- a minimum of \$20 for the first day or first fraction of a day;
- a minimum of \$58 for each subsequent day or fraction of a day.

The bill would amend Government Code sec. 61.0015 to require the state to reimburse counties \$52 a day for the reimbursement paid to a juror.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023.

NOTES: According to the Legislative Budget Board, the bill would have an estimated impact of \$0 to general revenue related funds through fiscal 2024-25. The board also estimated that the bill would increase expenditures from the Jury Service Fund for reimbursement payment to counties.
