- BACKGROUND:** Under Government Code, sec. 824.601, a retiree may not receive service or disability retirement benefit payments from the Teacher Retirement System (TRS) while working for a Texas public school. Sec. 824.602 lists certain exceptions, including substitute teachers, half-time teachers, and full-time teachers if the retiree is eligible to receive a standard service retirement annuity, teaches in a shortage area as defined by the education commissioner, and has been separated from employment in any public school for at least 12 months.
- DIGEST:** CSHB 3147 would prohibit TRS from withholding monthly retirement benefit payments from a retiree who was employed as a principal, including an assistant principal, on a part-time or full-time basis, if the retiree was eligible for a standard service retirement annuity, was certified to serve as a principal, and had been separated from employment in any public school for at least 12 months.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2001. It would apply beginning with the 2001-02 school year.
