DIGEST: SB 338 would allow a school district, after reviewing the uniform general conditions adopted by the Texas Facilities Commission for building construction contracts, to adopt uniform general conditions to be incorporated in all district building construction contracts.

The bill would add two members to the committee appointed by the Texas Facilities Commission to perform regular reviews of the uniform general conditions of state building construction contracts. The commission would have to appoint one individual representing the Texas Association of School Boards and one individual representing the Texas Association of School Administrators. The two additional members would have to be appointed by December 1, 2021.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2021.
