BACKGROUND: Concerns have been raised that current inspection requirements relating to

emissions and exhaust systems are unnecessary for fully electric vehicles.

DIGEST: HB 3014 would exempt a motor vehicle that used electricity as its only

source of motor power and that was not equipped with an internal

combustion engine from certain vehicle inspection requirements relating

to emissions and exhaust systems.

As soon as practicable after the effective date, the public safety director of

the Department of Public Safety would be required to adopt or amend

department rules necessary to implement the bill.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023 and would apply only to an

offense committed on or after that date.
