responsibility verification program under the Texas Motor Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act to verify financial responsibility for the purpose of court proceedings.

The costs associated with accessing the program would be paid out of the county treasury by order of the commissioners court or the municipal treasury by order of the city's governing body, as applicable.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2021.
