirement system in which there is not a regular COLA. Our teachers are not involved in Social Security. They don't have a regular COLA that increases according to the cost of living. What I'm proposing here is simply that we include those teachers that are going to be affected by this increase in a meaningful way rather than a way that is so parsimonious.

Consider the size of the surplus, consider the size of the rainy day fund, and consider the moral obligation we have to our teachers. This increases the oldest retirees to 10 percent from six percent. The next category is increased to eight percent from four percent, and the next category is increased to six percent from two percent. This is a 10 percent COLA for the oldest retirees. This is the right thing to do, it meets our moral obligations. I urge you to vote for the amendment.

REPRESENTATIVE BONNEN: What we are doing in this legislation is actually creating an ongoing annual increase. That is what you have the opportunity to do for the first time in history. Unfortunately, also in this amendment, there is no strategy for paying for the further increase in the COLA that's being proposed. So unfortunately, I oppose this amendment.

BRYANT: Yes, there is a means of paying for it. There's a \$33 billion surplus. If we pass this amendment, I'll offer an amendment to **HJR 2**—which is coming up next—which puts the money in the fund so that it will be completely covered.

The point of the matter is that our teachers deserve a great deal more than this. I don't understand how we can sit here and recognize that some of these teachers have not had a COLA increase for 19 years. A few others had some back in 2013. These people teach our children. They taught us. We have a moral obligation to them. I'm simply saying let's give the oldest category of retirees a 10 percent increase, the next category an eight percent increase, and the next category a six percent increase. Surely, if we have a surplus, this is the year that we can do this. I urge you to vote for the amendment.

The district or school shall contract directly with the tutor selected, who may be a classroom teacher employed at the district or school. A classroom teacher selected as a student's tutor is entitled to supplemental pay from the district or school. The district or school may not provide money under this subsection directly to a parent or guardian of a student.

(c) A school district or open-enrollment charter school shall submit to the agency the district's or school's list of high-quality tutors and publish the list on the district's or school's Internet website.

(d) A school district or open-enrollment charter school that provides a tutor to a student under this section shall continue to provide the student any other reading support required of the district or school by federal or state law.

A school district or open-enrollment charter school [district level committee established under Subchapter F, Chapter 11,] may use other [adopt a list of] reading instruments, subject to Subsection (b-4), [for use in the district in a grade level other than kindergarten] in addition to the reading instruments included on the commissioner's list. Each reading instrument included on the list adopted by the commissioner or administered by a school district or open-enrollment charter school [or a district level committee] must:

(1) be based on scientific research concerning reading skills development and reading comprehension;

(2) [. A list of reading instruments adopted under this subsection must] provide for diagnosing the reading development and comprehension of students participating in a program under Subchapter B, Chapter 29;

(3) provide progress monitoring capabilities;

(4) provide a diagnostic tool to assist teachers in developing research-based targeted instruction;

(5) allow screening of students three times each school year;

(6) assess only foundational literacy components not already mastered by the student; and

(7) assess whether a student needs reading instruction intervention.

(b-2) The commissioner shall include on the commissioner's list any reading instrument that is:

(1) based on scientific research concerning reading skills development and reading comprehension; and

(2) submitted for inclusion on the list under Subsection (b-4).

(b-3) The commissioner shall update the list of reading instruments at least once every four years, including multidimensional assessment tools authorized under this section.

(b-4) A school district or open-enrollment charter school that uses one or more reading instruments not included on the commissioner's list in accordance with Subsection (b) must submit the instrument to the commissioner to verify the instrument satisfies the requirements of this section. The commissioner shall place on the commissioner's list a reading instrument that satisfies the requirements of this section.

(c) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school shall administer, at the first and second grade levels, a reading instrument that is based on scientific research concerning reading skills development and reading comprehension included on the list adopted by the commissioner [or by the district level committee]. The district or school shall administer the reading instrument in accordance with the commissioner's recommendations under Subsection (a)(1).

(c-1) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school shall administer at the beginning of the seventh grade a reading instrument included on the list adopted by the commissioner to each student whose performance on the

assessment instrument in reading administered under Section 39.023(a) to the student in grade six did not demonstrate reading proficiency, as determined by the commissioner. The district or school shall administer the reading instrument in accordance with the commissioner's policies adopted [recommendations] under Subsection (a)(1).

(c-2) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school shall administer at the kindergarten level a reading instrument included on the list adopted by the commissioner [under Subsection (b) or approved by the commissioner under Subsection (b 1)]. The district or school shall administer the reading instrument in accordance with the commissioner's policies adopted [recommendations] under Subsection (a)(1).

(c-3) The commissioner by rule shall determine the performance on a [the] reading instrument adopted under Subsection (b) that indicates kindergarten readiness.

(d-1) The commissioner shall prominently display on the agency's Internet website information regarding the commissioner's list of reading instruments maintained under this section and the process for applying for inclusion on the list, as provided by agency rule adopted under Subsection (n).

(3) On page 7, between lines 14 and 15, insert the following:

(n) The agency by rule shall provide a process under which a school district or open-enrollment charter school may submit an application for inclusion of a reading instrument on the commissioner's list of reading instruments maintained under this section.

(4) Strike page 10, lines 11 and 12, and substitute the following: SECTION 6. Section 28.006(b-1), Education Code, is repealed.

(22) <u>fails to apply a statutory presumption to a claim that qualifies for a presumption under Subchapter B, Chapter 607, Government Code, without conducting a reasonable investigation of the facts relevant to the applicability of the presumption to the claim;</u>

(23) denies a claim that is subject to a statutory presumption under Subchapter B, Chapter 607, Government Code, without conducting a reasonable investigation of facts relevant to determining the validity of the claim; or

(4) On page 5, between lines 23 and 24, insert the following:

(c) With respect to any medical facts on which the insurance carrier or its representative relied in determining a presumption under Subchapter B, Chapter 607, Government Code, is not applicable or in denying a claim that is subject to a statutory presumption under that subchapter, the reasonable investigation required by Subsection (a)(22) or (23) must include an opinion from a qualified medical expert using evidence-based medicine that supports the decision of the insurance carrier or its representative.

And the intent of this legislation is that these are the known allegations at the time of the investigation?
