BACKGROUND: Government Code sec. 2054.512 requires the state cybersecurity

coordinator to lead a council of public and private sector leaders and cybersecurity practitioners to collaborate and provide recommendations on cybersecurity matters. The council includes one employee of the Office of the Governor, one senator, one House member, and additional members

appointed by the coordinator.

Some have called for the council's membership to be expanded to include an official from the elections division of the Office of the Secretary of State due to recent reported threats to the cyber infrastructure of the state's

voting systems.

DIGEST: HB 2065 would expand the membership of the cybersecurity council to

include an employee from the Elections Division of the Office of the

Secretary of State.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2021.
