HR 2629 was adopted.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY

REPRESENTATIVE LEIBOWITZ: Mr. Speaker, when did the house convene in January?

SPEAKER STRAUS: I believe it was January the 14th.

LEIBOWITZ: Okay. So we've been in session for approximately four and a half months?

SPEAKER: That's correct.

LEIBOWITZ: Mr. Speaker, were you present when Governor Perry gave the State of the State Address wherein he stated, "and I also propose freezing a student's college tuition rates for four years at the level they pay as an entering freshman. This will help Texas families plan while giving students another incentive to finish on time?"

SPEAKER: Yes, I was.

LEIBOWITZ: And based on the documentation in the house records the chair has, would the chair kindly inform us as to when **HB 21** was filed?

SPEAKER: I know, Mr. Leibowitz, you gave me a stack of information here, but I haven't had a chance to review it, so I can't tell you exactly where that is.

LEIBOWITZ: I highlighted it, Mr. Speaker. It was filed November the 10th, 2008. Does the chair have any documentation that states otherwise?

SPEAKER: Mr. Leibowitz, I have whatever documentation you dropped at the desk, is that what you're referring to?

LEIBOWITZ: Yes.

SPEAKER: I suppose I have it.

LEIBOWITZ: So, November 10th, 2008. Mr. Speaker, is it a chairman's prerogative—the chairman of the committee—as to when to set a bill for a committee hearing?

SPEAKER: Yes, sir, it is.

LEIBOWITZ: Is it a chairman's prerogative as to whether or not to set a bill, period, in the first place?

SPEAKER: Yes, it is.

LEIBOWITZ: Can the chairman of the given house committee choose not to give a bill a hearing?

SPEAKER: Yes, a chairman can do that.

LEIBOWITZ: And can a committee chair refuse to call up a bill for a vote even if that member has the votes necessary to vote a bill out of that committee?

SPEAKER: Yes.

LEIBOWITZ: When was **HB 21** heard in the Higher Education Committee?

SPEAKER: I don't know. What date? Can you tell me?

LEIBOWITZ: April 15th, over a month ago.

SPEAKER: Thank you.

LEIBOWITZ: And it was left pending in committee on April 15th, as well. Mr. Speaker, have there not been several bills filed addressing the college tuition problem that Texas families are having in paying college tuition?

SPEAKER: Yes, there have been.

LEIBOWITZ: In fact, my documentation reflects that there has been 63 bills filed by members of this body.

SPEAKER: I know there have been a lot. I don't have the correct number.

LEIBOWITZ: Mr. Speaker, to your knowledge, have any of the college tuition bills filed during the course of this session been sent to this floor to debate and for a vote?

SPEAKER: I haven't reviewed all the calendars, Mr. Leibowitz.

LEIBOWITZ: I don't recall any, Mr. Speaker. Does the chair recall any bills regarding college tuition being sent to floor for debate and for a vote?

SPEAKER: I do not.

LEIBOWITZ: Mr. Speaker, the only college tuition bill voted out of the Higher Education Committee and sent to Calendars, based upon my research and documentation I've provided to the house parliamentarian, is **SB 1443** by Senator Zaffarini. Do you have any documentation to the contrary?

SPEAKER: Mr. Leibowitz, there's a lot of documentation, there's been many bills filed this session. We're on second reading deadline for senate bills; today, we have 37 pages of second readings—

LEIBOWITZ: I'm aware of that. I'm almost finished, Mr. Speaker, with your indulgence. Is the chair aware that 26 senators signed on as co-authors for **SB 1443** regarding college tuition?

SPEAKER: I am not aware.

LEIBOWITZ: And the deadline for hearing bills is what, Mr. Speaker, midnight tonight?

SPEAKER: Would you restate your question?

LEIBOWITZ: Yes, sir. The deadline for second and third readings?

SPEAKER: You're referring to senate bills?

LEIBOWITZ: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER: Deadline for second readings, as I said, is today at midnight.

LEIBOWITZ: At midnight. Is there any provision in the House Rules that allows **SB 1443**, regarding college tuition, to be brought to the floor and voted on and voted out today before the midnight deadline?

SPEAKER: Mr. Leibowitz, there are various procedures for that. You can also amend other bills.

LEIBOWITZ: But actually bringing that bill out of Calendars—is there an ability, under the House Rules, to accomplish bringing **SB 1443** out of Calendars to the house floor for debate and a vote and a final vote and voted out by the midnight deadline tonight?

SPEAKER: That's possible, Mr. Leibowitz. The chair would have to review that.

LEIBOWITZ: Would the chair recognize me for a motion to suspend all necessary rules to take up and consider **SB 1443**, addressing the college tuition problem that we have in the State of Texas, prior to the midnight deadline tonight?

SPEAKER: Not at this time, Mr. Leibowitz. We have a 38 page calendar. Now, you might review those and see if any of those bills are suitable for an amendment.

LEIBOWITZ: Will the chair recognize me at any time during course of business, today, up to, and including, midnight to bring **SB 1443** to the house floor for debate and final vote?

SPEAKER: Not at this time, Mr. Leibowitz. You may want to ask me later.

LEIBOWITZ: Finally, Mr. Speaker, on third reading, with respect to **SB 175**, what is required in terms of the numbers of votes to carry the day, in a manner of speaking, for an amendment to address the problem that Texas families are having with college tuition?

SPEAKER: Mr. Leibowitz, it would take a vote of two-thirds present to amend on third reading.

LEIBOWITZ: And if the deadline is tonight and the chair is not inclined, which I fully respect, is not inclined to recognize me to bring up **SB 1443**, is that going to be the only vehicle through which we can address college tuition this session, prior to the deadline tonight?

SPEAKER: Mr. Leibowitz, I would say again, there's 38 pages of bills on this calendar today. You are welcome to review them and see if any of them are suitable for an amendment.

LEIBOWITZ: Is the chair aware of any other vehicle, sir?

SPEAKER: I'm not aware of a vehicle, but you are free to review them.

REPRESENTATIVE RAYMOND: If the chair chooses to recognize a member in this house today to move to suspend the rules to bring up the tuition bill, or to bring up unemployment insurance bill, or to bring up the TDI Sunset bill, or any other bill; if the chair chose to recognize a member to suspend the rules, how many members would have to approve of the motion for it to pass?

SPEAKER: Mr. Raymond, it would depend on the motion and how the motion was put.

RAYMOND: Well, if the motion were, "Mr. Speaker, I'd like to move to suspend all necessary rules to bring up the unemployment insurance bill," how many votes would it take for that motion to prevail?

SPEAKER: I believe it would be two-thirds present.

RAYMOND: Okay, so if all 150 members were present, it would take 100 votes?

SPEAKER: That's correct.

RAYMOND: If tomorrow I, or someone else, made the motion and you recognized us to make the motion, to bring up unemployment insurance bill, how many votes would it take for that motion to prevail?

SPEAKER: I'd have to look at that. Mr. Raymond, it's still possible to get to that bill today.

RAYMOND: I understand, but what I'm asking you is if we didn't get to it today, and tomorrow there was a motion to bring up unemployment insurance, how many votes would it take to prevail?

SPEAKER: Mr. Raymond, I'm looking at today's calendar and anxious to get on it. That bill is on today's calendar; I think we should proceed.

RAYMOND: I understand, but I have a parliamentary inquiry, and it's a proper one, Mr. Speaker, and that is tomorrow—we're still in session tomorrow—so tomorrow, if someone made a motion to bring up a bill that we did not get to today, how many votes would it take for that motion to prevail?

SPEAKER: Why don't you ask me that question tomorrow if we don't get to that bill today?

RAYMOND: Mr. Speaker, I'm asking what I believe is a proper parliamentary inquiry. I believe the rules state that it is two-thirds, just like it is today.

SPEAKER: Mr. Raymond, I think we should make every effort to get to that bill today.

RAYMOND: I agree with you, Mr. Speaker, but are you not willing to answer? It's not a complicated question.

SPEAKER: I'm not declining to answer your question, it's just a hypothetical. I think we can get to it today if we'll proceed with laying out the first bill.

RAYMOND: Mr. Speaker, you just answered a hypothetical question on whether, if someone made a motion today to bring up unemployment insurance out of order, or any other bill out of order, you answered that hypothetical by saying it would take two-thirds of those present and voting. I understand the rules to say that would also be the rule tomorrow, but you are the speaker.

SPEAKER: I believe you asked me if I would recognize you tomorrow, and my intention is to get through the bills today on second reading before the midnight deadline.

RAYMOND: Okay, well for the record, Mr. Speaker, the rules state that tomorrow, if someone made a motion to bring up a bill that was not heard today, the rules state that it would take two-thirds vote just like it would take a two-thirds vote today to bring it out of order.

MAJOR STATE CALENDAR SENATE BILLS THIRD READING

The following bills were laid before the house and read third time:

SB 175 ON THIRD READING (Branch - House Sponsor)

SB 175, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to limitations on the automatic admission of undergraduate students to general academic teaching institutions.

Amendment No. 1

Representative Leibowitz offered the following amendment to **SB 175**:

Amend **SB 175** on third reading by inserting into the bill the following appropriately numbered SECTION and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. Subchapter A, Chapter 54, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 54.016 to read as follows:

Sec. 54.016. FIXED TUITION RATE FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS. (a) In this section:

(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

(2) "General academic teaching institution," "public junior college," "public state college," and "public technical institute" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003.

(3) "Lower-division institution of higher education" means a public junior college, public state college, or public technical institute.

(b) Except as otherwise provided by this section, in a semester or other academic term, the governing board of a general academic teaching institution or lower-division institution of higher education may not charge tuition to an undergraduate student under Section 54.0513, or under any other law granting the institution discretion to set the tuition rate, at a rate that exceeds the rate the institution charged to the student during the first semester or other academic term that the student enrolled at the institution if the student is currently and at all times while enrolled at the institution has been a resident of this state for purposes of Subchapter B or was otherwise entitled to pay tuition at the rate provided for residents of this state.

(c) For a student enrolled at a general academic teaching institution other than a public state college, Subsection (b) does not apply to the student after:

(1) the fourth anniversary of the date the student first enrolls at any public institution of higher education, regardless of whether the student transfers among any public or private institutions of higher education after the initial enrollment, if the student is enrolled in a degree program of four years or less; or

(2) the fifth anniversary of the date the student first enrolls at any public institution of higher education, regardless of whether the student transfers among any public or private institutions of higher education after the initial enrollment, if the student is enrolled in a degree program of more than four years.

(d) For a student enrolled at a lower-division institution of higher education, Subsection (b) does not apply to the student after the second anniversary of the date the student first enrolls at any lower-division institution of higher education, regardless of whether the student transfers among any public or private institutions of higher education after the initial enrollment.

(e) Each general academic teaching institution or lower-division institution of higher education shall notify each entering undergraduate student, including each undergraduate student who transfers to the institution, of the eligibility requirements for a fixed tuition rate under this section.

(f) In consultation with the general academic teaching institutions and lower-division institutions of higher education, the coordinating board shall adopt any rules the coordinating board considers appropriate for the administration of this section.

(g) This section does not apply to a student who enters a general academic teaching institution or lower-division institution of higher education for the first time before the 2010 fall semester. This subsection expires January 1, 2016.

Amendment No. 2

Representative Leibowitz offered the following amendment to **SB 175**:

Amend **SB 175**, on third reading, by adding the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill appropriately:

SECTION _____. Subchapter A, Chapter 54, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 54.016 to read as follows:

Sec. 54.016. LIMITATION ON TUITION INCREASES FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS AUTOMATICALLY ADMITTED TO GENERAL ACADEMIC TEACHING INSTITUTIONS. (a) In this section:

(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

(2) "General academic teaching institution has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.

(b) This subsection applies only to a student admitted automatically to an institution of higher education under Section 51.803.

(c) Beginning with the second academic year in which a student to whom this section applies is enrolled in a general academic teaching institution, the governing board of the institution may not charge the student for that academic year tuition under Section 54.0513 or under any other law granting the institution discretion to set the tuition rate, in an amount that exceeds the amount that the institution would have charged to a similarly situated student in the preceding academic year, as that amount is adjusted for the current academic year for inflation as provided by Subsection (f).

(d) For purposes of this section, students are similarly situated if they share the same residency status, degree program, course load, course level, tuition exemption status, and other circumstances affecting the total academic costs charged to the student.

(e) This section does not ensure that the tuition charged to an individual student will not increase by more than the limitation prescribed by Subsection (c) based on a change in the student's residency status, degree program, course load, course level, tuition exemption status, or other circumstance affecting the total academic costs charged to the student.

(f) Not later than March 1 of each year, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board by rule shall determine the inflation rate to be used for purposes of Subsection (c) for the next academic year and shall certify that rate to the governing board of each institution of higher education. For purposes of Subsection (c), the inflation rate is the percentage increase, if any, as expressed in decimal form rounded to the nearest thousandth, in the consumer price index, as defined by Section 341.201, Finance Code, for the preceding calendar year as compared to the consumer price index for the year preceding that year.

(g) This section does not apply to a student who enters a general academic teaching institution for the first time before the 2010 fall semester.

ADDRESS BY REPRESENTATIVE RAYMOND ON A MATTER OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

The chair recognized Representative Raymond who addressed the house on a matter of personal privilege, speaking as follows:

Members, I'm proud that I've had the opportunity to serve here, going on my eighth term. This is my 16th year in the house of representatives, but I have never risen to this podium on a matter of personal privilege. This is the first time I've ever done this, and so I don't do it well—bear with me—because it is not easy, and I know why we have so few of them. I can remember when Mr. Craddick gave one years ago.

I wanted to speak to you, members, for just a couple of minutes and say—maybe a little bit more than a couple—to say that not everything we do in this chamber, as individuals, we do for politics. Not everything we do and every decision that we make is based on the political calculation. And so, you all know some of us have been asking questions on the back mic these last days, and we'll continue to today, until midnight, and the reason I—I can only speak for myself—but the reason I've done that is because I am very, very concerned and

strongly opposed to something that is very fundamental, and something that is very, very important to me and, I believe, to millions of people in this state and in this country, and that is the right to vote.

I don't have a lot of notes; I wrote three things here—these are my notes. The first one is Sonia Sotomayor, the second one is Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and the third one is Henry B. Gonzalez, and I'll speak about that in a second. The bill that is commonly referred to as the "voter ID bill," which I believe is a voter suppression bill. I believe that all the evidence out there points to the fact that were we to pass that legislation, in fact, it would suppress voters in this state—people who have a right to vote, people who would be, unfortunately I think, turned away from the polls.

I remember the other day when Dr. Allen passed her constitutional amendment that prohibited the poll tax. It took us a long time to get there—a long time to get here—but I'm so happy that I was part of this legislature when we did that, and when the senate did that a couple of days ago, but it has to mean something. She sent around a letter—you may have gotten it or seen it—it had a copy of a poll tax that Jimmie Don Aycock's grandmother, I believe, had paid, and it was interesting to look at that. In my office I have, not copies, but two original poll taxes, and I display that in my office to remind myself: this wasn't paid by my grandfather, wasn't paid by my great-grandfather. These were poll taxes paid by my father, who no longer lives. He didn't pay for these when he was 20, and 21, and 22. He paid for these when I was a little kid. That's when he paid for these. And so, my introduction into getting involved in the community is tied into this, you see, because a poll tax was aimed at trying to prevent people from having the right to vote, or making it more difficult for them to vote. That's what it was aimed at. That's what it was all about, and I learned that very young.

At a very young age, I learned what that was about, and then, in my community, when it wasn't about Democrats or Republicans, it was about people. I grew up watching people's rights being suppressed, people's rights being taken away from them. I saw people being intimidated when it came to elections, and it wasn't about Democrats, and it wasn't about Republicans. So the issue that concerns me today isn't about Democrats, and it isn't about Republicans.

I speak about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.—what he did to fight for the rights of the people in this country so that we'd be treated as equal citizens and have the right to vote. He didn't do that for the Democratic Party. It didn't have anything to do with the Democratic Party. It didn't have anything to do with the Republican Party. It didn't have anything to do with any party. It had to do with people's basic, fundamental rights, and he is one of my heroes.

I grew up in Benavides, Texas, a town of, then, 1,900 people that was about 99 percent Hispanic. It's now 1,600 people, and my mother still lives there. I live in Laredo. But he fought for our rights, and how appropriate it seems to me that the day that I felt I had to get up and clarify what I am doing, and what I will continue to do, was a day that a Hispanic woman—because of Dr. King's work—that a Hispanic woman was named to the supreme court today, because of his work. He stood up for us—not just blacks, not just African Americans, not just Hispanics—for poor whites, for everybody. That's what he

did, and because of that, today, an African American named Barack Obama appointed a Latina named Sonia Sotomayor to the United States Supreme Court. He stood up not because it was for Democrats, not because it was for Republicans, because it was for Americans, and so that we would have the rights, all of us, to enjoy the greatness of this country. That's what it was about, and that's why he was my hero—one of them, not the only one, but one of them. I knew who he was, and I learned about him.

The first major event I can recall in my life was not John Kennedy being assassinated—I was a little kid, but I don't remember it, I have no memory of it, many of you do—but I was eight years old when Dr. King was assassinated, and that I remember. Eight years after that I found my way to Memphis, Tennessee, and I found my way to a motel called the Lorraine Motel. I asked my parents, "Can we go to the Lorraine Motel?" They said, "What is that?" I found it, and I went there, and it wasn't a fancy museum back then. In 1976 it wasn't a fancy museum. It was a rundown motel like it was when Dr. King stayed there, and the day that he was assassinated. I went into the office, and I said, "Could I go up to the room that Dr. King stayed in the night before he died?" The man said, "Well, okay." He said, "Well, it's not really a tourist attraction." I said, "Well, I'd like to go." So I went up there—my parents said, "Hurry up, don't take too long." It's not the nicest part of town—if you've ever been there, back then—it's nicer now. I went up there, and he opened the door, and I went inside the room that Dr. King slept in the last night of his life. They have a picture, or they did back then, of him in his casket. That's all they had in there, and the room was left exactly the way it was when he last slept there, and I walked out on the balcony, and I looked across at that little window where James Earl Ray shot him from.

I stood there, and I stood on the spot that he died, and I cried. I cried because of what he did, I cried because of who he was and what he stood for, and I cried because of who I am, because that's who I am, and when you see me on the mic—I can't speak for others—but on this issue, members, I don't give a whit about the Democratic Party. I don't give a whit about the Republican Party or any other party.

It's not about that for me, and that's why I asked to be recognized on this matter of personal privilege, because I won't ask you to do what I do, and I won't ask you to believe what I believe, and I can't ask you to feel what I feel, but it is important to me, because I have always tried to respect every member in this chamber that I have served with. I've tried to respect our differences, I have, and I want you to respect my differences. I would never ask any one of you, not one of you, to betray the people you believe you represent. Don't ask me to betray mine. Don't ask me to betray my beliefs, because I would never do that to you. I wouldn't. I may not agree with you on some things, but I'm not going to ask you to betray what you believe, no matter how different we may approach that issue or that matter, but it's important to me that you understand why I'm doing this.

Henry B. Gonzalez, from San Antonio, stood in the senate, the state senate, when it was all Democrats—maybe there was one Republican, I don't remember, but it was mostly Democrats—and he stood up and he filibustered longer than any senator in the history of this state to try to prevent segregation laws from

being enacted in this state, and I feel as strongly today as I can only imagine he felt back then. That if I didn't do everything I could do within the rules as they allow me—and I respect the rules. We all voted for the rules, every one of us—well, there was one who voted no, but we respect the rules even if we didn't vote for them, and I will do everything within the rules that I am allowed to do to oppose something that I believe is so fundamentally wrong, but I respect your rights, and I would respect your right to do the same thing if you felt as strongly about an issue as I do about this one.

So members, as we proceed today, I will be at the back mic. I would love for others to be at the back mic too. For you freshmen who are here, this is your first year. If you stop and think about it, you know I don't get up on the mic much. I really don't, and those of you that have served with me longer, you know I don't get up here much, but you know I get up here when I feel I need to, and I'm not afraid of the mic. This ain't my deal, but today, I will be at that back mic for nine minutes and 45 seconds on every local and consent bill until midnight, as long as the voter ID—voter suppression—bill has a possibility of coming before us. I will do so respectfully. I will try to ask questions respectfully, as I've done up to now, and I hope you will respect my right to do so. Thank you, and God bless you.

STATEMENT BY SPEAKER STRAUS

The speaker submitted and had read the following statement regarding committee minutes:

During a previous parliamentary inquiry, Mr. Dunnam asked whether Rule 4, Section 18(c) of the House Rules applied to the submission of corrected minutes. During the inquiry, the chair noted that it would confer with the committee coordinator to determine what the house practice has been with respect to the submission of corrected minutes.

After conferring with the committee coordinator, the chair has determined that the previous house practice has been consistently to allow corrected minutes to be filed at any time before the bill has been set on the calendar. The chair also

notes that there is no specific provision of the rules that applies to corrected minutes. All other minutes must be filed within the time prescribed by Rule 4, Section 18(c).

Mr. Dunnam also asked what would happen to bills if the minutes for a meeting that falls under Rule 4, Section 18(c) were incorrectly submitted in violation of the rules. While the chair declines to deal in hypotheticals or to rule on an issue that is not before it at this time, it is generally understood that an uncorrected defect in the minutes, as determined by the House Rules, precedent, and the facts before the chair, could be a sustainable point of order. With regard to corrected minutes, it appears that if the deadline for the filing of committee minutes applied to corrected committee minutes, there would be little need for a special rule for corrected minutes. A committee could simply file corrected minutes in place of any previously submitted minutes within the prescribed period and disregard the previously filed minutes.

In researching the issue, the chair could only find one example in recent precedent in which the issue of corrected minutes was raised, but that objection was raised in conjunction with another point of order against consideration of the bill for violation of Rule 4, Section 32(b)(6) (defective committee report form) and it is unclear on which grounds the chair sustained the point of order. (House Journal, 75th Regular Session (1997), page 3701)

In the final analysis, the chair notes that the critical policy issue as articulated in our House Rules is that the minutes be correct and filed in a timely manner such as to allow for their inspection and review by members and the public.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY

REPRESENTATIVE DUNNAM: Do corrected minutes have to be filed within three days of the meeting wherein the correction is adopted?

SPEAKER: Mr. Dunnam, I may have misunderstood your question.

DUNNAM: Okay, do corrected minutes—they are adopted at a meeting, is that correct?

SPEAKER: That is correct.

DUNNAM: The committee is not authorized to correct them without the committee adopting the corrections, is that correct?

SPEAKER: That is correct.

DUNNAM: The corrected minutes themselves, do they have to be filed within three days of that meeting wherein the correction was adopted?

SPEAKER: Now, Mr. Dunnam, that's where the mistake that I made in misunderstanding your question the other day occurred. I apologize for that.

DUNNAM: So, when minutes are corrected at a meeting, and they are adopted, they can be filed at any time until the bill is laid out?

SPEAKER: That's been the house practice.

DUNNAM: I understand. The house practice though, Mr. Speaker—if someone doesn't object, by saying the "house practices," is basically saying that if people don't object for a period of time, then no one can ever enforce that rule again.

SPEAKER: Mr. Dunnam, we've researched it, and we don't see where this applies. If you have research or precedent you'd like to come talk to the parliamentarian about, we'd be happy to look at it.

DUNNAM: My question, I guess, specifically, is that the minutes—in regard to the voter ID bill, the corrected minutes—were filed seven days after the committee adopted them. Does that render the bill ineligible for floor consideration if it's reached today?

SPEAKER: The house practice has been that the corrected minutes can be filed at any time before the bill is on the calendar. If you would like to bring research, or precedent, or discuss it with the parliamentarian, that bill is about 20 pages away in the calendar.

DUNNAM: Well, it is 20 pages away, but it could be here almost immediately if we had clarification from the chair about what the ruling is going to be.

SPEAKER: Mr. Dunnam, I'm not going to give an advisory opinion on that, but if you would like to come down and discuss it, we can do that.

DUNNAM: Even if that might save us 12 hours of discussion on local bills?

SPEAKER: If you have some research and some precedent to discuss, we'd be happy to look at it.

DUNNAM: Well, does the chair have any precedent? "House practice," I don't know what that means. That means the coordinator of the clerk's office said, this is the way we've always done it, and the rules are irrelevant. I can accept that, but to say that we have to have a precedent that backs up what the rules clearly say, but the chair doesn't have a precedent that says whatever the committee coordinator says is going to hold—I don't understand. Why doesn't the chair have a precedent that says that this is the way we're going to violate the rules? Because the committee coordinator says this is the way we've always done it. I would hope that the chair would have a precedent that said that.

SPEAKER: The chair has no precedent on that. That's why I'm telling you that if you do or have research, we should consider it.

DUNNAM: I will tell the chair that as far as we know, there is no precedent. The rules say that all other minutes, other than those that come out of the Appropriations Committee—doesn't say non-corrected minutes, it doesn't say corrected minutes—it says all other minutes, the only exception being those that come out of the Appropriations Committee, all other minutes have to be filed in three days, and if that no longer means three days because the committee coordinator says that's not their practice, I would just like to know now so that we can advise the members that were going to talk on bills whether or not they have to talk all day or not.

SPEAKER: Mr. Dunnam, we don't have precedent on corrected minutes.

DUNNAM: So, I'm asking the chair to set the precedent on this, one way or the other, so we can determine how to proceed today and avoid, hopefully, wasting a lot of time. That's how precedent is made.

SPEAKER: I'm not going to give an advisory opinion at this time.

(Speaker pro tempore in the chair)

REPRESENTATIVE MORRISON: Have we suspended the rule that bills be heard on three several days for every local and consent calendar this session?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE EILAND: Do you mean during the session, previous to this calendar, or for this calendar?

MORRISON: Previous to this calendar.

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: We usually adjourn and come back in the next day—the next legislative day—for third readings.

MORRISON: So, this is the first time we have not done that this particular session?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: We did do it, on Friday—we did suspend the rule to not have the three several day readings, on Friday—and I believe it's for Mr. Naishtat and Mr. Chisum's bill, because those are the only two bills that did not have senate companions—if I remember.

MORRISON: Okay. Would it be possible to have the parliamentarian research the number of times that the rules were not suspended, for the local and consent calendar, to have bills heard on three several days, in the past five sessions?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Sure, bring the request down front and we'll get the parliamentarian to do that.

MORRISON: After the parliamentarian has that information, will it be possible to have that information printed in the journal?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Certainly.

MORRISON: How long has this local and consent calendar taken?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Days or hours?

MORRISON: Both would be nice.

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: I don't know exactly, but we'll try to find an answer.

MORRISON: Would you agree that a local and consent calendar typically takes between two to, at most, six to seven hours, and that this local and consent calendar has lasted beyond 30 hours?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Generally speaking—yes.

MORRISON: Can we also have the remarks, regarding the length of the time for this local and consent calendar, printed in the journal?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: You mean when we complete it, or as of right now?

MORRISON: When it's completed, please.

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: We will try to remember to do that.

MORRISON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: You might remind me, just in case we forget.

REPRESENTATIVE BONNEN: Are you aware of the fact that in the last legislative session, the 80th Session, we passed 1,105 bills on the local calendar in a total of 752 minutes?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: I was not aware, but I was here.

BONNEN: Are you aware of the fact that this legislative session, up to this current local calendar that we're on now, for, I believe, the—Friday, Saturday, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday—fifth day, that prior to that point, we had passed 883 bills on the local calendar in 859 minutes?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: I was not aware of that.

BONNEN: Are you aware of the fact that on second readings, we passed, on this current calendar, 237 bills in—it took us 2,070 minutes, about nine times longer than a normal local calendar?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: I was not aware.

Is the chair aware that one of the differences between this calendar and other local and consent calendars that have come before us this session is that we have done an—several of us have done an extensive analysis, and about 90 percent of the bills on this local and consent calendar have a statewide impact. For example, the recent bill that Chairwoman Thompson passed, affecting insurance practices and procedures,

affects the entire state. Is the chair aware with this calendar, about 90 percent of the bills are not just some little local bill, but, in fact, have statewide implications?

(i) A criminal justice agency may disclose criminal history record information that is the subject of an order of nondisclosure under Subsection (d) to the following noncriminal justice agencies or entities only:

- (1) the State Board for Educator Certification;
- (2) a school district, charter school, private school, regional education service center, commercial transportation company, or education shared service arrangement;
- (3) the Texas Medical Board;
- (4) the Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired;
- (5) the Board of Law Examiners;
- (6) the State Bar of Texas;
- (7) a district court regarding a petition for name change under Subchapter B, Chapter 45, Family Code;
- (8) the Texas School for the Deaf;
- (9) the Department of Family and Protective Services;
- (10) the Texas Youth Commission;
- (11) the Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services;

(12) the Department of State Health Services, a local mental health service, a local mental retardation authority, or a community center providing services to persons with mental illness or retardation;

(13) the Texas Private Security Board;

(14) a municipal or volunteer fire department;

(15) the Texas Board of Nursing;

(16) a safe house providing shelter to children in harmful situations;

(17) a public or nonprofit hospital or hospital district;

(18) the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission;

(19) the securities commissioner, the banking commissioner, the savings and mortgage lending commissioner, or the credit union commissioner;

(20) the Texas State Board of Public Accountancy;

(21) the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation;

(3) the Department of State Health Services, a local mental health or mental retardation authority, or a community center providing services to persons with mental illness or retardation;

(4) the Department of Family and Protective Services;

(5) a juvenile probation department;

(6) a municipal or county health department;

(7) a public or nonprofit hospital or hospital district;

(8) a county department that provides services to at-risk youth or their families;

(9) a children's advocacy center established under Section 264.402, Family Code;

(10) a school district, charter school, private school, regional education service center, commercial transportation company, or education shared service arrangement; and

(11) a safe house providing shelter to children in harmful situations.

(2) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. The change in law made by this Act applies to a conviction that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act, regardless of whether the offense was committed before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION _____. Notwithstanding Section 6 of this Act, a child, as that term is defined by Section 51.02, Family Code, who is convicted of a misdemeanor offense punishable by fine only that does not constitute conduct indicating a need for supervision under Section 51.03, Family Code, before the effective date of this Act may petition the court for an order of nondisclosure, and the court shall issue the order under Subsection (f-1), Section 411.081, Government Code, as added by this Act.

STATEMENT BY SPEAKER STRAUS

The speaker had read the following statement regarding postponed bills:

Mr. Dunnam and Mr. Raymond have asked the chair to determine: (1) whether the chair has the discretion to lay a postponed bill before the house at any time; and (2) what happens under the House Rules to matters that are pending at midnight tonight if a point of order is raised.

Postponed bills. Under Rule 7, Section 15 of the House Rules, a bill that is postponed to a day certain "shall be laid before the house at the time on the calendar day to which it was postponed, provided it is otherwise eligible under the rules and no other business is then pending." The rule further provides that "[i]f business is pending, the postponed matter shall be deferred until the pending business is disposed of without prejudice otherwise to its right of priority."

Under a strict interpretation of the rules, a bill that is postponed must take priority over all matters other than pending business and no other bill may be placed in front of that bill. Once the pending matter is disposed of, a bill that is laid before the house in front of the postponed bill is subject to a point of order on the grounds that it is "out of order," and the cure for that objection is to set the bill aside and take up the postponed bill as promptly as possible.

Rule 8, Section 13(c). Mr. Dunnam and Mr. Raymond also asked what happens to matters under the House Rules to matters that are pending or before the house at midnight tonight. Rule 8, Section 13(c) prohibits the consideration of senate bills on second reading after today, the 134th day of session. In prior years, the chair has consistently sustained a point of order that is raised against further consideration of a bill under this section if the deadline for consideration of that bill has passed. (See House Journal, 78th Regular Session (2003), page 4402; House Journal, 77th Regular Session (2001), page 3912; House Journal, 76th Regular Session (1999), page 3267; House Journal, 75th Regular Session (1997), page 3916)

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY

RAYMOND: Does that mean on the second one—on the second question—then does that mean that if, again let's just say tonight, it's midnight. Let's say we get on a bill at 11:55, and we're not through with the bill, it's still before us, we've not voted, and the clock strikes 12. If anyone objects, that is, raises a point of order, is that bill dead? Stops? No vote?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: In the past, we have proceeded if no one objected, but if anybody objects, the point of order is sustained.

RAYMOND: So, if we are on a bill, and we reach midnight, and one member in here out of 150—well, 149 because I guess the chair doesn't object—if we are on a bill at midnight and any of us raises a point of order against further consideration of that bill, then it will end right there. We will not be able to vote on that bill. Is that correct?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Restate your question, Mr. Raymond.

RAYMOND: Sure, Mr. Speaker. My question was that tonight, if it's 11:55 and you call up a bill, whether it's a local bill, or we are by then on the major state calendar, in either situation, and all of a sudden it gets to midnight. If any one member raises a point of order against further consideration of that bill, because we haven't voted on its passage yet, then will that bill cease—end right there?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: If a point of order is called, in accordance with previous rulings, yes.

RAYMOND: Okay, so in other words, any one of us raises a point of order, we're in the middle of a bill, to put it simply, at 12 o'clock midnight, and any member here raises a point of order, the point of order will be sustained and the bill will end, and we're done with the calendar. Is that right?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Yes.

RAYMOND: On the first question, when you said if a bill is postponed till a time certain, for example, if Ms. Laubenberg had gone up and said, "I wish to postpone my bill until 8 p.m. tonight," and then it got to 8 p.m. and she's standing up there but the chair, that is the speaker, decided to keep going, would the speaker consider the bills that are still on the calendar pending business? Because the way you read that opinion, or whatever you read, it sounded to me like you said, "If you're postponed to a time certain, pending business shall be disposed of before you return to that bill."

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Pending business in that term means whatever bill you are on. So, if Ms. Laubenberg's bill had been postponed to 8 o'clock, and at 8 o'clock we were in the middle of a bill, we would not stop the bill we were on and take up Ms. Laubenberg's postponed business. We would finish the bill we were on and then Ms. Laubenberg's postponed bill. Let me just clarify or explain: this is a strict interpretation of the rule. In the past, we have continued on with business, but this session people have objected, and so it is that we stop and take up that postponed matter at that time.

RAYMOND: Right, and I think Mr. Dunnam's and my inquiry had to do with whether or not you or the speaker have any discretion on that matter. That is, if Ms. Laubenberg was ready to take her bill up at 6 o'clock, she postponed till six, we're in the middle of another bill at 6 o'clock, we finish that bill, she says, "I'm ready to go," speaker cannot look at her and say, "Hold on, I don't want to do your bill yet." Are you telling us that she has the absolute right to bring her bill up in that moment?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Yes.

RAYMOND: Speaker has no discretion?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Correct, unless the rules are suspended or no one objects, but if anybody objects, there is no discretion.

RAYMOND: Okay, so to suspend the rule in that situation, would it be a two-thirds vote?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Yes.

RAYMOND: Alright. So then, if it is, let's say 11:45 at night, and she postponed till 11:45, and we had one bill left. We get to her bill, there's one bill left on the calendar—local and consent calendar—and there are two bills after that. We get to her bill, you have to call it up, unless the author says, "You can skip me, put it off for a little while?"

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Can you restate your question?

RAYMOND: I'm wondering if we, as members, have any control over someone else postponing a bill until time certain, and when it comes up at that time, and the author of the bill wants to postpone again, what is the process for members objecting?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: It is a majority of those present and voting on a motion to postpone to allow the postponement.

RAYMOND: So, if they wanted to postpone that bill yet again, and somebody objected, a simple majority could give the author of the bill the courtesy, if you will, to continue postponing it?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Correct.

RAYMOND: Could they postpone it till Wednesday?

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: What is "it"? What type of bill is it?

RAYMOND: Local and consent.

SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE: Yes.

REPRESENTATIVE C. TURNER: Representative Marquez, can you just tell us how this ethics commission would be created?

REPRESENTATIVE MARQUEZ: The ethics commission would be created by the commissioners court or by elections scheduled by the commissioners court. So essentially, it would be the priority of the commissioners court to create the commission and allow those 10 elected people to adopt the ethics code. So it's a kind of three step: we allow the commissioners court, the court then creates the commission, and then the commission adopts the ethics code.

C. TURNER: And what would the ethics commission do exactly once it's established?

MARQUEZ: Well, essentially, once the 10 appointees are settled, they've adopted the ethics code, each county commissioner and judge would appoint one member and then there would be five other members that are allowed to come on board. And they would develop and adopt an ethics code so they will be responsible for developing it and adopting it—the bylaws—with community input, of course. They process sworn complaints of alleged violations of this ethics code; communicate to the public at large about ethics issues and I think the most important part and this is what I did speak about in the second reading, was they are going to train public officials, county employees, and those who conduct

business with the county to comply with the ethics code requirements. And this is probably the most important part of this commission, is that they are going to create a process so that everybody knows what the rules are in the county. It's not going to be a commission that comes up with rules and then decides to arbitrarily enforce them. There will be a code set, the county employees will have that information, and they will know how to conduct day-to-day business.

C. TURNER: Can the ethics commission initiate investigations on its own?

MARQUEZ: Oh, no, absolutely not. The commission can only respond to sworn complaints. So if there were a violation—similar to the way the representatives are monitored—someone from our community can submit a complaint to the ethics commission, and the ethics commission only then has the power to investigate a particular complaint. But they cannot just go out on rumor, or any kind of other information that's not in the sworn affidavit.

~~[(e)]~~ The rule may vary the period over which the penalty may be paid or the amount of the periodic installments according to the amount of the penalty owed and the size of the business that owes the penalty. The period over which the penalty may be paid may not exceed 36 ~~[42]~~ months.

SECTION _____. Section 7.002, Water Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 7.002. ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY. The commission may initiate an action under this chapter to enforce provisions of this code and the Health and Safety Code within the commission's jurisdiction as provided by Section 5.013 of this code and rules adopted under those provisions. The commission or the executive director may institute legal proceedings to compel compliance with the relevant provisions of this code and the Health and Safety Code and rules, orders, permits, or other decisions of the commission. The commission may delegate to the executive director the authority to issue an administrative order, including an administrative order that assesses penalties or orders corrective measures, to ensure compliance with the provisions of this code and the Health and Safety Code within the commission's jurisdiction as provided by Section 5.013 of this code and rules adopted under those provisions.

SECTION _____. Section 26.0135(h), Water Code, is amended to read as follows:

(h) The commission shall apportion, assess, and recover the reasonable costs of administering the water quality management programs under this section ~~[from users of water and wastewater permit holders in the watershed according to the records of the commission generally in proportion to their right, through permit or contract, to use water from and discharge wastewater in the watershed].~~ Irrigation water rights, non-priority hydroelectric rights of a water right holder that owns or operates privately owned facilities that collectively have a capacity of less than two megawatts, and water rights held in the Texas Water Trust for terms of at least 20 years will not be subject to this assessment. The cost to river authorities and others to conduct water quality monitoring and assessment shall be subject to prior review and approval by the commission as to methods of allocation and total amount to be recovered. The commission shall adopt rules to

supervise and implement the water quality monitoring, assessment, and associated costs. The rules shall ensure that water users and wastewater dischargers do not pay excessive amounts, ~~[that program funds are equitably apportioned among basins,]~~ that a river authority may recover no more than the actual costs of administering the water quality management programs called for in this section, and that no municipality shall be assessed cost for any efforts that duplicate water quality management activities described in Section 26.177. ~~[The rules concerning the apportionment and assessment of reasonable costs shall provide for a recovery of not more than \$5,000,000 annually. Costs recovered by the commission are to be deposited to the credit of the water resource management account and may be used only to accomplish the purposes of this section. The commission may apply not more than 10 percent of the costs recovered annually toward the commission's overhead costs for the administration of this section and the implementation of regional water quality assessments. The commission, with the assistance and input of each river authority, shall file a written report accounting for the costs recovered under this section with the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives on or before December 1 of each even numbered year.]~~

SECTION _____. Subtitle E, Title 7, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Chapter 617 to read as follows:

Sec. 617.001. VETERANS COURT PROGRAM DEFINED; PROCEDURES FOR CERTAIN DEFENDANTS. (a) In this chapter, "veterans court program" means a program that has the following essential characteristics:

(1) the integration of services in the processing of cases in the judicial system;

(2) the use of a nonadversarial approach involving prosecutors and defense attorneys to promote public safety and to protect the due process rights of program participants;

(3) early identification and prompt placement of eligible participants in the program;

(4) access to a continuum of alcohol, controlled substance, mental health, and other related treatment and rehabilitative services;

(5) careful monitoring of treatment and services provided to program participants;

(6) a coordinated strategy to govern program responses to participants' compliance;

- (7) ongoing judicial interaction with program participants;
- (8) monitoring and evaluation of program goals and effectiveness;
- (9) continuing interdisciplinary education to promote effective program planning, implementation, and operations; and
- (10) development of partnerships with public agencies and community organizations, including the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

(b) If a defendant successfully completes a veterans court program, as authorized under Section 76.011, Government Code, after notice to the attorney representing the state and a hearing in the veterans court at which that court determines that a dismissal is in the best interest of justice, the court in which the criminal case is pending shall dismiss the criminal action against the defendant.

Sec. 617.002. AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH PROGRAM; ELIGIBILITY. (a) The commissioners court of a county may establish a veterans court program for persons arrested for or charged with any misdemeanor or felony offense. A defendant is eligible to participate in a veterans court program established under this chapter only if the attorney representing the state consents to the defendant's participation in the program and if the court in which the criminal case is pending finds that the defendant:

(1) is a veteran or current member of the United States armed forces, including a member of the reserves, national guard, or state guard; and

(2) suffers from a brain injury, mental illness, or mental disorder, including post-traumatic stress disorder, that:

(A) resulted from the defendant's military service in a combat zone or other similar hazardous duty area; and

(B) materially affected the defendant's criminal conduct at issue in the case.

(b) The court in which the criminal case is pending shall allow an eligible defendant to choose whether to proceed through the veterans court program or otherwise through the criminal justice system.

(c) Proof of matters described by Subsection (a) may be submitted to the court in which the criminal case is pending in any form the court determines to be appropriate, including military service and medical records, previous determinations of a disability by a veteran's organization or by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, testimony or affidavits of other veterans or service members, and prior determinations of eligibility for benefits by any state or county veterans office. The court's findings must accompany any docketed case.

Sec. 617.003. DUTIES OF VETERANS COURT. (a) A veterans court program established under this chapter must:

(1) ensure a person eligible for the program is provided legal counsel before volunteering to proceed through the program and while participating in the program;

(2) allow a participant to withdraw from the program at any time before a trial on the merits has been initiated;

(3) provide a participant with a court-ordered individualized treatment plan indicating the services that will be provided to the participant; and

(4) ensure that the jurisdiction of the veterans court continues for a period of not less than six months but does not continue beyond the period of community supervision for the offense charged.

(b) A veterans court program established under this chapter shall make, establish, and publish local procedures to ensure maximum participation of eligible defendants in the county or counties in which those defendants reside.

(c) This chapter does not prevent the initiation of procedures under Chapter 46B, Code of Criminal Procedure.

Sec. 617.004. ESTABLISHMENT OF REGIONAL PROGRAM. The commissioners courts of two or more counties may elect to establish a regional veterans court program under this chapter for the participating counties.

Sec. 617.005. OVERSIGHT. (a) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of representatives may assign to appropriate legislative committees duties relating to the oversight of veterans court programs established under this chapter.

(b) A legislative committee or the governor may request the state auditor to perform a management, operations, or financial or accounting audit of a veterans court program established under this chapter.

(c) A veterans court program established under this chapter shall:

(1) notify the criminal justice division of the governor's office before or on implementation of the program; and

(2) provide information regarding the performance of the program to that division on request.

Sec. 617.006. FEES. (a) A veterans court program established under this chapter may collect from a participant in the program:

(1) a reasonable program fee not to exceed \$1,000; and

(2) a testing, counseling, and treatment fee in an amount necessary to cover the costs of any testing, counseling, or treatment performed or provided under the program.

(b) Fees collected under this section may be paid on a periodic basis or on a deferred payment schedule at the discretion of the judge, magistrate, or program director administering the program. The fees must be:

(1) based on the participant's ability to pay; and

(2) used only for purposes specific to the program.

SECTION _____. Subsection (a), Article 55.01, Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A person who has been placed under a custodial or noncustodial arrest for commission of either a felony or misdemeanor is entitled to have all records and files relating to the arrest expunged if:

(1) the person is tried for the offense for which the person was arrested and is:

(A) acquitted by the trial court, except as provided by Subsection (c) of this section; or

(B) convicted and subsequently pardoned; or

(2) each of the following conditions exist:

(A) an indictment or information charging the person with commission of a felony has not been presented against the person for an offense arising out of the transaction for which the person was arrested or, if an indictment or information charging the person with commission of a felony was presented, the indictment or information has been dismissed or quashed, and:

(i) the limitations period expired before the date on which a petition for expunction was filed under Article 55.02; or

(ii) the court finds that the indictment or information was dismissed or quashed because the person completed a pretrial intervention program authorized under Section 76.011, Government Code, or because the presentment had been made because of mistake, false information, or other similar reason indicating absence of probable cause at the time of the dismissal to believe the person committed the offense or because it was void;

(B) the person has been released and the charge, if any, has not resulted in a final conviction and is no longer pending and there was no court ordered community supervision under Article 42.12 for any offense other than a Class C misdemeanor; and

(C) the person has not been convicted of a felony in the five years preceding the date of the arrest.

CSSB 1569 ON SECOND READING

(Strama, Deshotel, and Harless - House Sponsors)

CSSB 1569, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to unemployment compensation modernization.

CSSB 1569 was read second time on May 21, amendments were offered and disposed of, and **CSSB 1569** was postponed until 5 p.m. May 21. Amendment No. 15 was pending at the time of postponement.

Amendment No. 16

Representative P. King offered the following amendment to **CSSB 1569**:

Amend **CSSB 1569** (house committee printing) by adding the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act to the contrary or any other law, on the date that the changes in law made by this Act to the Labor Code result in a cost to employers that exceeds the amount of money received from the federal government for the implementation in this state of unemployment compensation provisions of the Assistance for Unemployed Workers and Struggling Families Act, Title II of Division B of Public Law No. 111-5, enacted February 17, 2009, the law as amended by this Act reverts to the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act.

Amendment No. 16 - Point of Order

Representative Deshotel raised a point of order against further consideration of Amendment No. 16 under Rule 11, Section 3 of the House Rules on the grounds that the amendment would change the original purpose of the bill.

The chair overruled the point of order and had read the following statement:

Representative Deshotel raises a point of order against further consideration of the P. King amendment to **CSSB 1569** in that the amendment violates Rule 11, Section 3 of the House Rules.

Rule 11, Section 3 mirrors Article III, Section 30, known as the "constitutional germaneness rule." That rule provides that no bill shall be amended in its passage so as to change its original purpose, calling for a consideration of what constitutes the purpose of a bill in its original condition.

House precedent indicates that a point of order under Article III, Section 30 and Rule 11, Section 3 should be sustained only when the amendment to the bill would do the direct opposite of its original purpose or when it has changed so much the original purpose cannot be said to remain.

The purpose of **CSSB 1569** is to allow the state to qualify for additional federal funding for unemployment compensation. In determining whether the original purpose has been changed, it is necessary for the chair to examine federal law. The chair can find no rule or house precedent that restricts the chair's ability to examine federal law to determine the legal effect of an amendment and whether it violates the House Rules. By analogy, the chair notes that House Rule 14, Section 1 allows for the consideration of congressional precedents where the rules are silent or unclear on questions of order or parliamentary practice.

In examining the federal law that the chair understands is applicable to the awarding of money for the purposes sought in **CSSB 1569**, the chair notes that the secretary of labor must find whether the state law provisions, "disregarding

any state law provisions which are subject to discontinuation" meet the requirements of federal law to receive the additional funding. See Section 2003(a), P.L. No. 111-5, Feb. 2009 (making a change to Section 903 of the Social Security Act in 42 U.S.C. 1103).

The language makes it discretionary with the federal secretary of labor as to which state law provisions qualify under federal law for additional funding. Moreover, the law is only a few months old. As such, the chair finds itself unable at this time to make a determination as to whether the amendment frustrates the original purpose of the bill. It is possible that at some time in the future a sufficient body of rulings at the federal level will exist as to provide the chair with more guidance on this issue, but at this time the chair cannot find with certainty if the amendment changes the original purpose of **CSSB 1569**.

Accordingly, the point of order is respectfully overruled.

Amendment No. 17

Representative Chisum offered the following amendment to Amendment No. 16:

Amend **CSSB 1569** (house committee printing) by adding the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Act to the contrary or any other law, on the date that the changes in law made by this Act to the Labor Code result in a cost to employers that exceeds the amount of money received from the federal government for the implementation in this state of unemployment compensation provisions of the Assistance for Unemployed Workers and Struggling Families Act, Title II of Division B of Public Law No. 111-5, enacted February 17, 2009, the law as amended by this Act reverts to the law in effect immediately before the September 1, 2010.

CSSB 1569 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Woolley raised a point of order against further consideration of **CSSB 1569** under Rule 8, Section 13(c) of the House Rules on the grounds that the deadline for consideration of senate bills on second reading had passed.

The speaker sustained the point of order.

CSSB 1569 - STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE INTENT

The federal government is offering \$555 million to Texas if we change our base period considered in determining benefits to include the most recent quarter, and adopt two of four measures (most likely, part-time employee coverage and compelling family reasons for leaving employment, including a move by a spouse).

The Feds currently have a UI balance of approximately \$35 billion paid in by our employers of which \$7 billion is being used for the above funding. If rejected, it remains in the fund. This is not stimulus funds but UI funds. Texas currently receives only 30 cents out of every one dollar paid in federal unemployment taxes by our employers.

In the last session of Congress, Congressman McDermitt of Minnesota attempted to pass legislation requiring all states to adopt the change in base period as well as adopting all four of the items, which they now what us to adopt two of the four to receive the additional funds. I think we now know how the strings got inserted into the stimulus bill.

In Texas, the current benefit period is 10 weeks minimum and 26 weeks maximum. The Feds have currently extended state benefits an additional 33 weeks from the UI fund and without strings. They have also funded a \$25 per week increase in benefits without strings. However, this bill is not about benefits to the unemployed because not one unemployed worker will miss a benefit check whether we vote to take this money or not. This bill is about who pays the unemployment taxes to fund unemployment benefits and whether or not those taxes and benefits associated with them are to be "permanently" increased.

The reason I said "permanently" is because that is what I believe we are voting on. You've heard statements that we can repeal this by legislation in the future. Have you seen anything in writing distributed on this floor from Congress or the Labor Department which states that? Have you seen any rulings about the implementation of this part of the stimulus bill? If Congress or the Labor Department states that any sunset provision in this legislation would cause you to lose \$555 million in funding, do you really believe they are going to allow the states to undo this in the future without repaying these funds? So what is this UI provision that was placed in the stimulus bill? Well, let's see if this definition applies. "Money given or promised in order to influence the judgement or conduct of a person in a position of trust; something that serves to induce or influence." That, members is the definition of a bribe, and that is what I believe this is.

For our employers, this is a case of you don't have to pay me now but you will pay me later and it will cost more. We need to protect our employers and we don't need to start down this slippery slope of giving in to federal bribes.
