BACKGROUND

:

The Licensed Professional Counselor Act regulates individuals who offer to render counseling services that apply mental health, psychotherapeutic, and human development principles to individuals, couples, families, groups, organizations, corporations and other institutions. The act exempts from licensing certain individuals, including publicly employed counselors, professionals licensed under other health care acts, lawyers, and Christian

Scientist practitioners.

DIGEST: HB 1061 would exempt from licensing under the Licensed Professional

Counselor Act individuals certified by the Commission on Rehabilitation Counselor Certification or the Commission on Certification of Work Adjustment and Vocational Evaluation Specialists as long as they perform

counseling consistent with the law of the state, their training, and

professional code of ethics and do not use the title or hold themselves out to

be licensed counselors.
