BACKGROUND: Transportation Code sec. 201.1056(a) authorizes the Department of

Transportation (TxDOT) to enter into an agreement with the U.S.

Department of Defense or another federal entity to allow the department to assist with providing road maintenance, improvement, relocation, or

extension services, for military installations.

Concerns have been raised that TxDOT is unable to provide certain kinds

of assistance to federal military installations due to current statutory

limitations.

DIGEST: HB 4140 would expand the services TxDOT could assist in providing to

military installations in an agreement under Transportation Code sec.

201.1056(a) to include any department services.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take
