### **DIGEST AND PURPOSE**

Currently, the district attorney of Wharton County has jurisdiction for all criminal cases, including juvenile cases. H.B. 1677 transfers juvenile jurisdiction from the district attorney to the county attorney.

### **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

### **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 43.1775(c), Government Code, to authorize the district attorney, at the request of the county attorney, to assist the county attorney in the prosecution of juvenile cases under Title 3 (Juvenile Justice Code), Family Code.

SECTION 2. Amends Section 45.341, Government Code, by adding Subsections (d) and (e), as follows:

(d) Provides that the county attorney represents the state in proceedings under Title 3, Family Code.

(e) Provides that the county attorney represents the Wharton County Drainage District.

SECTION 3. Makes application of this Act prospective.

SECTION 4. Effective date: September 1, 2003.
