BACKGROUND: Some have suggested that allowing military members who have

experience as instructors at the Community College of the Air Force to obtain a temporary teaching certificate to teach in K-12 classrooms could

help address the teacher shortage.

DIGEST: SB 544 would require the State Board for Educator Certification to

propose rules providing for a person who had at least two semesters' experience as a full-time instructor for the Community College of the Air

Force to:

• be issued a temporary teaching certificate on the person's enrollment in an educator preparation program; and

• receive credit for the person's education, training, and clinical or professional experience as an instructor toward the requirements

for completion of an educator preparation program.

A temporary teaching certificate issued under the bill would be valid for one year from the date of issuance.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023.
