BACKGROUND: Some have suggested that providing patients with access to a directory of

facility-based network providers available to a patient in that facility could

help to reduce surprise billings for patients.

DIGEST: HB 1902 would require health plan issuers to expand facility directories to

include network providers delivering services in facilities covered under the health plan. The current requirement for health plan issuers to provide plan enrollees with a directory of network physicians delivering care in a covered facility would be expanded to include all network providers

delivering care in the facility. Insurers would be required to add additional

directory headings for certain providers identified in the bill.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023 and would require health benefit plan issuers to update the issuer's website and physician and

provider directories to comply with the bill's requirements no later than January 1, 2024.
