BACKGROUND: Government Code, sec. 2251.026 makes state agencies liable for interest

that accrues on overdue payments for goods and services. The interest must be paid at the same time that the principal is paid. Sec. 2251.026(j) prohibits interest from accruing and being paid by institutions of public

higher education if the interest totals \$5 or less.

DIGEST: HB 3601 would prohibit interest from accruing and being paid on overdue

payments for goods and services bought by a state agency if the interest

totaled \$5 or less.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2015, and would apply only to the

accrual of interest on or after that date.
