# **DIGEST**

Currently, voting-by-mail applications are not signed by more than one party unless the voter is disabled and has a witness. This bill requires a witness to the signatures by someone other than the voter.

# **PURPOSE**

As proposed, S.B. 1089 requires a statement verifying the applicant's identity signed by the applicant's spouse or by another appropriate person on an application for an early voting mail ballot.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

## **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 84.002(a), Election Code, to require an early voting ballot application to include a statement verifying the applicant's identity signed by the applicant's spouse or by another appropriate person, among other information, for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail. Makes conforming changes.

SECTION 2. Effective date: September 1, 1997.

SECTION 3. Emergency clause.
