BACKGROUND:	Human Resources Code sec. 261.101 governs the duties and powers of the Office of the Independent Ombudsman of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department.
	It has been suggested that the ombudsman should be able to oversee any facility where a juvenile might be placed.
DIGEST:	SB 1702 would establish that the powers of the Office of the Independent Ombudsman of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) included:
	 the inspection of facilities owned by TJJD, post-adjudication secure correctional facilities, non-secure correctional facilities, and any other residential facilities in which children adjudicated as having engaged in conduct indicating a need for supervision or delinquent conduct were placed by court order; and the investigation of complaints alleging violations of the rights of the children in these facilities.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2019.
