DIGEST: HB 1262 would require the Department of Motor Vehicles to develop a

system of registration to allow the owner of a trailer, semitrailer or pole trailer with a gross weight of 7,500 pounds or less to register the vehicle for up to five years. A trailer owner could select the number of years for registration and would pay the cumulative fees for the entire registration

period at the time of registration.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds

record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take

effect September 1, 2019.
