BACKGROUND: Some have suggested that extending the exception for school districts to

offer a bilingual education program would give teachers more time to earn

the necessary certifications for bilingual instruction.

DIGEST: SB 2518 would extend the period of validity of a granted exception to the

requirement that a district use a bilingual education program from one to three years. An application for an exception for a second or succeeding period could be for the same teacher or a different teacher as in the

preceding period.

The bill would apply beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.

This bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take

effect September 1, 2023.
