	 delete language to reflect changes in election laws at the federal level; amend voting requirements to delete references to paupers, change reference to idiots and lunatics to persons determined mentally incompetent, and replace the voting age of 21 with 18; and
	• delete obsolete and unconstitutional language relating to qualified electors, poll taxes, property ownership requirements and provisions relating to a nonexistent state property tax.
	The joint resolution also would also repeal three provisions relating to an appropriation to John Tarleton Agricultural College, funding for the superconducting super collider project, and abolition of the office of county surveyor in Jackson County, and renumber several duplicated provisions.
	The proposed amendment would be presented to voters at an election on November 4, 1997. The ballot proposal would read: "The constitutional amendment eliminating duplicate numbering in and certain obsolete provisions of the Texas Constitution."

SUPPORTERSHJR 104 would make several technical changes to the Texas Constitution by
deleting obsolete and unconstitutional provisions to reflect changes in
federal law, deleting moot provisions no longer needed, and renumbering
provisions with duplicate numbering. It would make no substantive change
but would just update and clean up the state's fundamental law.
