BACKGROUND: The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) offers

certain innovative programs as alternatives to the traditional regulatory

structure, such as regulatory flexibility, supplemental environmental projects,

environmental audits, and flexible permits.

DIGEST: SB 356 would require TNRCC to work with the Legislative Budget Board

(LBB) to develop performance measures to assess environmental quality improvements achieved by innovative regulatory programs implemented by

TNRCC.

The bill would take effect on September 1, 2001.

SUPPORTERS

SAY:

Performance measures are needed to assess TNRCC's innovative regulatory

programs. These programs were designed to provide alternatives to

traditional regulation. However, accurate performance measures would help

to demonstrate their value and effectiveness.

The Sunset Advisory Commission review of the TNRCC found that

participation in the innovative regulatory programs was not performancebased and lacked sufficient accountability. Development of performance measures for the programs would help to implement the Sunset recommendations and bring accountability to the agency's programs.

OPPONENTS SAY:
