CSHB 1053 would authorize the district to donate, exchange, convey, sell, or lease land, improvements, easements, or any other interests in real property to an electric utility or a telecommunications utility to promote a public purpose related to the development of the district. The district would be required to determine the terms and conditions of the transaction so as to achieve the public purpose and to be consistent with the requirements of the Public Utility Regulatory Act. The bill would authorize the district to donate, exchange, convey, sell, or lease such land for less than its fair market value and without complying with the notice and bidding requirements for navigation districts in the Water Code.

CSHB 1053 would authorize the district to abandon narrow strips of real property resulting from boundary or surveying conflicts or similar causes, or from insubstantial encroachments by abutting real property owners, or real property that has been subject to encroachments by abutting property owners for more than 25 years. The district would be authorized to abandon, release, exchange, or transfer such property to these abutting owners on terms and conditions considered appropriate or advantageous to the district. The district could convey the real property for less than its fair market value and without complying with notice and bidding requirements.

The bill would authorize the district to grant easements over, on, or under its real property on terms and conditions the district's board of navigators and canal commissioners determine to be advantageous to the district. In addition, the bill would exempt the district from the notice, bidding, and other requirements of Local Government Code ch. 272 governing the sale or lease of property by municipalities, counties, and other local governments.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2019.
