BACKGROUND: Some have suggested that educators need support to build their skills in

virtual teaching and a way to display their qualification for student

success in that field.

DIGEST: HB 4358 would require the State Board for Educator Certification to

provide continuing education opportunities for and issue micro-credentials

to educators in digital teaching.

Boards of trustees would be required to engage relevant stakeholders in

proposing rules to implement these changes.

The bill would apply beginning with the 2023-24 school year.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds

record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2023.

NOTES:

According to the Legislative Budget Board, HB 4358 would have a negative impact of about \$999,344 on general revenue related funds during fiscal 2024-25.
