BACKGROUND: Some have suggested that revising the funding model for The University

of Texas at Tyler College of Pharmacy would allow the college to

continue to meet critical health care needs in east Texas and help ensure

equitable funding between pharmacy schools in the state.

DIGEST: SB 695 would repeal provisions prohibiting The University of Texas at

Tyler College of Pharmacy from receiving funding under the General Academic Institution Instruction and Operations and the Infrastructure

Support formulas administered by the Texas Higher Education

Coordinating Board.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take

effect September 1, 2023.

NOTES: According to the Legislative Budget Board, SB 695 would have a

negative impact of \$3,259,062 on general revenue funds through the

biennium ending August 31, 2025.
