BACKGROUND:	In the wake of federal and state welfare-reform legislation, efforts have been made to identify churches and other faith-based organizations that help welfare recipients make the transition from public assistance to self- sufficiency. Currently, no specialized employees within the Texas Department of Human Services (DHS) provide outreach services in relation to faith-based organizations.		
DIGEST:	HB 2017 would amend the Human Resources Code by requiring the commissioner of human services to designate one employee from each DHS administrative region to serve as a liaison to faith-based organizations with the potential ability to provide community services for the needy. The commissioner would have to ensure that the primary function of each designated liaison was to:		
	• communicate with the faith-based organizations regarding the need for private community services to benefit persons in need of assistance who otherwise would require financial or other assistance under programs administered by DHS;		
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• promote the involvement of faith-based organizations in meeting the community's needs for assistance; and

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• coordinate the department's efforts with those of other state agencies to promote the involvement of faith-based organizations in providing community services.

HB 2017 would take immediate effect if finally approved by a two-thirds record vote of the membership in each house.
