Education Code, sec. 30A.002(b) states that students are eligible to enroll full time in courses provided through the virtual school network only if the student was enrolled in a Texas public school in the preceding school year or has been placed in substitute care, regardless of whether the student was enrolled in a Texas public school in the preceding school year. DIGEST: SB 587 would make eligible to enroll full-time in courses provided through the Texas Virtual School Network a student who had been enrolled in a publicly funded school outside of Texas in the preceding year and was the dependent of a U.S. military member deployed or transferred to Texas. This bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2017, and would apply beginning with the 2017-18 school year. NOTES: According to the Legislative Budget Board's fiscal note, SB 587 would cost the Foundation School Program an additional \$665,463 for fiscal 2018-19. The House approved SB 587, considered in lieu of a companion bill, HB 539 by VanDeaver, on May 12.
