BACKGROUND: Local Government Code sec. 352.019(e) allows a county commissioners

court to authorize a county fire marshal to provide training programs to

firefighting and fire prevention units in the county.

Government Code sec. 421.095 defines first responder to mean a public safety employee or volunteer whose duties include responding rapidly to

an emergency.

Some have suggested that there is a need for common training in

firefighting skills for first responders.

DIGEST: HB 3753 would allow a county commissioners court to authorize a county

marshal to provide firefighting and fire prevention training to first

responders in the county, rather than only firefighters and fire prevention

units.

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The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2019.
