BACKGROUND: The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) produces several types of

publications on topics such as child support and victims of crime.

DIGEST: HB 1560, as amended, would require the OAG to use gender-neutral

terminology in any publication it distributes to the public, including

publications about child-support enforcement.

The bill would take effect January 1, 2002.

NOTES: HB 1560 as filed would have provided for immediate effect if the bill

received the necessary two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. The committee changed the proposed effective date to January 1, 2002, to allow the OAG to exhaust its current supply of publications before

producing new publications with gender-neutral terminology.
