Sec. 531.0997. AUTOMATIC ENROLLMENT OF CERTAIN WOMEN IN HEALTHY TEXAS WOMEN PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "Healthy Texas Women program" means a program operated by the commission that is substantially similar to the demonstration project operated under former Section 32.0248, Human Resources Code, and that is intended to expand access to preventive health and family planning services for women in this state.

(b) Subject to the eligibility requirements of the Healthy Texas Women program, the commission shall identify and automatically enroll in the program a woman who is a Medicaid recipient or enrollee in the child health plan program but who will lose eligibility for benefits under the applicable program because of the woman's age. The commission shall implement the automatic enrollment in a manner that:

(1) ensures a seamless transition in the provision of services between Medicaid or the child health plan program, as applicable, and the Healthy Texas Women program; and

(2) allows a woman to begin receiving services through the Healthy Texas Women program on the first day the woman is no longer eligible for Medicaid or the child health plan program, as applicable.

(c) The commission shall, at the time a woman is automatically enrolled under Subsection (b) in the Healthy Texas Women program:

(1) provide to the woman written notice that:

(A) she has been automatically enrolled in the program but may disenroll; and

(B) instructs the woman on how to disenroll from the program; and

(2) provide to the woman information about the program, including the services provided under the program.

(d) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to implement this section.

Sec. 531.09971. AUTOMATIC ENROLLMENT OF CERTAIN WOMEN IN MEDICAID. (a) In this section, "Healthy Texas Women program" has the meaning assigned by Section 531.0997.

(b) The commission shall identify and automatically enroll in Medicaid a woman who:

(1) becomes pregnant while receiving services through the Healthy Texas Women program; and

(2) is eligible for Medicaid.

(c) The commission shall implement the automatic enrollment in a manner that:

(1) ensures a seamless transition in the provision of services between the Healthy Texas Women program and Medicaid; and

(2) allows a woman to begin receiving services through Medicaid on the first day the woman is enrolled in the program.

(d) The commission shall, at the time a woman is automatically enrolled under Subsection (b) in Medicaid:

(1) provide to the woman written notice that:

(A) she has been automatically enrolled in the program but may disenroll; and

(B) instructs the woman on how to disenroll from the program; and (2) provide to the woman information about the program, including the services provided under the program.

(e) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to implement this section.

SECTION _____. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a woman who is a recipient of medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, benefits through the child health plan program under Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code, or services through the Healthy Texas Women program, on or after the effective date of this Act, regardless of the date on which eligibility for medical assistance, the child health plan program, or the Healthy Texas Women program was determined.

Representative Stickland raises a point of order against further consideration of **HB 191** under Rule 8, Section 1(a)(1), of the House Rules on the grounds that the caption is overly broad and fails to give reasonable notice of the subject of the bill.

The caption of the bill reads "relating to the disposal of pesticides." The bill adds a new section to the Agriculture Code that is entitled "DISPOSAL OF PESTICIDE" and authorizes the Department of Agriculture to organize pesticide waste and pesticide container collection activities statewide. The bill also creates a funding mechanism specifically for those activities.

In the opinion of the Chair, the caption gives reasonable notice of the subject of the bill.

Accordingly, the point of order is respectfully overruled.

(2) the child is not subject to the jurisdiction of a juvenile court because the child is not alleged to have engaged in conduct that violates a penal law of the grade of felony of the second degree or higher as a result of acts committed before becoming 12 years of age [there is probable cause to believe the child engaged in delinquent conduct or conduct indicating a need for supervision;

[(3) the child's case does not require referral to the prosecuting attorney under Subsection (d) or (f);

[(4) the child is eligible for deferred prosecution under Section 53.03]; and

(3) [(5)] the child and the child's family are not currently receiving services under Section 53.011 and would benefit from receiving the services.

SECTION _____. Section 53.011(b), Family Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) On receipt of a referral under Section 53.01(b-1) or 54.015(f), a community resource coordination group, a local-level interagency staffing group, or another community juvenile services provider shall evaluate the child's case and make recommendations to the juvenile probation department for appropriate services for the child and the child's family.

Sec. 16.023. STRATEGIC MAPPING ACCOUNT. (a) The strategic mapping account is an account in the general revenue fund. The account consists of:

(1) money directly appropriated to the board;

(2) money transferred by the board from other funds available to the board;

(3) money from gifts or grants from the United States government, state, regional, or local governments, educational institutions, private sources, or other sources;

(4) proceeds from the sale of maps, data, publications, and other items; and

(5) interest earned on the investment of money in the account and depository interest allocable to the account.

(b) The account may be appropriated only to the board to:

(1) develop, administer, and implement the strategic mapping program;

(2) provide grants to political subdivisions for projects related to the development, use, and dissemination of digital, geospatial information; and

(3) administer, implement, and operate other programs of the Texas Natural Resources Information System, including:

(A) the operation of a Texas-Mexico border region information center for the purpose of implementing Section 16.021(e)(5);

(B) the acquisition, storage, and distribution of historical maps, photographs, and paper map products;

(C) the maintenance and enhancement of information technology; and

(D) the production, storage, and distribution of other digital base maps, as determined by the executive administrator.

(c) The board may invest, reinvest, and direct the investment of any available money in the fund as provided by law for the investment of money under Section 404.024, Government Code.

(b) The strategic mapping account is re-created by this Act as an account in the general revenue fund, and all revenue dedicated for deposit to the credit of the strategic mapping account is rededicated by this Act for that purpose. Section 2 of this Act does not apply to the account as re-created by this Act or a dedication of revenue to the account as rededicated by this Act.

(b) The board of trustees shall consider the proof, evidence, and information provided under Subsection (a), and any additional information required by the rules adopted in accordance with Section 615.002, to determine whether the individual's death satisfies the eligibility requirements established under Section 615.021(a)(1) and justifies the payment of assistance to the individual's eligible survivors under this chapter.

(c) If the individual's employing entity fails to comply with Subsection (a), the attorney general may use any means authorized by law, including filing suit for a writ of mandamus against the employer, to compel the employer's compliance with this section.

SECTION _____. Section 615.041, Government Code, as amended by this Act, applies to the payment of assistance in connection with a death that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. The payment of assistance in connection

with a death that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
