BACKGROUND: Concerns have been raised that children removed from their homes

sometimes use trash bags to transport their belongings, which could add to

the stress of removal.

DIGEST: HB 3765 would require the Department of Family and Protective Services

(DFPS) to establish and maintain a decentralized supply of luggage to be

used to transport a foster child's personal belongings and develop procedures for the storage and distribution of luggage to ensure the maximum number of children could use the luggage. DFPS would be required to provide luggage to a child being removed from their home or changing placement. DFPS could solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations of any kind and from any source for the bill's purposes.

DFPS would be required to maintain a record of each time a trash bag was used to move a foster child's personal belongings, including the reason DFPS did not provide appropriate luggage. DFPS would be required to submit an annual report to the Legislature summarizing the number of times a trash bag was used to transport a foster child's belongings, the reasons why DFPS did not provide appropriate luggage, and DFPS' supply inventory and inventory management practices.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023.

According to the Legislative Budget Board, HB 3765 would have a negative impact of \$766,977 on general revenue related funds for fiscal 2024-25.
