Adding a ballot option to affirmatively abstain from voting in a race

BACKGROUND: Some have suggested that an option for a voter to affirmatively abstain

from casting a vote in certain races could prevent bad actors from taking

advantage of contests left blank on mail-in ballots.

DIGEST: CSHB 153 establishes that voters would be given the opportunity to select

"I choose not to vote in this race" instead of voting for the candidates appearing on the ballot or the list of write-in candidates for each race. A vote with this selection would not count for the purpose of determining

which candidate received a majority of votes.

The secretary of state would be required to prescribe the form and manner of placing the option "I choose not to vote in this race" on the ballot. The bill also would make conforming changes to include this option among other ballot requirements.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023.
